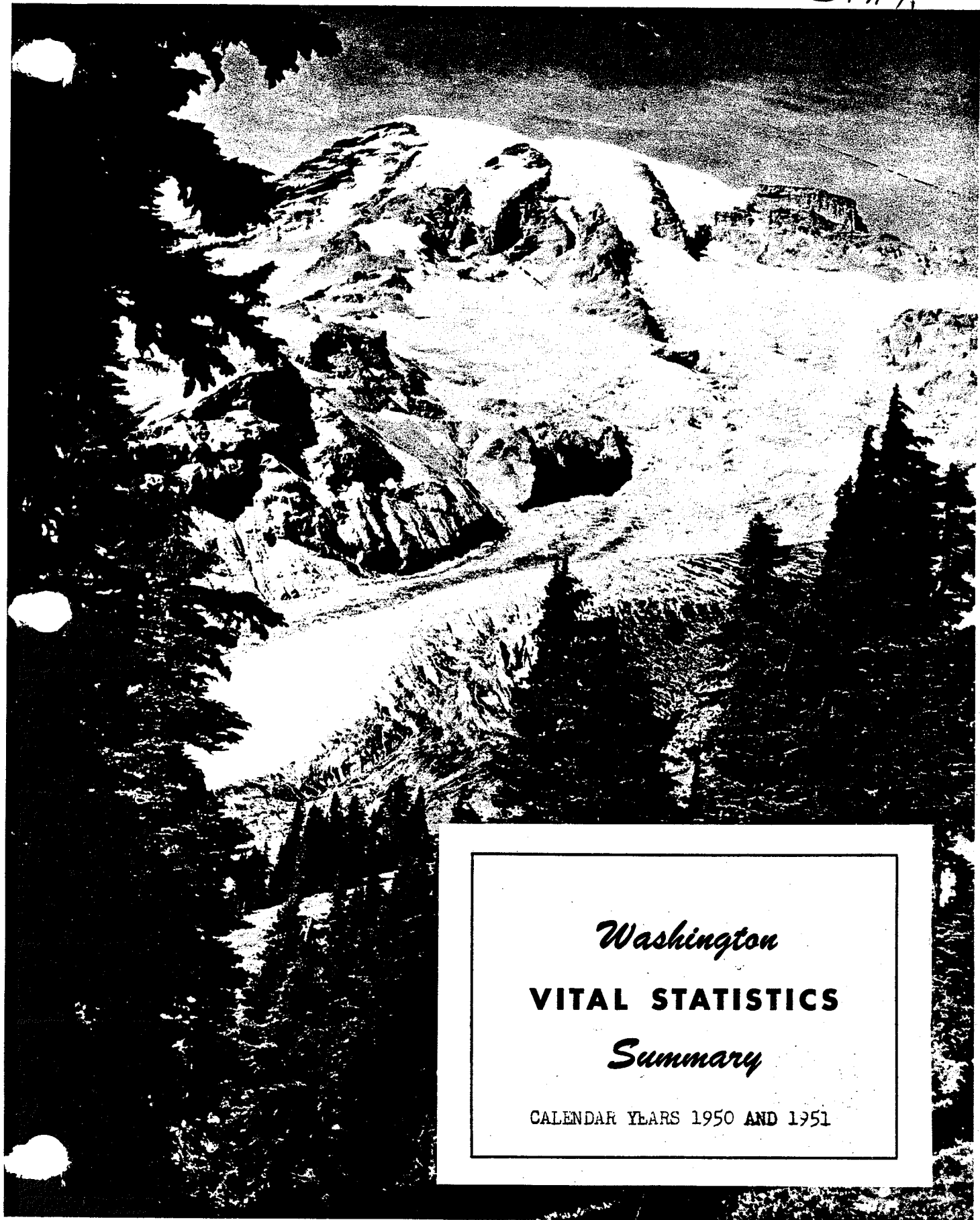

INTRODUCTION

Data on livebirths, deaths and fetal deaths (stillbirths) are presented in this report for the calendar years 1950 and 1951. In addition, 1950 Federal Census, and 1951 estimated population figures are included. Data are reported for the state as a whole, each county, and each city of 10,000 or more population.

Certain additional data, including data for cities of 2,500 to 10,000 population are available in unpublished form in the files of the Public Health Statistics Section.

Vital statistics data included in this report are identified either as residence or occurrence data. Residence data refer to vital events involving residents of the area regardless of where the vital events actually occurred. Occurrence data refer to vital events actually occurring in the area regardless of the place of residence of the persons involved. In general data on a residence basis are the most useful.

Data for 1950 and 1951 on non-residence vital events are as follows:

It can be observed that in both 1950 and 1951 vital events occurring in this state to out of state residents were higher than vital events occurring among Washington residents outside of the state. This fact undoubtedly is due in large part to a higher utilization of Washington hospital facilities by non-residents than the utilization of out of state hospital facilities by residents of Washington.



