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INTRODUCTION

The 1986 Summary of Vital Statistics and Induced Terminations of Pregnancy contains a summary presentation, in tabular form, of the vital events (birth, death, marriage, divorce) and induced abortions which occurred during the calendar year 1986. In the interest of easy comparison, essentially the same format of tabular presentation has been continued as was used in previous reports, with the following changes:

- ADDED: Death Table 8 (Deaths Due to Malignant Neoplasm by Primary Site with Rates by Place of Residence)
- DELETED: Induced Terminations of Pregnancy Table 1J (Occurrence by Rh Factor and Treatment Setting)
- CHANGED: Death Table 6 (Deaths with Rates by Selected Causes by Place of Residence) - Diabetes Mellitus added to table and malignant neoplasm removed (now included in Death Table 8)

One additional change has been made:

The Year in Brief and Analysis sections have been combined into a single abridged section which presents selected highlights of the data. This change was made in the interests of expedience. The Analysis section, which was the most time-consuming part of the summary, often delayed production of the summary. In the future, special analytical topics will be covered in separate monographs or journal articles. This change means that the Summary of Vital Statistics and Induced Terminations of Pregnancy should be available to users on a more timely basis.

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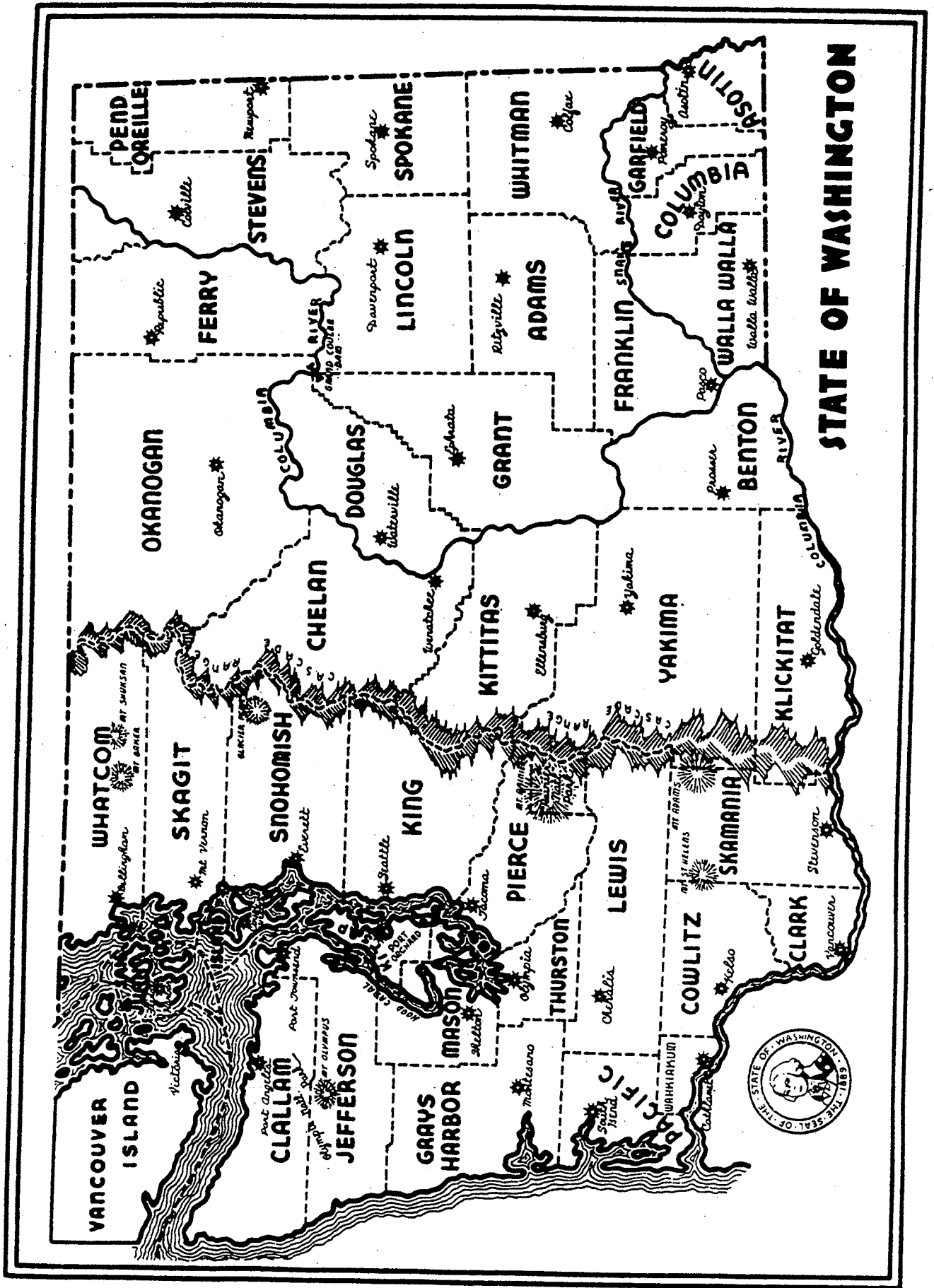

INTRODUCTION:

This year, the analysis of birth, death, infant and fetal death data has two parts for each data source. The first part ('1986 AT A GLANCE') puts 1986 vital events into perspective by comparing them to US data and presenting time trends for Washington State. The second part ('IS WASHINGTON STATE MEETING 1990 GOALS?') examines whether or not Washington State will meet the Surgeon General's 1990 goals. These goals have been established as targets to guide health promotion and disease prevention programs in their efforts to improve the health of the American people by the year 1990. Tracking progress towards these goals helps to identify areas where the state is doing comparatively well and problem areas where special efforts may be needed.

METHODS:

Trends are determined by comparing 1986 to the previous five years, thus they represent recent trends only. Long-term trends in rates are shown on the accompanying graphs.

Projected 1990 Washington State rates are determined by assuming that current trends will continue to 1990. Because this is a rough approximation, projected data are given in whole numbers only, to reflect their uncertainty.

