INTRODUCTION

This report presents data on livebirths, deaths, fetal deaths (stillbirths), marriages and divorces, for the calendar year 1960 and the U. S. Census population for the State of Washington as of April 1, 1960. Most data are reported for the state as a whole, each county and each city of 10,000 population or more.

Vital statistics data included in this report are identified either as residence data or occurrence data. Residence data refer to vital events involving residents of the area regardless of where the vital events actually occurred. Occurrence data refer to vital events actually occurring in the area regardless of the place of residence of the person or persons involved. In general, data presented on a residence basis are more useful.

Certain additional data including data for cities of 2,500 to 10,000 population in 1960 are available in unpublished form in the files of the Public Health Statistics Section.

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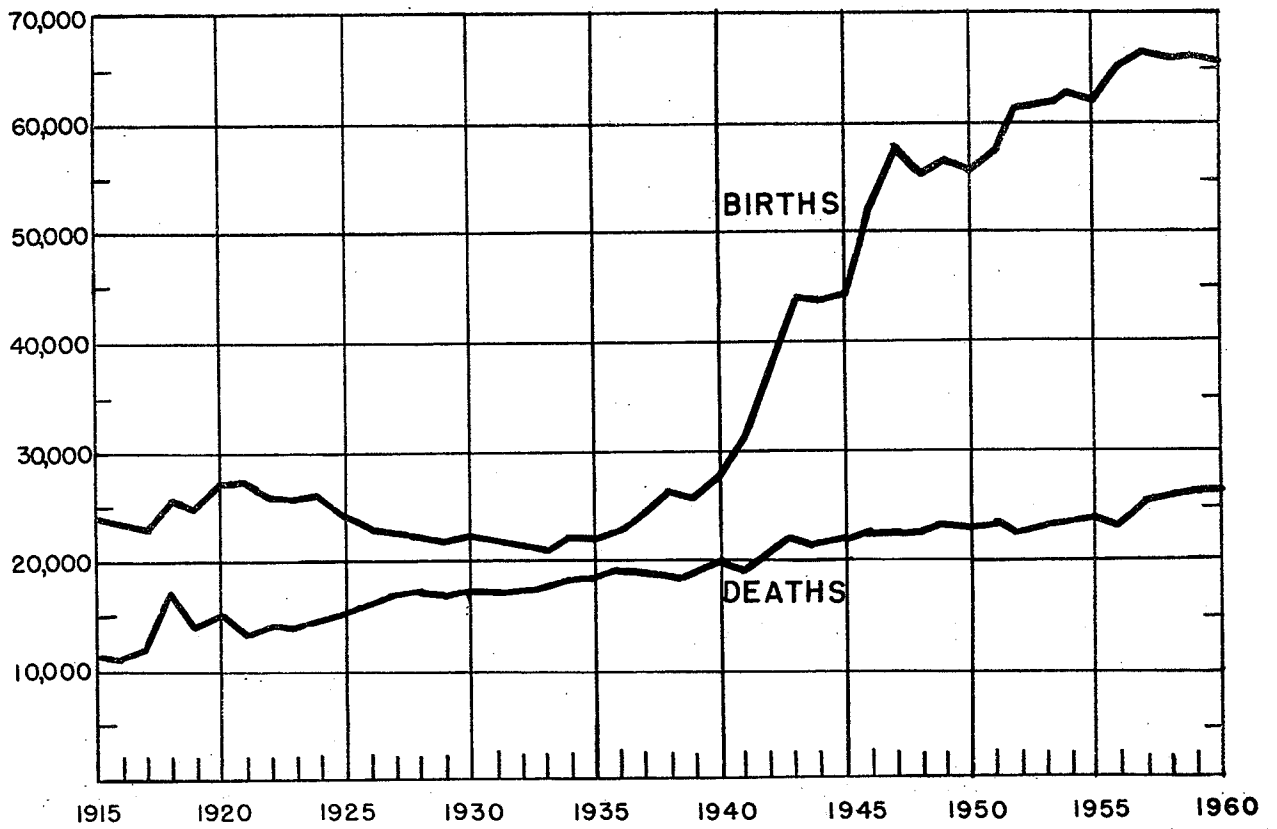
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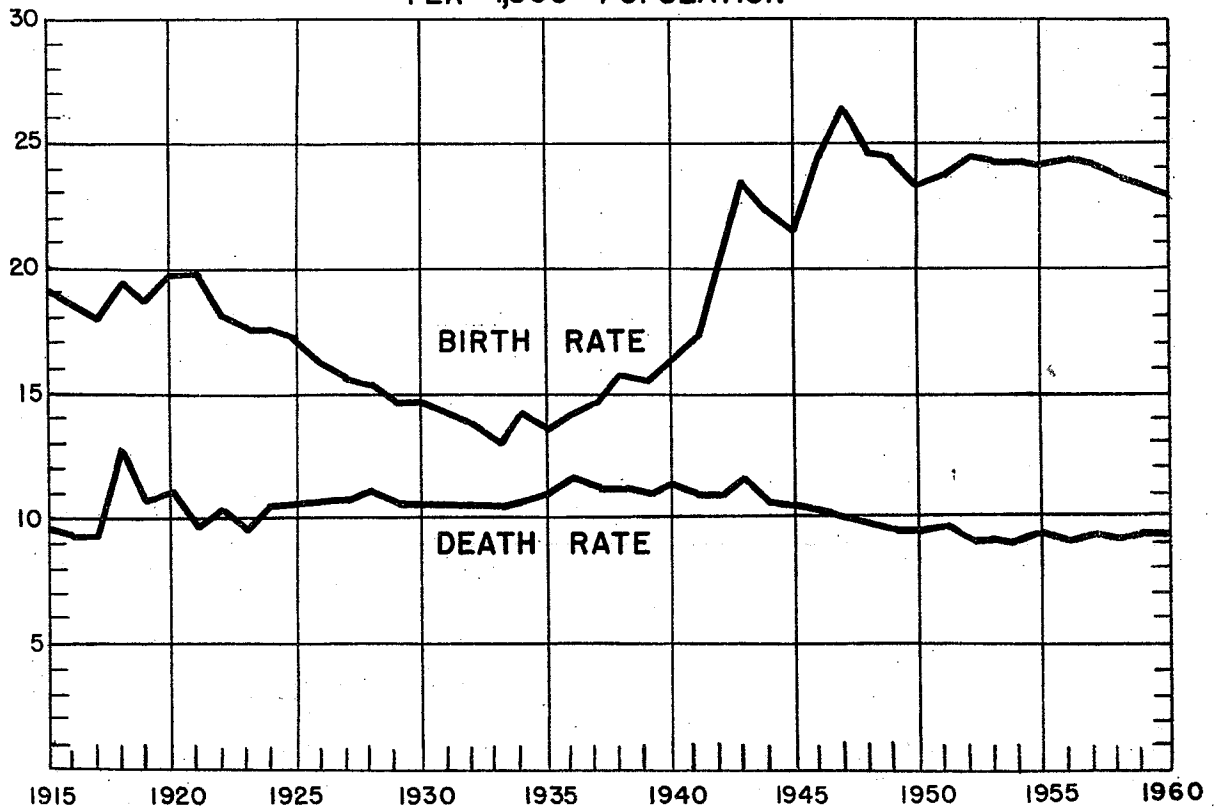
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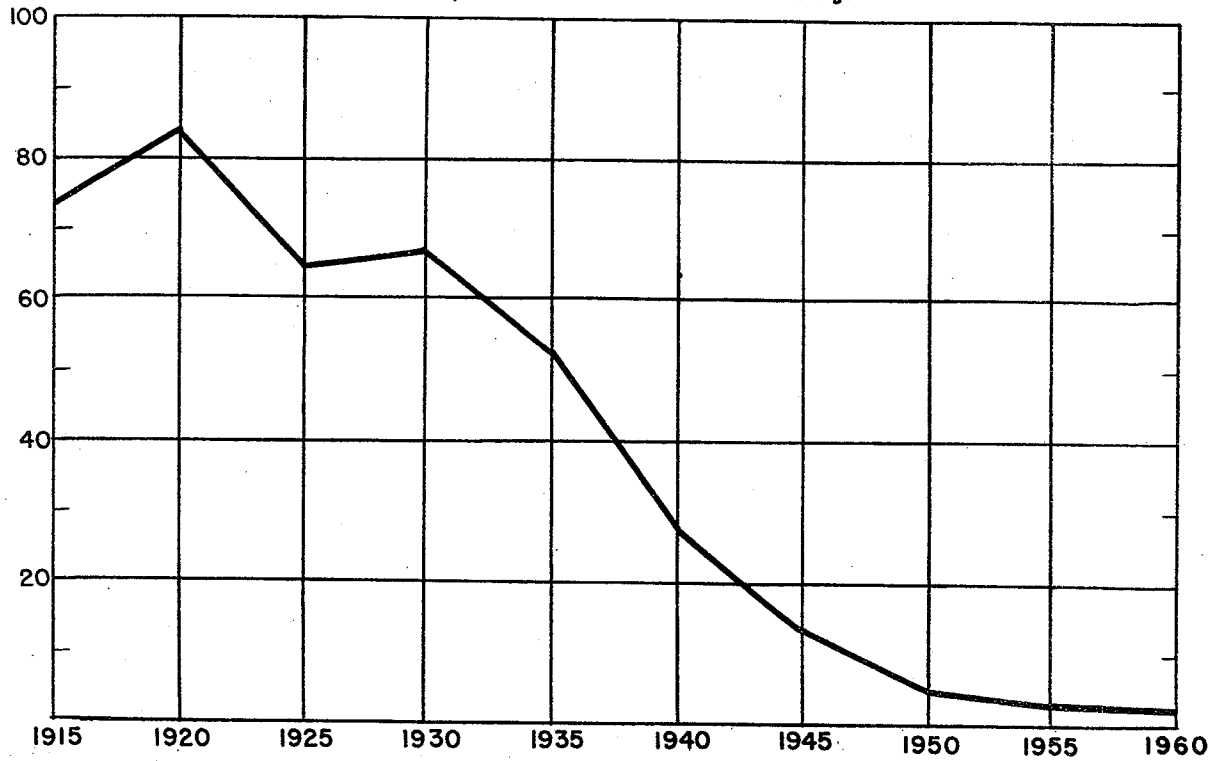
BIRTHS AND DEATHS, 1915 - 1960