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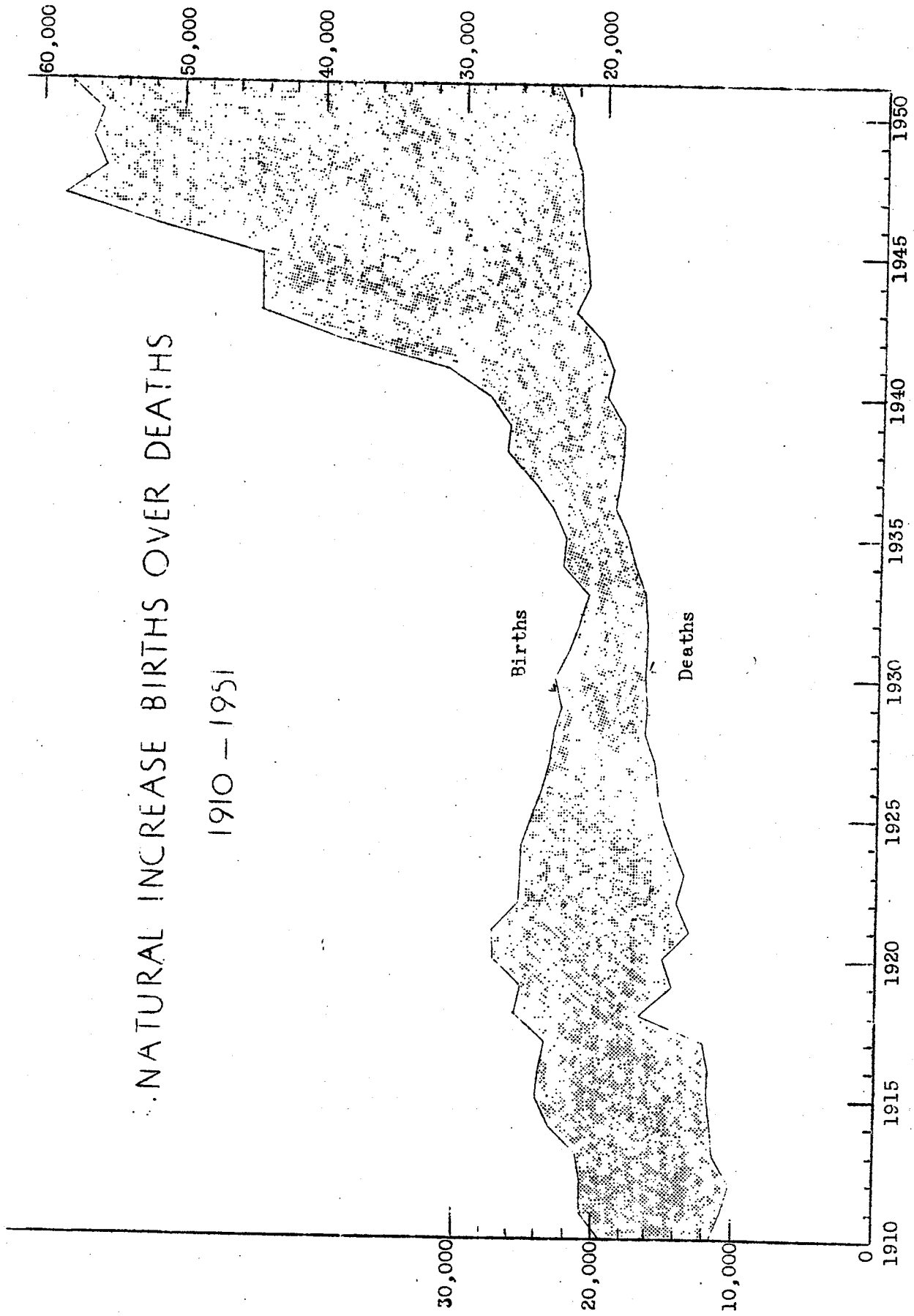