SOURCES OF DATA:

Washington State data are based on 1986 Washington State resident events, except where two or three years are combined to provide more stability in rates. These cases are noted on the tables.

US figures are based on data reported in the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) Monthly Vital Statistics Reports (USDHHS, Public Health Service, Hyattsville, Maryland). Data are for the 12-month period ending July 1986 except where otherwise noted.

1990 goals are given in the NCHS publication Health: United States, 1986. (DHHS Publication No. PHS 87-1232. Public Health Service, Washington, US Government Printing Office, December, 1986).

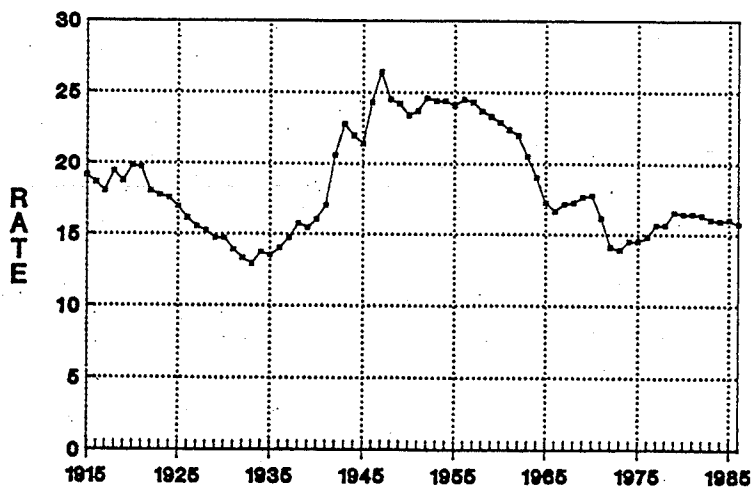

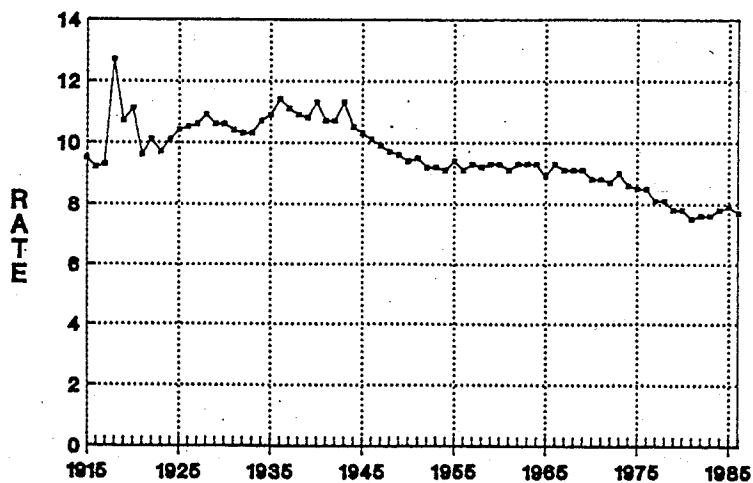

- +High suicide rates for the 15-24 age group, especially for males
- +High (though decreasing) Indian cirrhosis death rates; possibly increasing Black cirrhosis death rates

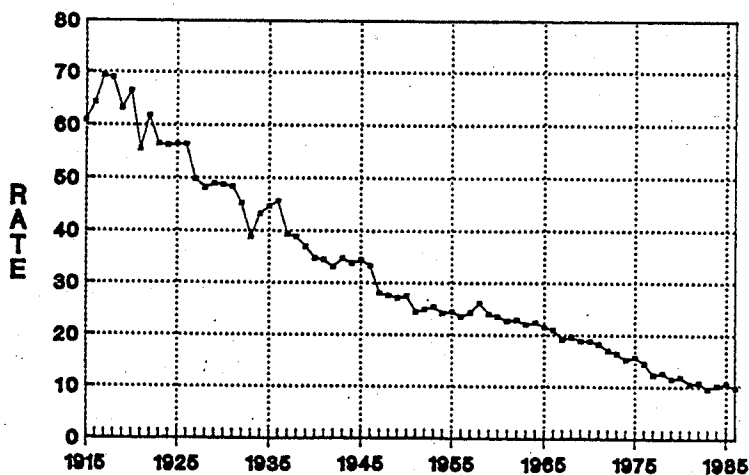

AREAS OF CONCERN

+High postneonatal death rates. This is a major concern. Washington State has the sixth highest postneonatal mortality rate in the nation. Much of the postneonatal mortality is due to Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS); Washington State's SIDS death rates are considerably higher than US rates (see previous page).

+High Black infant mortality rates

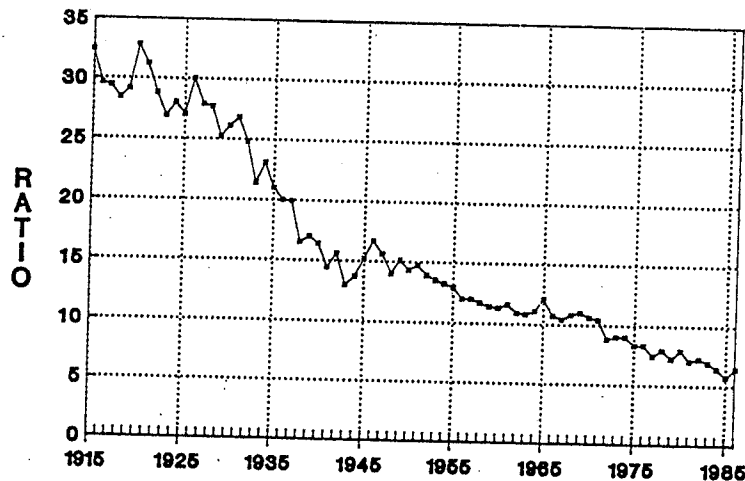

AREA OF CONCERN

+Perinatal mortality rates above the goal. The goal appears to be lower than the neonatal goal alone and may thus be unrealistic.