PER 1,000 LIVEBIRTHS

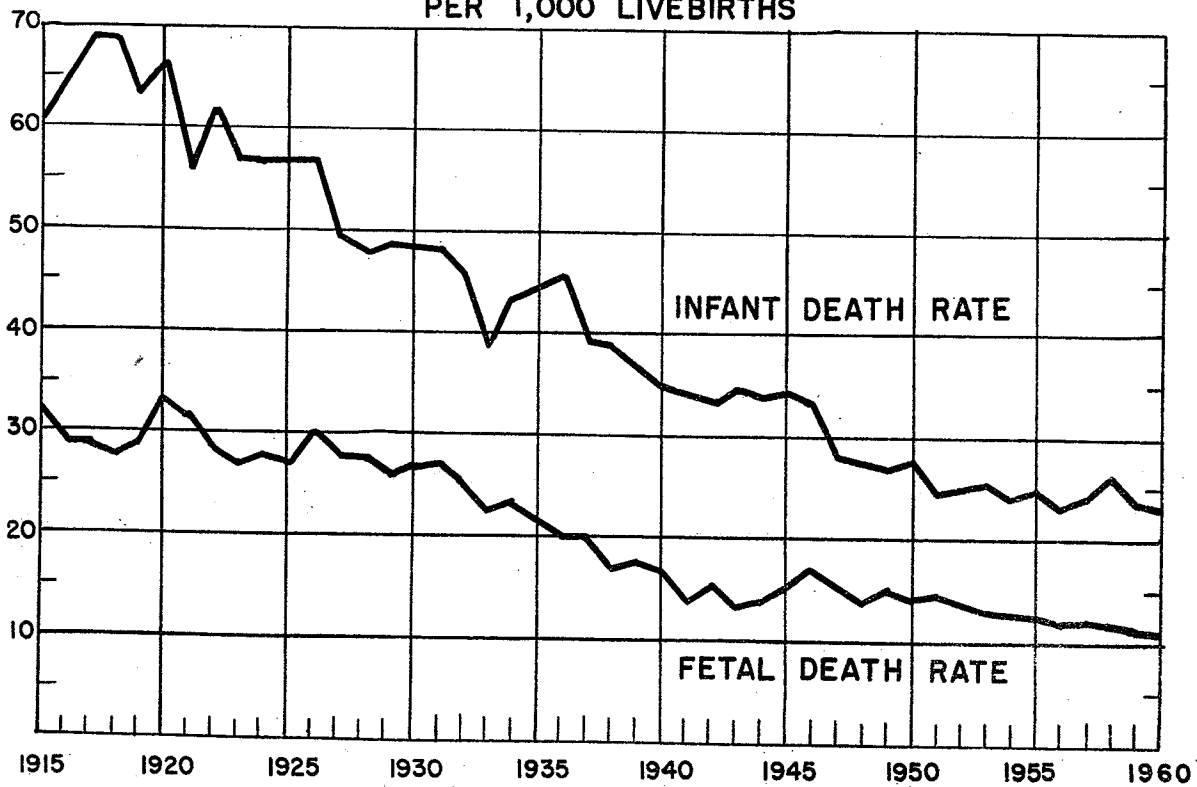

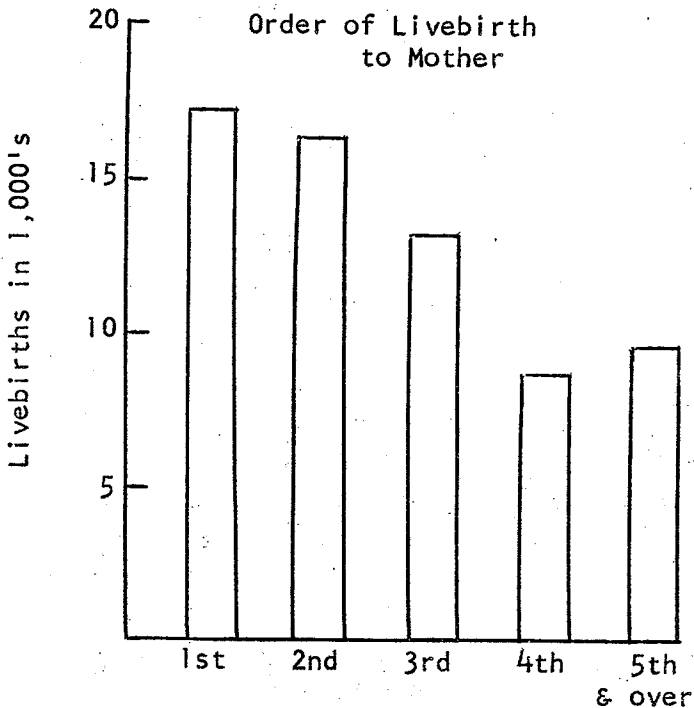
LIVEBIRTHS

The number of livebirths occurring in Washington in 1960 was 65,273 and 65,251 births to Washington residents. The resident birth rate for 1960 is 22.9, slightly below the ten year median of 24.2.