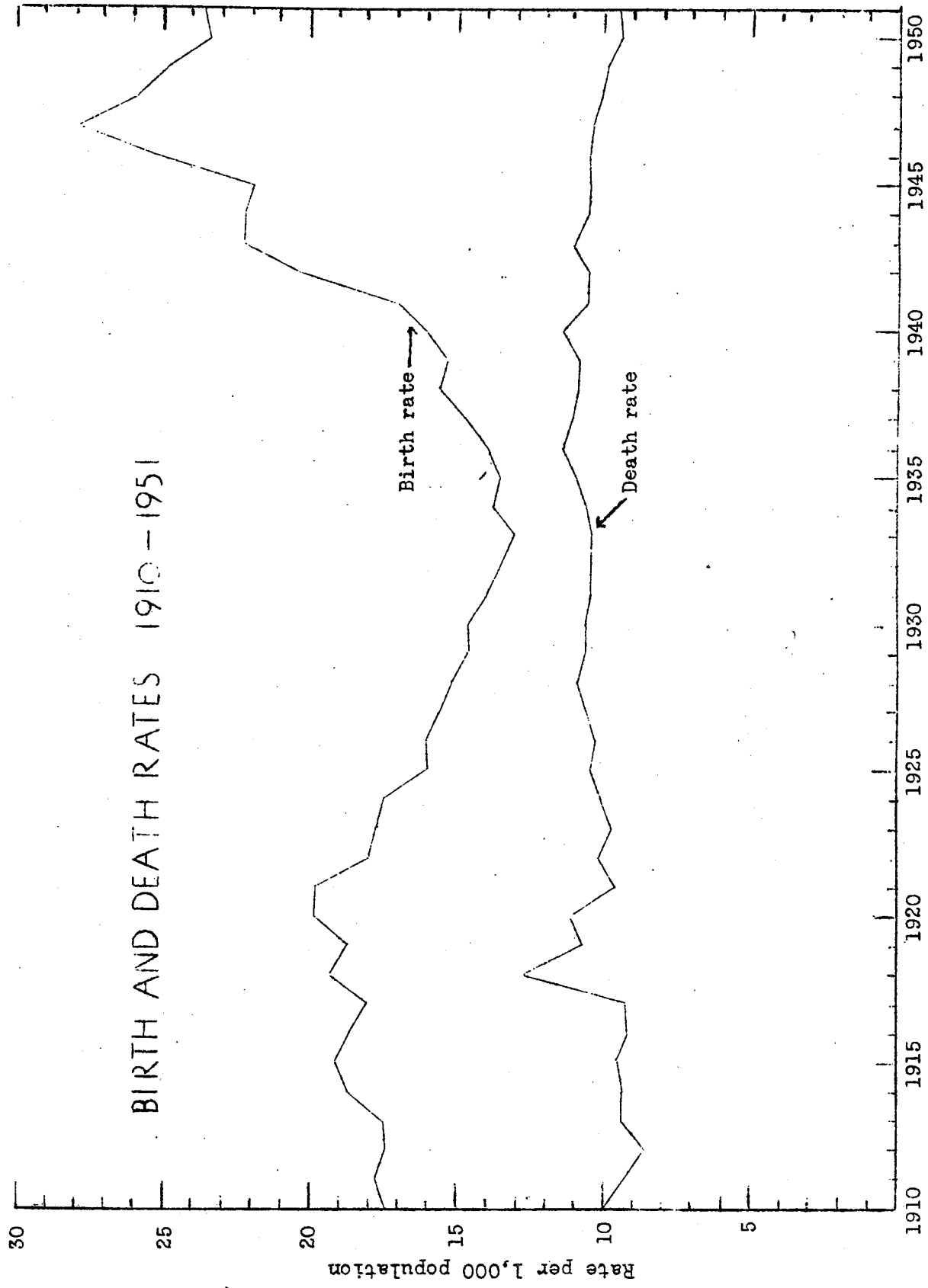

INFANT AND FETAL DEATH RATES, 1910-1951

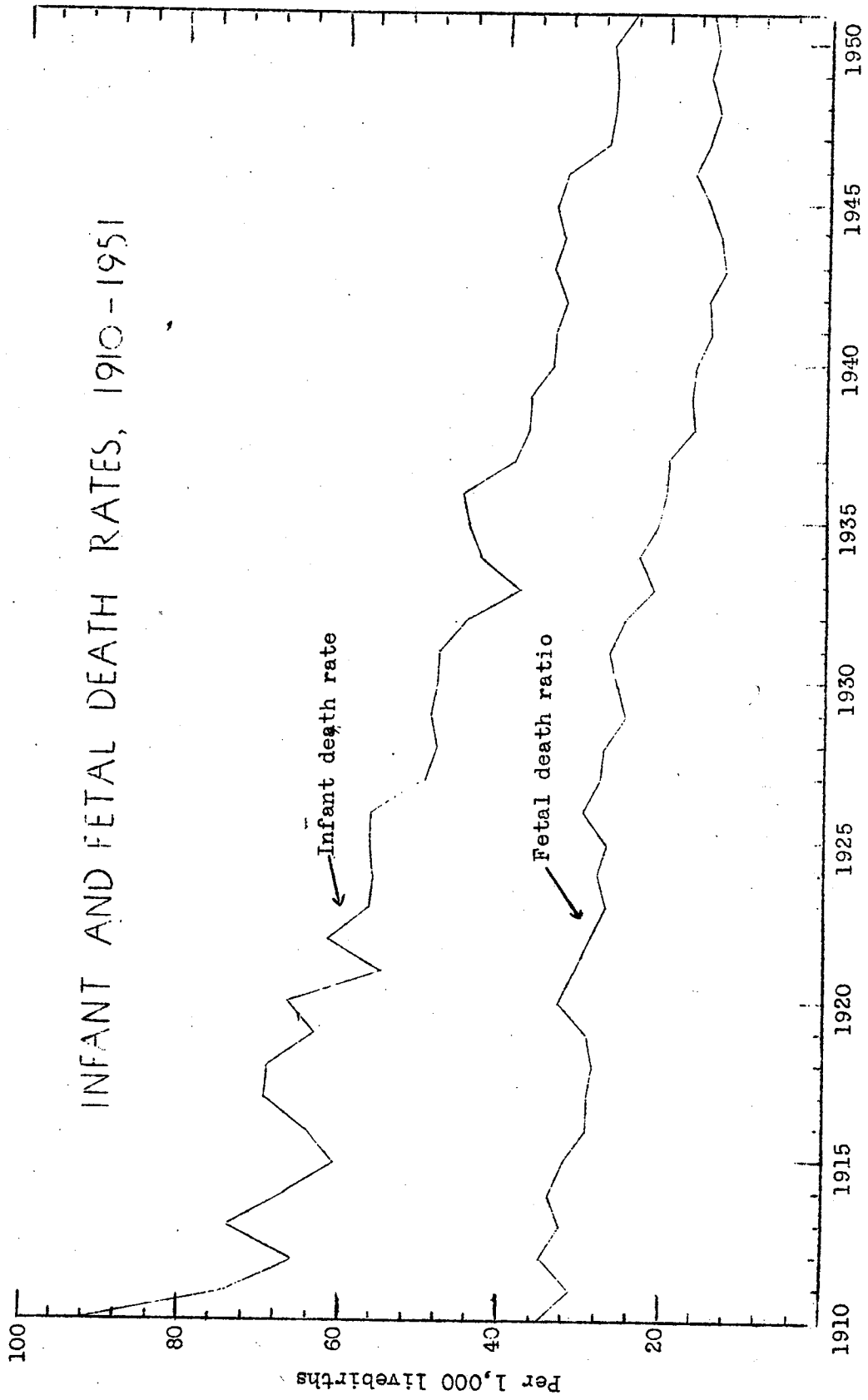

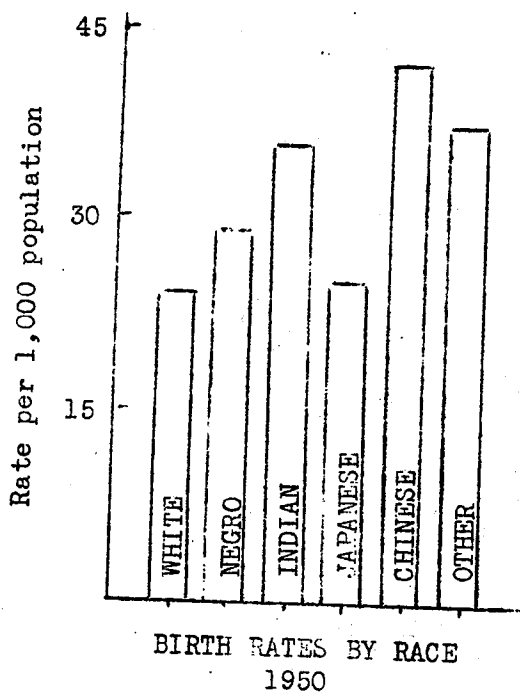

NATALITY

Livebirths

There were 55,755 births to residents of Washington in 1950, a rate of 23.4 births per 1,000 population. In 1951 there were 57,994 births with a rate of 23.7. Although these rates are lower than the years 1946-1949 the number of births in 1951 was higher than that of any previous year except 1947, when 58,230 resident births were recorded. Table 1 gives births from 1910 through 1951, with rates per 1,000 population. The graph, page 3, shows birth rates from 1910-1951. It can be observed that in general the trend has been upward. However, during most of the 1920's and early 30's a decided downward trend prevailed which culminated in the abnormally low rate of 13 births per 1,000 population in 1933.

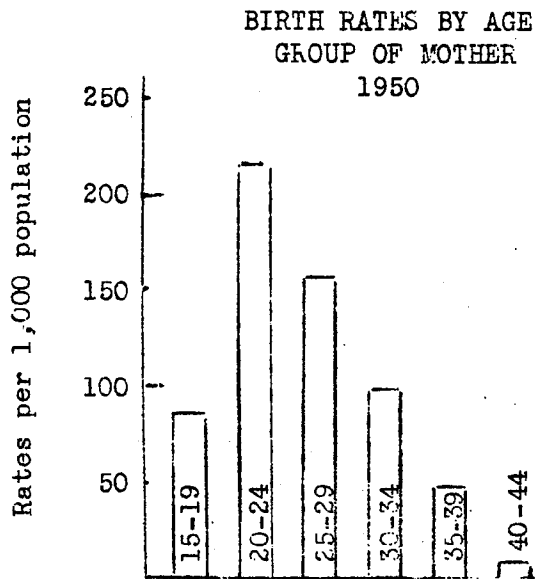
Grant county showed the highest number of births per 1,000 population in both the years 1950 and 1951, the rates being 31.8 and 32.1. Wahkiakum and Island counties with 19.6 births per 1,000 population showed the lowest birth rates in 1950, while Skamania county was lowest in 1951 with a rate of 14.5.



Of the 1950 births, 51.3% were males, 48.7% females. Births in 1951 were divided 51.1% males and 48.9% females.

Although 96.4% of the births in 1950 and 96.5% in 1951 were classified as white, the birth rates for non-white races were considerably higher than the white birth rate, with the exception of the Japanese, as the accompanying graph will show.