INDUCED TERMINATIONS OF PREGNANCY

Introduction

Abortion surveillance has been conducted by State public health officials since December, 1970. Induced abortion had become a legally allowable procedure in Washington State the previous month, when the then existing criminal abortion statute was overturned by referendum. The new law, which had some restrictions, was later invalidated by United States Supreme Court decision in Roe v. Wade (1973).

Since 1970, the reporting form has undergone six revisions, the last in 1985. Initially, the purpose of the abortion reporting system was to evaluate the safety and adequacy of procedures.(1) The data is important, additionally, for assessment in two other areas of public health concern: 1) prevention of unwanted pregnancies and 2) access to care. Trends pertinent to these issues are illustrated on a statewide basis in the graphs on the following pages. Further, both state and county data are arrayed in the Induced Terminations of Pregnancy chapter of the tables section.

All the usual problems of data collection--underreporting, incompleteness, and inaccuracies--impose qualifications on any conclusions. See the Technical Notes, Appendix B, in this report for more detail on reporting problems.

 WASHINGTON STATE, 1985 & 1986

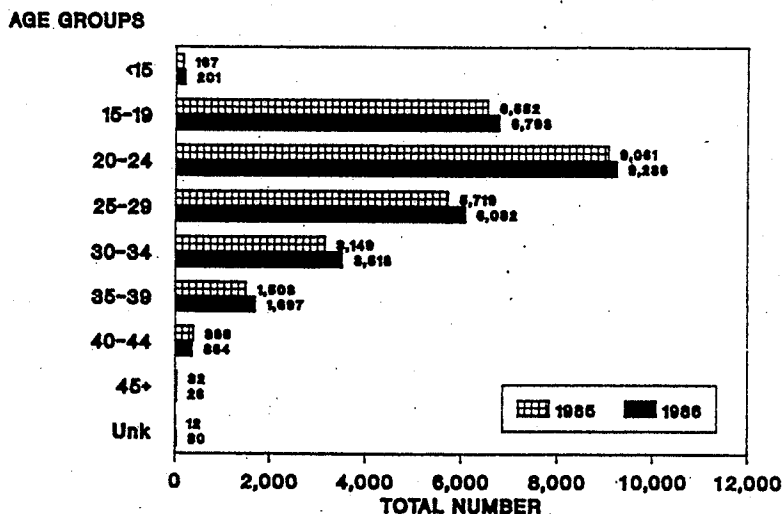
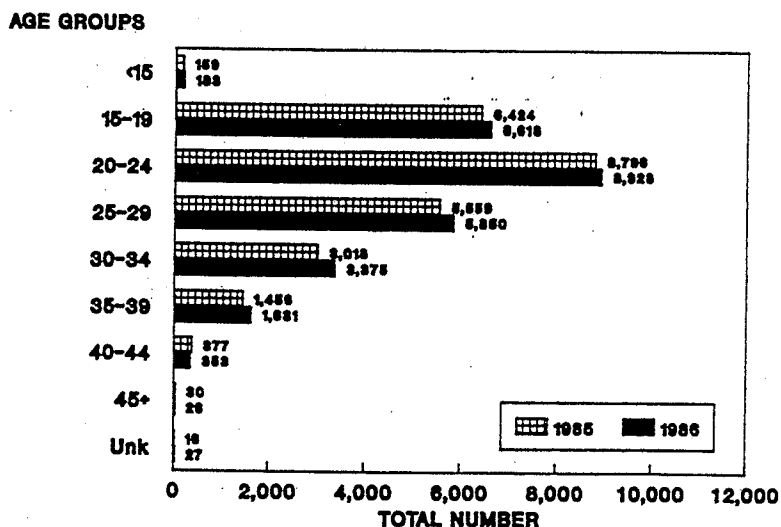

 WASHINGTON STATE, 1985 & 1986



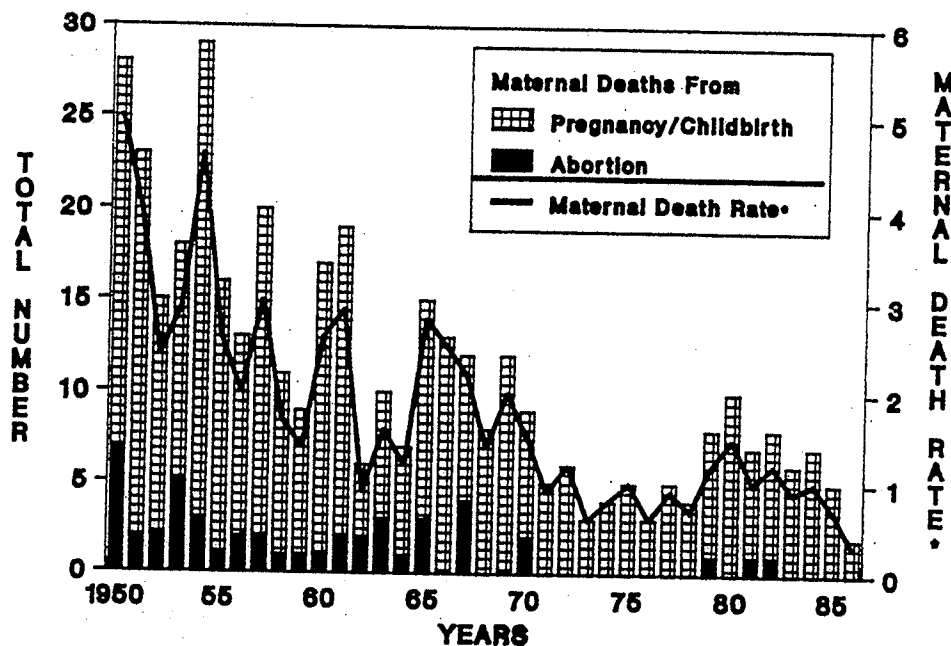
Totals for both resident abortions and abortion occurrences increased in 1986--4.5% (1,156) from 25,835 to 26,991 and 5.1% (1,366) from 26,581 to 27,947, respectively. Although change took place across all age groups, there were both absolute and proportionate differences. Among residents, the greatest percentage gain was among those under 15 years old (+15.1%); the greatest absolute difference was in the 30-34 age group (+357).