Table 2 lists the number of births from 1915 through 1960 with rates per 1,000 estimated population. These data are presented graphically on page XI. It can be observed in general the trend has been upward although a temporary downward trend prevailed during the period from 1920 through 1933. In 1933, the low rate of 12.9 per 1,000 population prevailed. From this point, a gradual rising trend is observed which continues until the peak is reached in 1947.

Counties showing the highest resident birth rates for 1960 (all those over 28.0 per 1,000 population) were Grant with 31.0 per 1,000, Island with 30.2 per 1,000. Those counties showing the lowest resident birth rates (all those under 16.0 per 1,000 population) were Columbia with 15.5 per 1,000, San Juan with 11.5 per 1,000. Residence and occurrence births for 1960 with rates per 1,000 population are given in Table 4 on page 10 of this summary.

Of the total residence livebirths, 94.4 per cent were classified as White, with 2.5 per cent as Negro, 1.5 per cent as Indian and the balance as Oriental or Other. This is a slight gain in the percentage of non-white livebirths from 3.5% in 1950 to 5.6% in 1960. County data by race are given in Table 5, page 12.



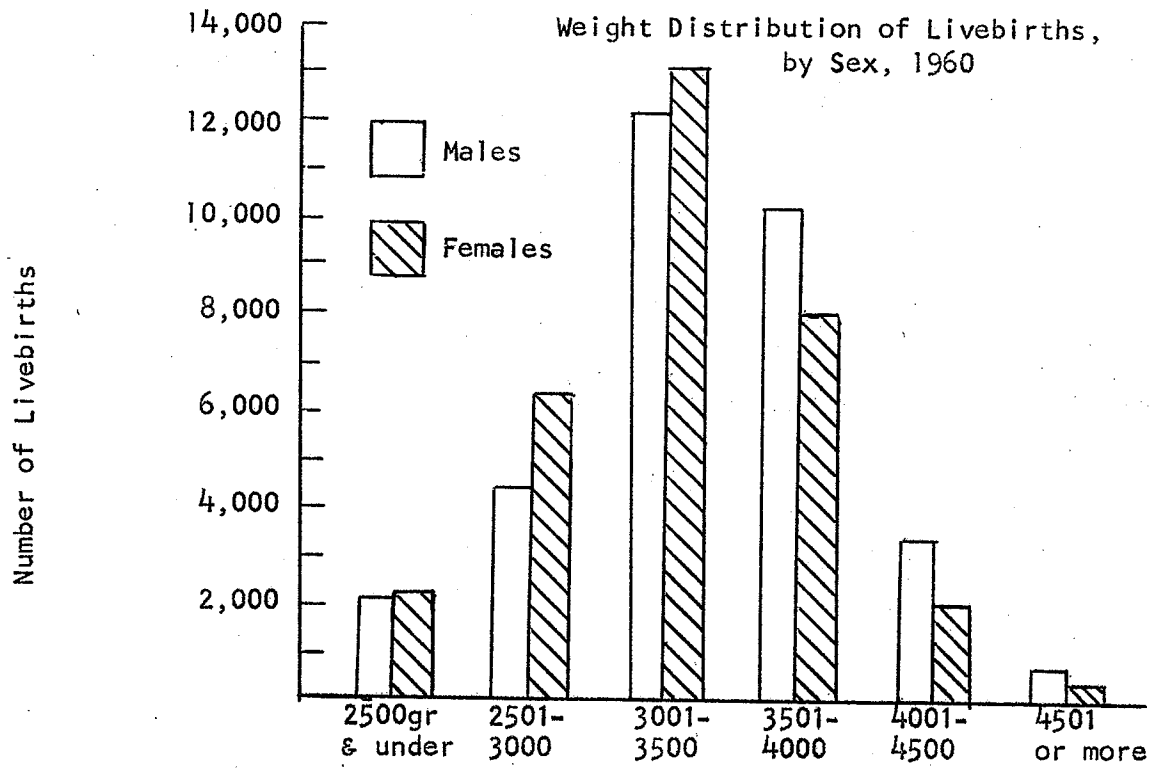
Of the livebirths by occurrence, 99.2 per cent were born in hospitals or maternity homes. Occurrence data by type of institution of birth, are given in Table 7, page 16.