Of the births to Washington residents in 1950, 98.9% occurred in hospitals, maternity homes, or other institutions, while 0.9% occurred in the home. In 1951 99.1% of the births took place in an institution with 0.6% occurring at home. Table 11 gives a breakdown of births by county and major city of residence and place of birth.



The highest birth rate, per 1,000 females in each age group, occurred in the 20-24 age group, the second highest between the 25-29 age group. The comparable position of each age group can be seen in the accompanying graph which is based on 1950 births and 1950 United States Census population by sex and age groups.

Illegitimate births were 19.9 per 1,000 livebirths in 1950, 18.3 per 1,000 population in 1951. Table 13 gives illegitimate births by county and major city of occurrence and of residence of mother.

Tables 6 through 16 give data on livebirths.

Fetal Deaths (stillbirths)

For each 1,000 livebirths to residents in 1950 there were an additional 14.3 fetal deaths. This ratio in 1951 was 14.7 per 1,000 livebirths. Table 1 and the graph, page 4, show the decline in fetal deaths (formerly designated stillbirths) since 1910.

Among the causes for fetal deaths, placental and cord conditions accounted for 42.2% of the total deaths in 1950 and 43.7% in 1951. Table 19 gives selected causes of fetal deaths with the number of deaths from each cause in 1950 and 1951. Table 17 shows fetal deaths by counties and major cities of residence and occurrence with the ratio each has to livebirths by residence and occurrence.