Trends in abortion related mortality, show that abortion as a contributing factor in maternal deaths has been nearly eliminated. Maternal deaths are deaths to women which are a result of complications of pregnancy or occur within six weeks of either live birth or abortive outcome. The maternal death rate is equal to the number of these deaths per 10,000 live births.

The data illustrated in the chart above do not differentiate between legal and illegal abortions. The two deaths in 1970 took place prior to the passage of the referendum in that year. The three deaths which occurred in the years following 1970 were the result of complications--one each, from: a legally induced abortion procedure (performed probably as a consequence of IUPD, intrauterine fetal demise) in 1979, a self-induced abortion in 1981, and a spontaneous abortion in 1982.

Nationally, the death-to-case rate, that is the number of deaths per 100,000 legally induced abortions, was 0.5 in 1981, 0.8 in 1982, and provisionally 0.7 in 1983.(2)

Morbidity

Typically, second trimester abortions have a higher complication rate than first trimester terminations. It should be noted that the division between first and second trimester is somewhat arbitrary at twelve weeks. See Technical Notes, Appendix A, in this report.

The liberalization of the abortion law in December, 1982 to allow second trimester procedures in approved nonhospital facilities and improved reporting may account for some of the rise in second trimester abortions.

The 1986 complication rate in Figure 9 was adjusted to exclude other complications evaluated as minor. These were reported mostly in first trimester procedures. They included items such as "unexplained pain" and "hemorrhage less than 500cc." This same adjustment was made in prior annual State summations, but they were suppressed prior to publication in previous years.

COMPLICATION RATES BY TYPE AND TRIMESTER WASHINGTON STATE OCCURRENCES, 1986

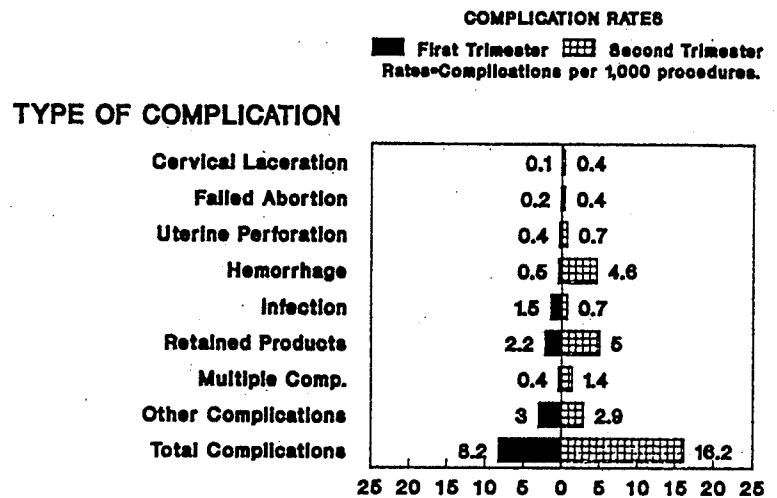
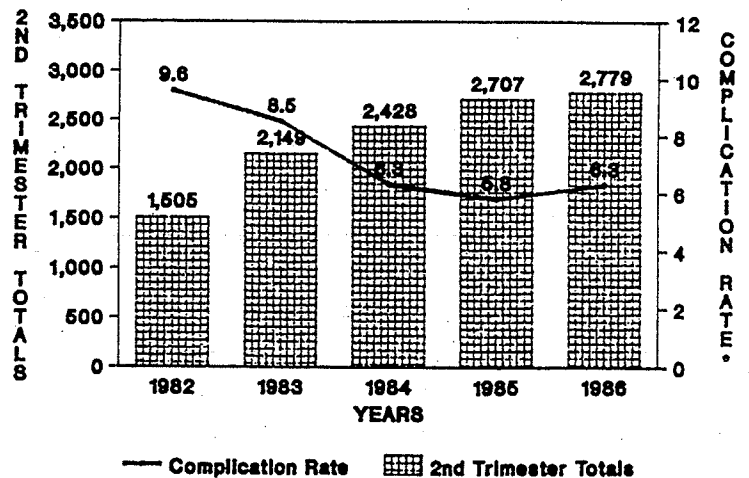

COMPLICATION RATES AND 2ND TRIMESTER PROCEDURES WASHINGTON STATE OCCURRENCES, 1982-1986



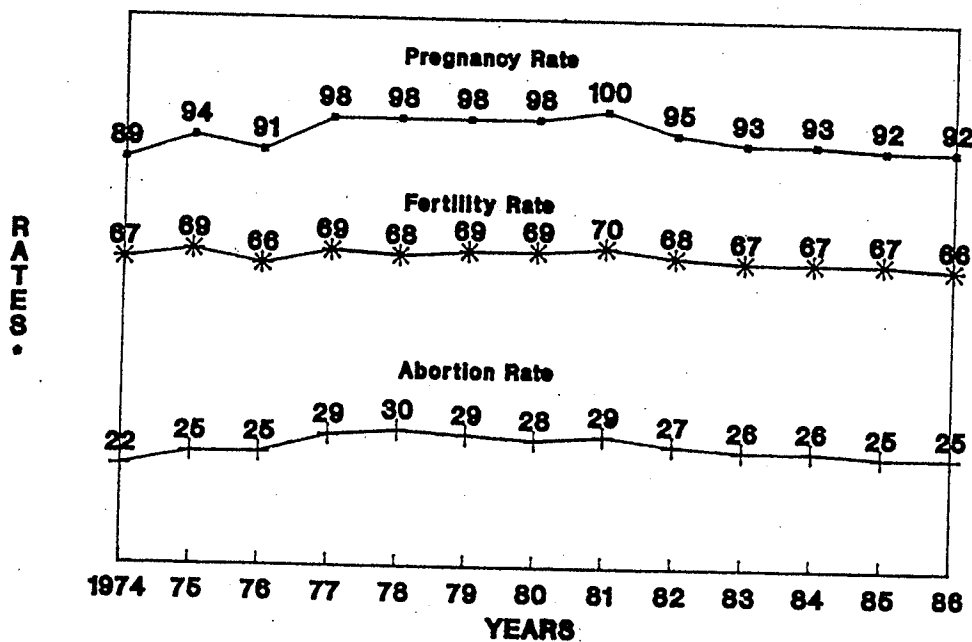

Although there was an increase in total resident abortions in 1986 over 1985, the abortion rate (abortions per 1,000 women aged 15-44) remained constant between the two years. A look at pregnancy, fertility, and abortion rates over the past ten years shows they are all lower in the most recent five (1982-1986) than they were in the earlier five (1977-1981). The abortion ratio shows a similar pattern. See next page.