The sex ratio of residence livebirths was 103.9 males per every 100 females. In regard to the order of birth, more livebirths were the first child of the family than were the second or third. Of the residence livebirths, 26.3% were the first child in the family, 25.5% the second child and 20.4% the third child born to the family. The order of livebirth to mother is illustrated in the graph on this page and is presented in tabulated form in the birth summary table on page 8.

A total of 674 sets of twins were born in 1960. Of these, 651 sets of twins were born in which both were liveborn and 23 sets with one child listed as a fetal death.

In addition to these, seven sets of triplets were born. In five sets of triplets all infants were liveborn, in two sets of triplets one was liveborn and two were stillborn. The county and city breakdown of multiple births is given in Table 9, page 20. Median age of mothers in 1960 was 24 years of age. The greatest number of births occurred to mothers in the 20-24 age group.

Resident illegitimate livebirths occurred at a ratio of 30.7 per 1,000 resident livebirths and occurrence illegitimate livebirths occurred at a ratio of 32.0 per 1,000 occurrence livebirths. Table 9, page 20, contains data on illegitimate livebirths by county and city of residence and occurrence.



Median weight of the males was 3,405 grams as compared to 3,282 grams for the female livebirths.

The above graph shows the weight distribution by sex. Defining immaturity as infants 2,500 grams or less at birth, there were 4,417 immature livebirths or 6.8 per cent of the total number of residence livebirths. Table 12, page 24, gives the data on immaturity by county and city.

Pages 8 through 28 contain other data on livebirths for Washington during the year 1960.

MORTALITY

General

There were 26,505 deaths of Washington residents in 1960 for a rate of 9.3 per 1,000 population. Deaths occurred in Washington at a rate of 9.4 per 1,000 population for a total of 26,699. San Juan County had the highest residence death rate with a rate of 16.4 per 1,000 population. The lowest death rate was shown by Benton County with the rate of 5.2 per 1,000 population.

The sex ratio for residence deaths in 1960 was 147.5 male deaths for every 100 female deaths. Of the males dying 53.7 per cent were married at the time of death and 17.6 per cent were widowers. Female deaths included 33.7 per cent married women and 49.4 per cent widowed. Median age of males dying was 68 and the median age at death of females was 73. The white race accounted for 96.9 per cent of the total number of deaths.

General mortality data are given in death summary Tables 15, 16, 17, 18, and 19, pages 31 through 41. Tables 20 through 30 contain more detailed data.

From the above table, it can be observed that the total (crude) death rate and age group specific death rates all declined during the past decade. While the crude death rate declined relatively little, certain of the age specific death rates declined rather markedly, particularly in the younger age groups.

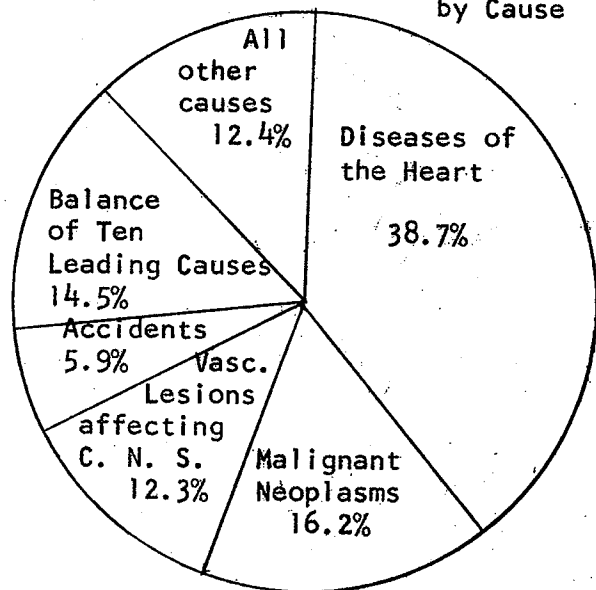
MORTALITY (Cont'd)