MORTALITY

General

In 1950 there were 22,450 deaths of residents of Washington, a rate of 9.4 deaths per 1,000 population. In 1951 resident deaths were 23,300 with a rate of 9.5. (see Table 1, and the graph, page 3, for a comparison with the years 1910-1949). In both years Grays Harbor county had the highest death rate with 12.5 deaths per 1,000 population in 1950 and 12.7 in 1951. Benton county had the lowest rate with 4.6 deaths per 1,000 population in 1950 and 5.3 in 1951.

Of the deaths in 1950, 159 males died for every 100 females; in 1951, 153 males for every 100 females. The death rate for males in 1950 was 11.3 deaths for every 1,000 males in the population. The death rate for females in 1950 was 7.5 based on female population. In 1910 the death rate for males was 10.9, for females 9.0. The age group 5-14 years had the lowest death rate 0.7, less than 1 death for each 1,000 individuals in that age category in 1950. Following in next higher order were the 15-24 age group with a rate of 1.1, the 25-34 group with 1.6, and the 35-44 group with 3.2. The first five years of life had a death rate of 6.8, the 45-54 group, 7.5. From the 55-64 group upward the age specific death rates were higher than the crude death rate for all age groups. The graph on page 47 gives male and female death rates in each age group. Male death rates exceed female in all age groups.

Indians with 15.6 deaths per 1,000 of the Indian population, had the highest death rate of any race in 1950. Chinese were next highest with a rate of 10.3, followed by: white, 9.4; Japanese, 8.6; and all others 7.6. Table 24 gives deaths by race for all the counties and major cities.

Of the deaths occurring in the state, (22,581 in 1950 and 23,399 in 1951) the following percentages occurred in:

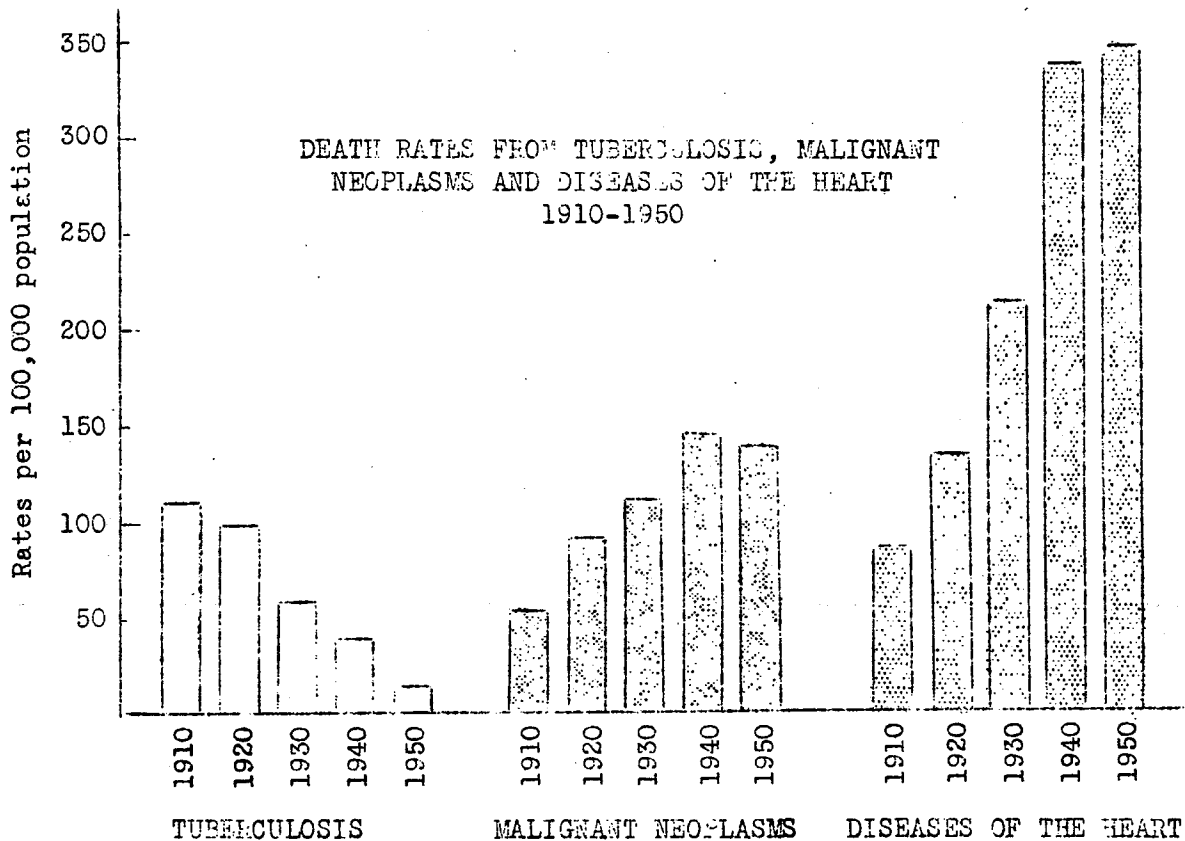

Selected Causes

Table 20 gives selected causes of death for all ages, arranged according to the cause of death code as determined by the International Statistical Classification of Causes of Death.

The category "Diseases of the heart" had the greatest number of deaths in both 1950 and 1951, with rates of 345.0 and 354.7 deaths per 100,000 population. Next highest category was "Malignant neoplasms" with rates for the two years of 138.4 and 137.7. Malignant neoplasms was also the second leading cause of death in each age category from the 5-14 group through the 55-64 group. Tuberculosis which was the leading cause of death in Washington in 1910 was in tenth place in 1951. The category "All accidents", including Motor vehicle accidents, was fourth leading cause of death. It was the leading cause in all age groups from the 1-4 through the 25-34. The graph on page 74 shows accidental death rates by age groups. The rise in the higher age groups was due primarily to falls.