Abortion rates can be affected by either or both a change in the number of women getting pregnant (expressed mathematically by the pregnancy rate) or by the number of pregnant women obtaining abortions (expressed indirectly by abortion ratios). In 1986, the slight increase (6%) in the abortion ratio was not enough to affect appreciably the abortion rate.

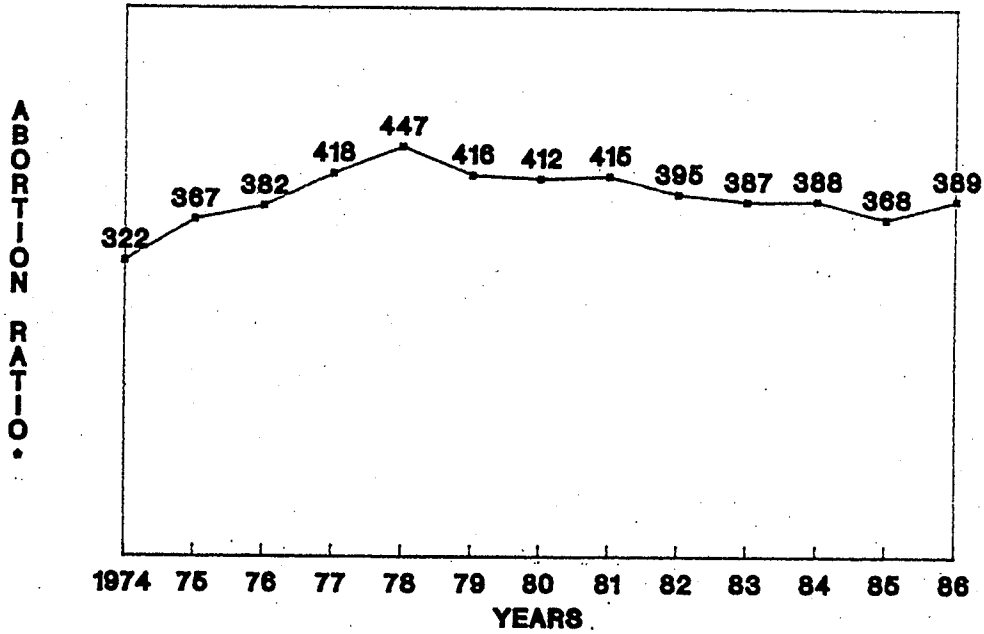
The three age-specific charts on the following pages show age group differences in abortion ratios and abortion and fertility rates. The change within individual age groups has been modest; the greatest, an increase in fertility rates among 30-34 year olds (+28%) between 1978 and 1986.