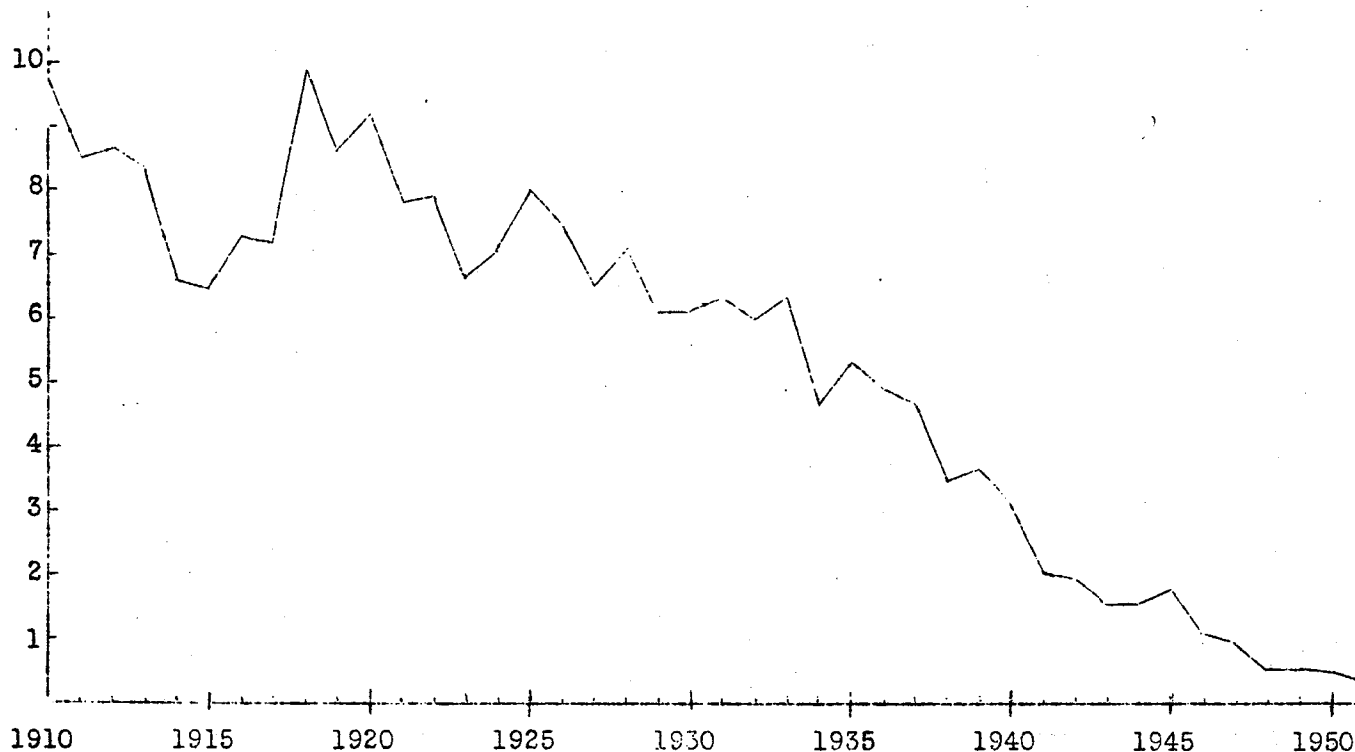
The Death Summary Table, page 48, lists the ten leading causes by rank; Tables 28 through 32 the same causes with deaths allocated to place of residence. In addition, Table 21 lists the leading causes of deaths in each age group with the percent each comprises of the total deaths in that age group. The graph below gives comparisons of the changes in rate from tuberculosis, malignant neoplasms, and diseases of the heart, at ten year intervals. By comparing each set of bars with the corresponding year for another cause the relative standing of each as a cause of death in any of the years can be seen.



In Table 35-A and B the deaths from all infective and parasitic diseases except tuberculosis are given by county and city of residence. Syphilis and its sequelae accounts for the greatest number of deaths. Acute poliomyelitis is the next highest category.

Maternal

There were 28 maternal deaths in 1950, 8 fewer deaths than in 1949. In 1951 there were 23 maternal deaths, a further drop of 5. The graph on this page illustrates the steady decline in maternal mortality since 1910. Maternal death rates, as based on the number of livebirths in each age category of mother, were highest in the older age groups. In both 1950 and 1951, 8 deaths occurred in mothers 35 or over, this was 29% of the maternal deaths in 1950 and 35% in 1951. This represents a rate of 1.5 maternal deaths per 1,000 livebirths in this age category for each year, whereas the maternal death rate for all ages based on 1,000 livebirths was 0.5 in 1950 and 0.4 in 1951. Further data on maternal mortality is given in Table 36.

Infant

Infant deaths totaled 1,526 in 1950, a rate of 27.4 deaths for each 1,000 livebirths. In 1951 there were 1,412 infant deaths with a rate of 24.3 per 1,000 livebirths. The 1951 rate is the lowest yet recorded in the state of Washington. Like maternal mortality, infant mortality has experienced a steady decline since 1910, as can be seen from the graph, page 4.