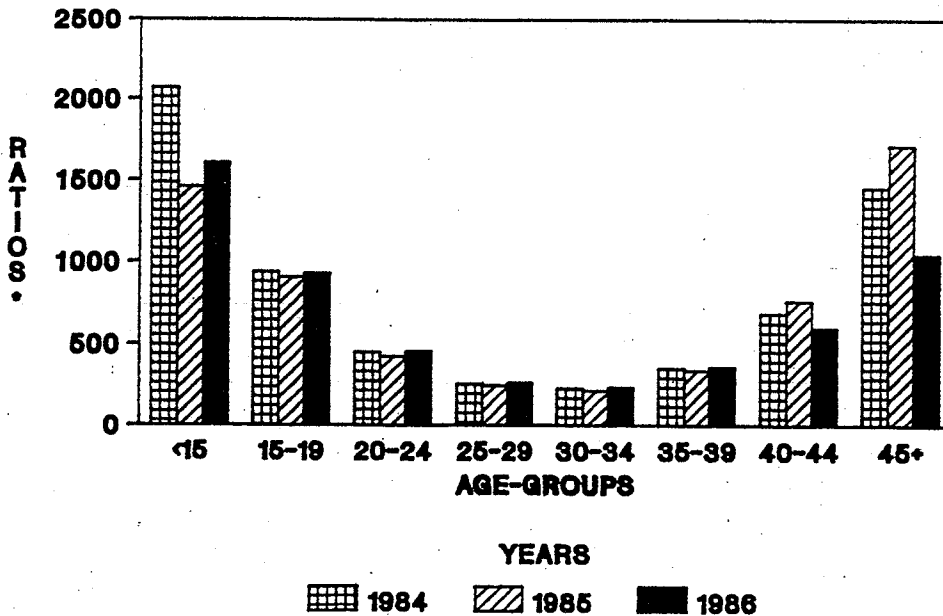
**ABORTION RATIO BY YEAR

WASHINGTON STATE RESIDENTS, 1984-1986**



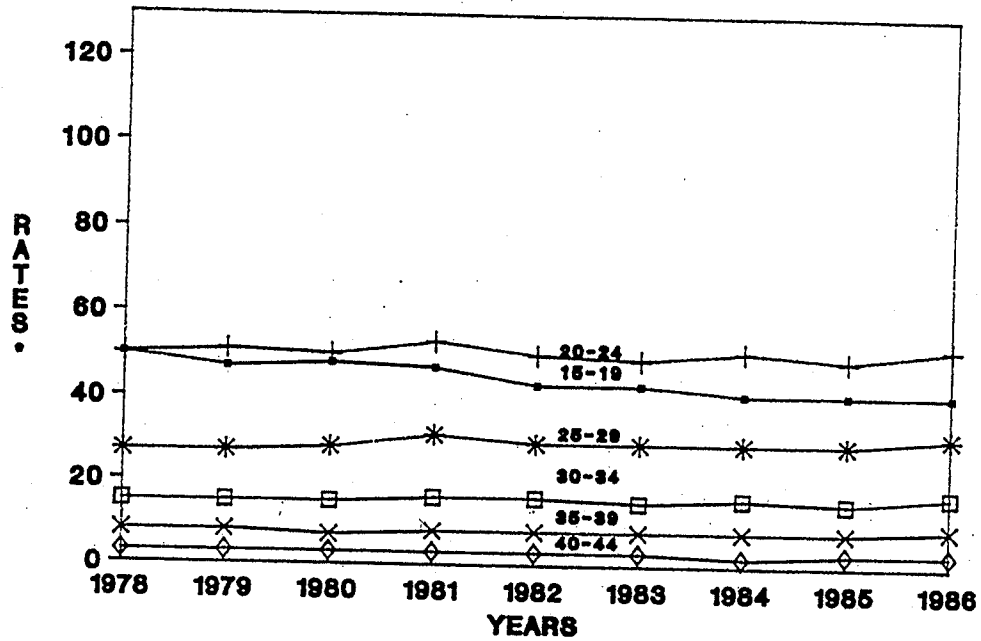

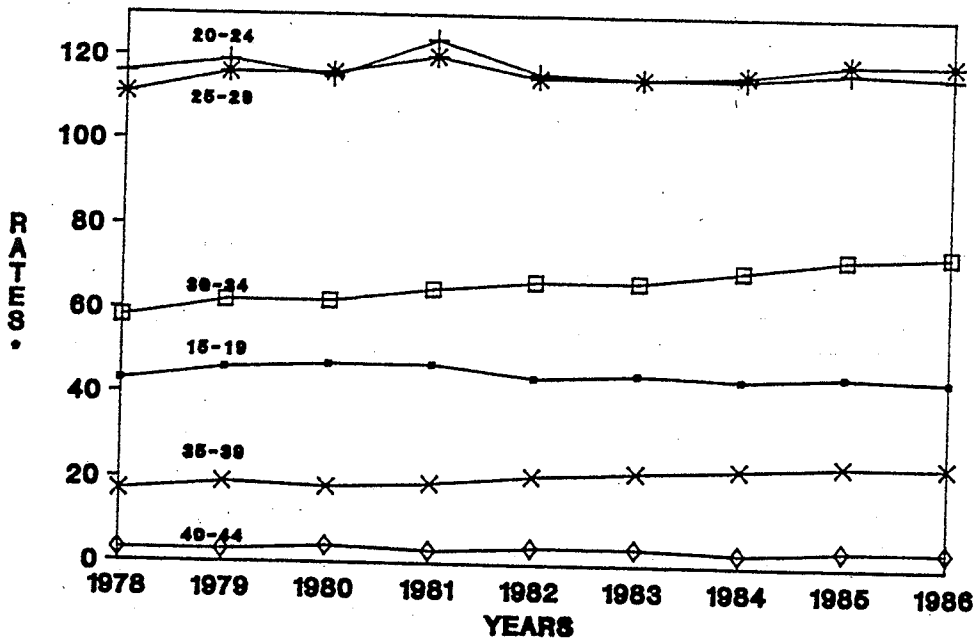
**AGE-SPECIFIC ABORTION RATES

WASHINGTON STATE RESIDENTS, 1978-1986**



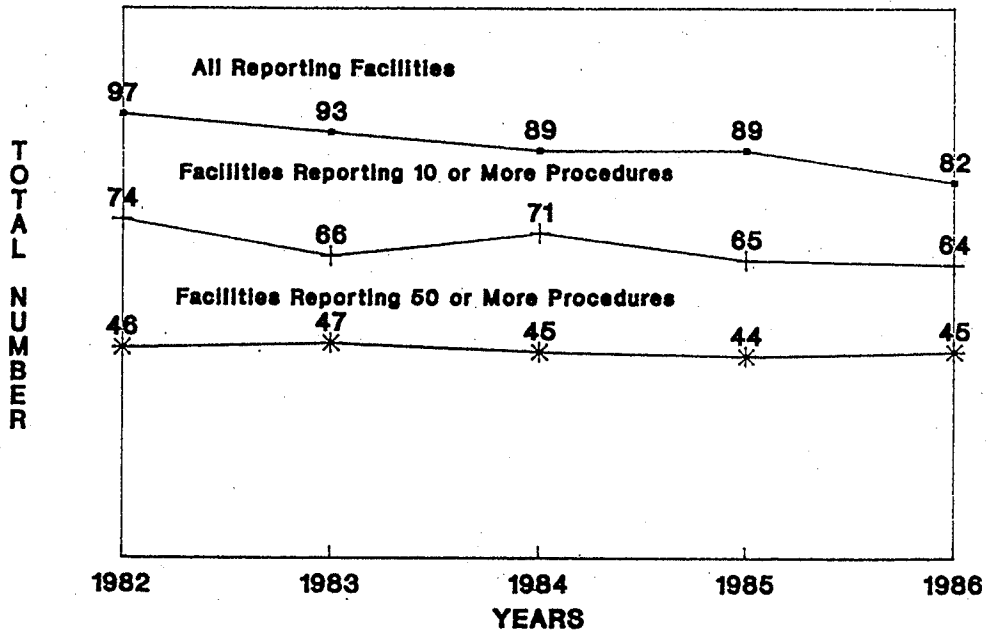
*Rates-Live births per 1,000 women in each age group.

In the past five years, there has been a decline in abortion service providers. The total number of facilities dropped 15 in the five years from 1982 to 1986. Five were among those reporting fewer than 10 procedures; nine, between 10 and 49; and one, 50 or more.

A decline in health care providers is always a public health concern because of the increased potential for adverse effects on patient health. Thus, in addition, to the ongoing concern regarding safety of procedure, attention must remain focused on maintaining access to care, as well as, prevention of the conditions which necessitate that care--in the case of induced abortion, that is--unwanted pregnancy.

APPENDIX

APPENDIX A

DEFINITIONS

GENERAL TERMS

ABORTION - The termination (spontaneous or induced) of a pregnancy before the fetus has attained viability. Where unqualified in this report, the term refers to induced abortions.

ABORTION-RELATED COMPLICATIONS - Complications encountered and detected at the time pregnancy termination occurs and before the abortion report is filed.

Cervical laceration - a tear wound of the cervix which requires sutures.

Failed abortion - the products of conception fail to be expelled from the uterus after induction.

Hemorrhage - copious or excessive bleeding, clinically assessed.

Infection - inflammation of the endometrium (the mucous coat of the uterus) or elevation of body temperature over 100.4 degrees for one or more days.

Retained products - retention of some of the fetal or placental tissue in the uterus after an abortion procedure. A second procedure is required for removal.

Uterine perforation - unintentional puncture of the uterine wall which requires intervention.

BIRTH WEIGHT - Weight of fetus or infant at time of delivery (normally recorded in pounds and ounces).

FETAL DEATH - Death prior to the complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of human conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy. The death is indicated by the fact that after such expulsion or extraction the fetus does not breathe or show any other evidence of life such as beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord, or definite movement of voluntary muscles. Reporting of fetal deaths to the state is required only when the gestational period is twenty weeks or more.

GESTATIONAL PERIOD - Number of weeks elapsed between the first day of the last menstrual period and date of delivery or date of pregnancy termination. The Abortion Reporting System relies upon the physician's estimate of gestational age. With current technology (i.e., ultrasound) accuracy is plus or minus 11 days.

INDUCED ABORTION - The purposeful interruption of pregnancy, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy, with the intention other than to produce a live born infant or to remove a dead fetus, the result of which is not a live birth. Procedures for false pregnancy, ectopic pregnancy and missed abortion (dead ovum retained in uterus in intended pregnancy) are not included.

INDUCED ABORTION PROCEDURES:

Dilatation and Evacuation (D&E) - dilatation of the cervical canal by means of laminaria tents (sterile dried seaweed) until the cervical opening is large enough to allow removal of the uterine contents by means of a sponge forceps or some other specially designed instrument.

Hysterectomy - removal of the uterus by surgical procedure either with the fetus inside or after the fetus is removed; usually performed when a pathological condition of the uterus, such as fibroid tumors, warrants its removal, or when a woman desires sterilization.

Hysterotomy - surgical entry into the uterus, as in a Caesarean section, to remove a fetus too immature to survive, even with extraordinary life support measures; usually performed only if other abortion measures have failed.

Prostaglandin - induction of labor resulting in the expulsion of the fetus by administration of a substance with hormone-like action, either vaginal suppository or intra-amniotic injection.

Saline - induction of labor with eventual expulsion of the fetus by insertion of a hollow needle through the abdominal wall, withdrawal of a portion of the amniotic fluid from the uterine cavity, and subsequent replacement with a concentrated salt solution.

Sharp Curettage - dilatation of the cervical canal with scraping and removal of fetal and placental tissues by use of a curette (which resembles a small spoon). Also, surgical D&C or surgical curettage.

Suction Curettage - dilatation of the cervical canal by the successive insertion of instruments of increasing diameter called dilators until the opening is large enough to insert a flexible tube (cannula) into the uterine cavity and permit the suction removal of fetal and placental tissues by an electric vacuum pump. Also, vacuum aspiration, suction D&C, or early uterine evacuation.

INFANT DEATH - Death of a child under one year of age.

LIVE BIRTH - The complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of human conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy, which, after such expulsion or extraction, breathes, or shows any other evidence of life such as beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord, or definite movement of voluntary muscles, whether or not the umbilical cord has been cut or the placenta is attached.

LIVE BIRTH ORDER - Total number of live births to a given mother, including current birth.

MATERNAL DEATH - Death attributed to complications of pregnancy, childbirth, or the puerperium; includes abortion related deaths.

NEONATAL DEATH - Death of an infant within the first 27 days of life.

NULLIPAROUS - Having never given birth to a liveborn infant.

OCCURRENCE DATA - Data allocated by place where event occurred, regardless of the person's place of residence.

PARITY - Previous live births; does not include current birth.

PERINATAL DEATH - Fetal deaths plus deaths to infants within the first six days of life.

PREMATURE BIRTH - A live birth weighing 2,500 grams (5-1/2 pounds) or less. If birth weight is not stated, length of gestation (under 37 weeks) is used.

RESIDENCE DATA - Data allocated by place of residence of the decedent (deaths), or by place of residence of the child's mother (births, fetal deaths) or patient (abortions).

SPONTANEOUS ABORTION - An unintended interruption of pregnancy the result of which is a fetal death of any gestational age. Also, miscarriage or miscarried pregnancy.

TRIMESTER - The duration of human pregnancy, approximately 266 days, divided by 3, resulting in three equal time periods equaling 88.67 days, or 12.67 weeks, or approximately three months, each. As a useful rule-of-thumb, gestation weeks 1 through 12 are considered the first trimester of pregnancy; weeks 13 through 24, the second trimester; and over 24 weeks, the third trimester.

RATES AND RATIOS

Rates and ratios are calculated by dividing the event of concern by the population at risk or a related population and multiplying by a constant (i.e. 1,000, 10,000, or 100,000). See below.

ABORTION RATE - Number of abortions per 1,000 female population aged 15 to 44.

ABORTION RATIO - Number of abortions per 1,000 live births.

AGE-SPECIFIC RATE - Number in event of concern for a specific age group per some fixed constant of population in that age group. For instance, the age-specific death rate is the number of deaths in a specific age group per 100,000 population in that age group. See different rates, i.e. fertility, pregnancy, abortion, for most typically used fixed constant in each rate.