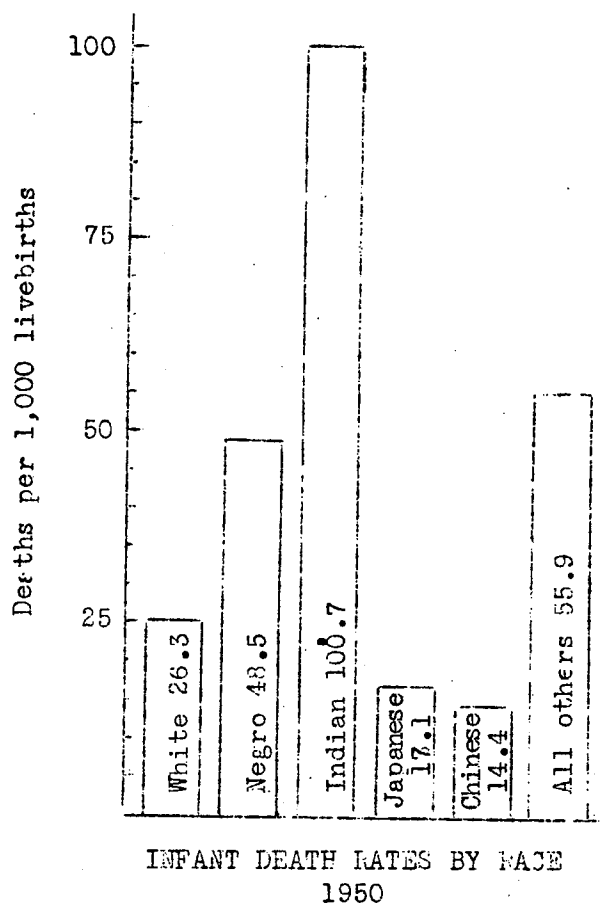


Table 37 gives infant mortality by county and major city of occurrence of death, and also by county and major city of residence of decedent, with rates per 1,000 livebirths occurring in the same area for the occurrence deaths, and rates per 1,000 livebirths allocated to residence in the area for residence deaths.

Indians had the highest death rate for infants, a rate of 100.7 in 1950 and 117.4 in 1951. The graph at the left shows infant death rates by race for 1950. Table 38 gives infant deaths by race and county and major city of residence.

For every 100 female infants who died in 1950, 140.7 male infants died. This ratio for 1951 was 100 females to 134.6 males. This represents an infant death rate of 31.2 for males in 1950, 27.3 for males in 1951. The female rate each year was 23.4 and 21.2 respectively.

The greatest number of infant deaths occurred under the International List category 760-776, "Certain diseases of early infancy", with 61.7% of the 1950 deaths in this classification, and 63.1% in 1951. Of the causes in this group, immaturity in conjunction with some other condition, and immaturity unqualified accounted for the greatest number of deaths, 43.6% in 1950 and 42.4% in 1951. Congenital malformations accounted for 14.3% of the infant deaths in 1950, and 14.0% in 1951. Other leading causes were

influenza and pneumonia, not including pneumonia of newborn which is included in the 760-776 category above, with percentages of 7.0 in 1950 and 6.1 in 1951; and accidents, 5.5% in 1950 and 5.7% in 1951.

Table 39-A and B gives a detailed breakdown of causes by sex and age of infant. Table 40 lists leading causes for the counties and major cities. Neonatal deaths, those under 1 month of age, accounted for 73.8% of the infant deaths in 1950. The percentage in 1951 was 76.1. Neonatal deaths by counties and major cities of residence are given in Table 41.