CAUSE-SPECIFIC DEATH RATE - Number of deaths from a specific cause per 100,000 population.

COMPLICATION RATE - Number of complication cases per 1,000 procedures; one case may have more than one complication.

(CRUDE) BIRTH RATE - Number of live births per 1,000 population.

(CRUDE) DEATH RATE - Number of deaths per 1,000 population.

FERTILITY RATE - Number of live births per 1,000 women, 15-44 years of age.

FETAL DEATH RATIO - Number of fetal deaths per 1,000 live births.

INFANT DEATH RATE - Number of infant deaths per 1,000 live births.

MATERNAL DEATH RATE - Number of maternal deaths per 10,000 live births.

NEONATAL DEATH RATE - Number of neonatal deaths per 1,000 live births.

PERINATAL DEATH RATE - Number of perinatal deaths per 1,000 live births plus fetal deaths.

PREGNANCY RATE - Number of total pregnancies (live births, fetal deaths, and abortions) per 1,000 female population aged 15-44.

APPENDIX B

TECHNICAL NOTES

RELIABILITY OF THE DATA

In analyzing any data, the possibility of errors in the data must not be overlooked. There are several types of possible errors, including underreporting or under-registration, errors made by the informant, and errors in compilation and processing. The most potentially dangerous error, however, is probably that of improper interpretation.

Statistics are neither more true nor false than the interpretation given to them. It should be emphasized that most of the rates computed in this report are crude rates. For comparing geographic areas, crude rates are limited. They do not reflect differences in age, sex, race, and other population characteristics. In addition, it is important to recognize the possible distortion in these rates where the number of events or the population is small. Minor variations in the number of events may result in major changes in the rates. Special caution should also be exercised in analyzing trend data, because of changes throughout the years in medical diagnosis, coding definitions, and registration coverage.

This year's report used an automated process to create all the tables published. The programs were reapplied to the previous five years of data pertaining to induced abortion to facilitate trend analysis. Some differences with previously published totals resulted. Therefore, there is some slight variation between totals published in the 1982 volume of Induced Termination of Pregnancy, Washington State and this report. The difference is not statistically significant.

COLLECTION YEAR

Data for the Vital Statistics and Induced Terminations of Pregnancy report are compiled from items on birth, death, marriage, and divorce certificates, and abortion reports received before April 15, 1987. (See Appendix F for samples.)

INTERSTATE EXCHANGES

Washington State is a member of the interstate exchange agreement and receives birth and death certificates of residents who have died in other states. Although, no formal agreement exists, some states have agreed to exchange abortion reports. Out-of-state marriage and divorce certificates are not exchanged.

POPULATION

Population data in this report are an estimate of population provided by the Washington State Office of Financial Management, April 1, 1986.

County populations for women in the age-groups, 15-17 and 18-19, were determined by using the state totals for these age groups and applying the same proportions to the individual counties.

RACE

The race of women obtaining induced abortions, although collected, is not useful for analysis because of the large number of reported unknowns and blanks. In 1986, "unknown" was the second largest category, amounting to more than all other racial categories combined except white among reported abortions.

The determination of race on birth and death certificates follows decision rules established by the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS).

If more than one race is listed and one is Hawaiian, Hawaiian is selected. In cases of other races, the first non-white race listed is selected.

To determine race of newborns on birth certificates, each parent's race is first established according to the previous rules. Rules to determine race of the child, then, fall along a similar pattern:

1. If either parent is Hawaiian, then the child's race is considered Hawaiian.
2. In cases where one parent is white and the other non-white, the non-white race is selected as the race of the child.
3. If both parents are non-white, the father's race is selected except where the mother's race is Hawaiian.

The racial category, Mexican/Chicano, is exclusive to persons who identified themselves as either Mexican, Chicano, or Mexican-American. Persons who identified themselves as Hispanic or as one of several other ethnic groups of Spanish origin, such as Cuban or Puerto Rican, were not included in this category. Using the category Mexican/Chicano as a surrogate for Spanish origin or Hispanic could result in erroneous conclusions.

OCCURRENCE DATA

The validity of occurrence death data has some limitations. As the death certificate does not specify inside or outside of corporate limits for place of death, rural deaths may be incorrectly assigned to cities because the location of death was in close proximity to a city. Informants, moreover, often are unaware of city boundaries.

CAUSE OF DEATH CLASSIFICATION

The causes of death presented herein are classified in accordance with the The International Classification of Diseases, Ninth Revision published by the World Health Organization. The State of Washington began using this revision January 1, 1979.

RANKING OF LEADING CAUSES OF DEATH

In the interest of comparability, this summary uses, in general, the cause of death groups established by the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS).

LOW BIRTH WEIGHT

Traditionally, low birth weight has been defined as 2,500 grams or less. However, the International Classification of Diseases, Ninth Revision (ICD-9) redefines low birth weight as less than 2,500 grams. Thus, 2,500 grams should now be included with the normal birth weight category. The impact of this change is minimal in the United States, where most weights are given in pounds and ounces. No weight of pounds and ounces converts exactly to 2,500 grams (5lb, 8oz is 2,495g and 5lb 9oz is 2,523g). It is, therefore, unlikely that many weights of 2,500 grams are recorded. In fact, none were found in a study of 1984 Washington State births. In the interests of consistency with past data, Washington State has chosen to continue including 2,500 grams with the low birth weight category.

ABORTION COMPLICATIONS

Complication totals and rates of abortion procedures should be interpreted with some caution. Some incomplete reporting could have resulted where followup care was carried out after reports were filed or by another physician. In addition, when comparing total rates between years, differences in forms and data processing rules may create artificial changes. In 1986, minor complaints reported by physicians among "Other Complications" were not suppressed as in previous years. These were items, such as "unexplained pain" or "hemorrhage less than or equal to 500cc."

ROUNDING

Rates are rounded to the nearest tenth. When the rate or percent is less than one-tenth, the entry is 0. Where whole numbers are used, a blank indicates none or zero.