AGE SPECIFIC DEATH RATES BY SEX, 1950

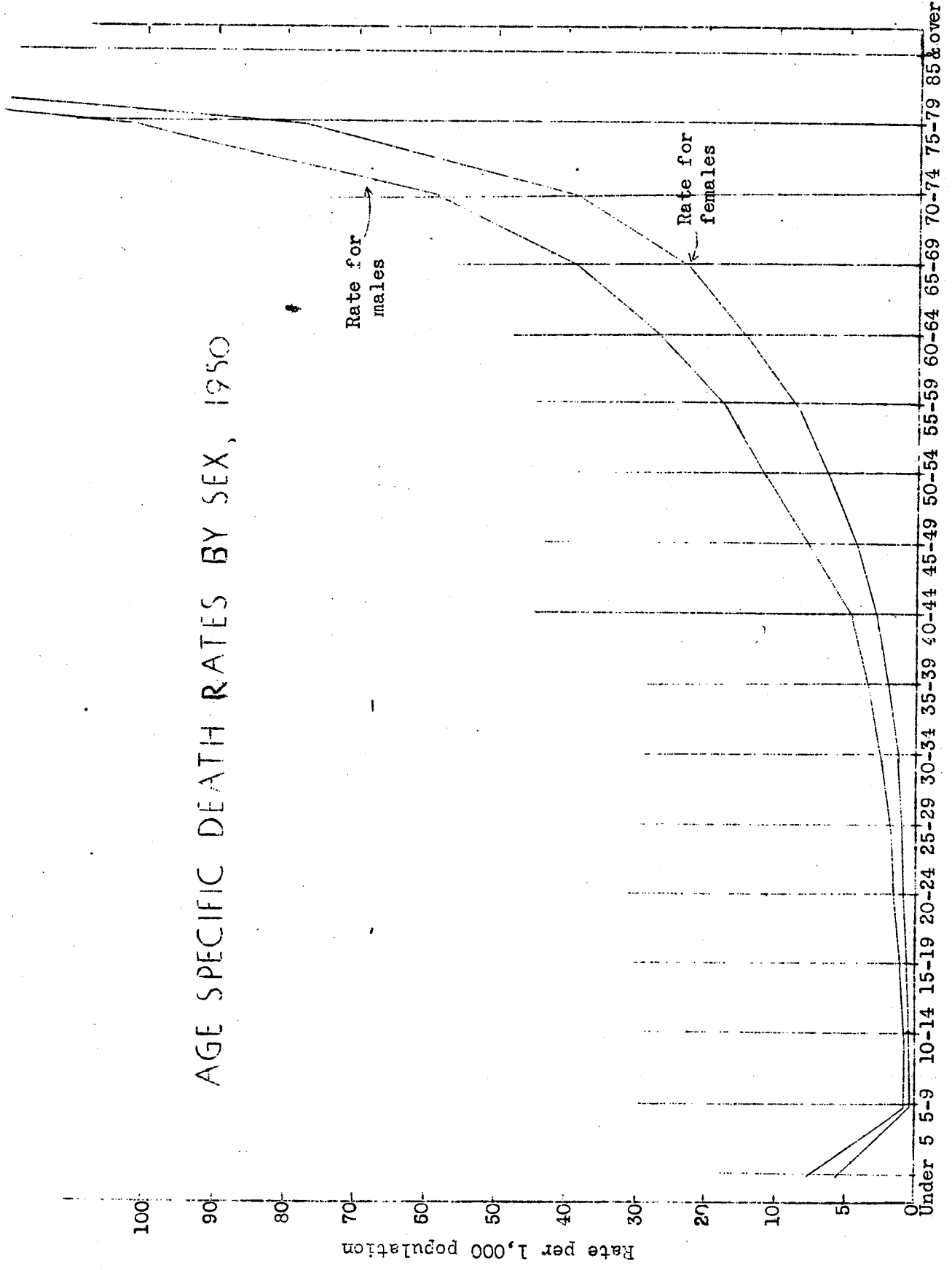

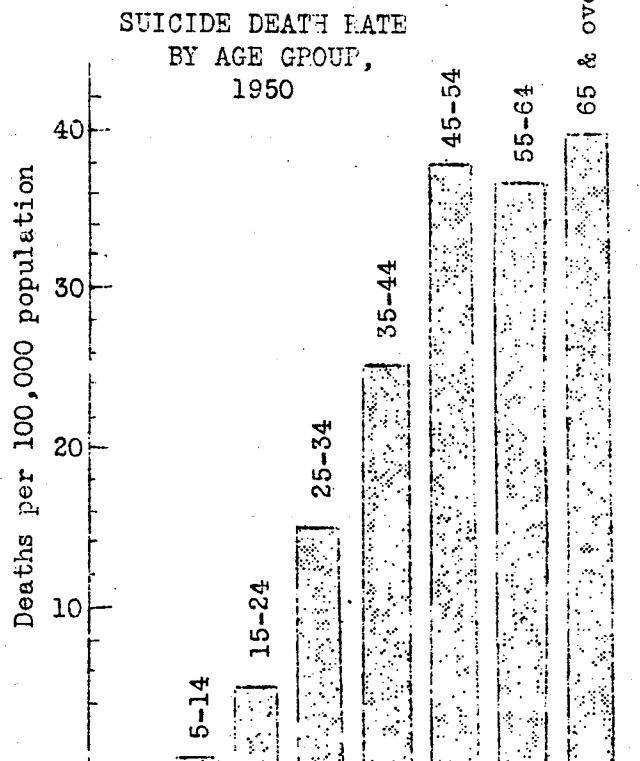
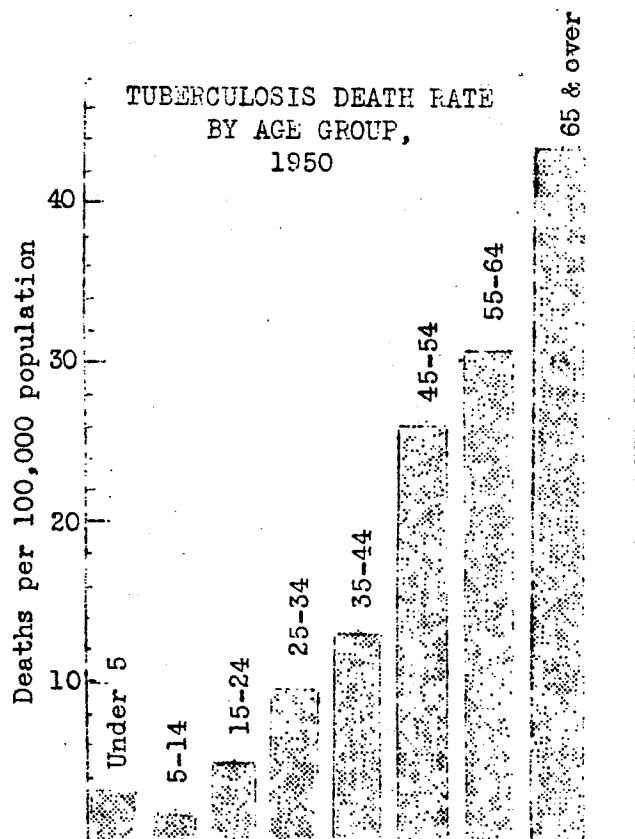