Selected Causes

Table 16, page 33 gives selected causes of death arranged by the cause of death code assigned according to the International Statistical Classification of Causes of Death. The death summary table also lists the ten leading causes of death according to rank. Diseases of the heart accounted for 38.7 per cent

of the total number of deaths among State Residents in 1960 with a rate of 359.6 per 100,000 population. Diseases of the heart has been the leading cause of death in Washington since 1913, except for the year 1918 when pneumonia was the leading cause of death.

Tuberculosis was a leading cause of death before 1913, but since 1952 tuberculosis has no longer ranked as one of the ten leading causes. Malignant neoplasms and vascular lesions affecting the central nervous system have been the second and third leading causes of death since the early 1920's.

The fourth leading cause "All Accidents" is the leading cause of death at ages 1 through 34. Diseases of early infancy is the leading cause

of death at age under one year. Table 19, page 39, lists the leading causes of death in each ten year age group for each sex with a percentage that each comprises of the total in each age group.

Causes of death of special interest, though not necessarily leading causes, are given by county and city with rates per 100,000 population in Table 25, pages 52 to 57.

Deaths from infective and parasitic diseases, including tuberculosis, are given in Table 29, page 66.

Accidental deaths by leading causes and by place of death are given in Table 26, page 58.

Homicides and Suicides by county and city of residence and occurrence are given in Table 28, page 64.

There were 17 maternal deaths in Washington in 1960. Data on maternal deaths are given in Table 30, pages 68 and 69.

FETAL DEATHS
(Stillbirths)

For purposes of Washington State vital statistics registration, a fetal death is defined as a delivery after at least twenty weeks of gestation in which the fetus shows no evidence of life. There are indications that a number of fetal deaths within the scope of this definition are not registered.

A total of 738 residence fetal deaths were recorded in 1960 for a ratio of 11.3 fetal deaths for each 1,000 residence livebirths. During 1960, 746 fetal deaths occurred in the State of Washington, a ratio of 11.4 per 1,000 occurrence livebirths. These ratios continue the long term downward trend. (See graph on page XII)

Among the causes of fetal death, placental and cord conditions accounted for 43.5 per cent of all residence fetal deaths. Table 32 on page 73 gives further data on residence fetal death by causes.

There were 106.2 male fetal deaths for each 100 female fetal deaths. Fetal deaths by county and city of residence and by county and city of occurrence with ratios per 1,000 livebirths are given in Tables 33 and 34 on pages 74 and 76.

INFANT DEATHS

Infant deaths (deaths of infants under one year of age) accounted for 1,528 or 5.8% of the total number of residence deaths in 1960. As can be seen in the graph on page XII, the infant mortality rate has experienced a downward trend since 1915. The 1960 residence infant death rate of 23.4 per 1,000 livebirths extends this trend, as it is the lowest rate since the 1956 rate of 23.4 per 1,000.

Of residence infant deaths in 1960, there was a ratio of 136.5 male deaths for every 100 female deaths. In 1959, this ratio was 149.2 males to every 100 females. This represents a male infant death rate for 1960 of 26.5 deaths per 1,000 male livebirths and a female infant death rate of 20.2 per 1,000 female livebirths.

In 1960, 942 or 61.6% of the infant deaths were classified in the grouping "Certain Diseases of Early Infancy". Of this group, immaturity mentioned with some other condition and immaturity unqualified accounted for 700 deaths. These 700 deaths accounted for 45.8 per cent of all infant deaths. Congenital malformations accounted for 16.4 per cent of the infant deaths followed by influenza and pneumonia which caused 10.3 per cent of the infant deaths (not including pneumonia of the newborn which is included in the category "Certain Diseases of Early Infancy". Accidents caused 4.2 per cent of the infant deaths.

Indians again showed the highest infant death rate 56.0 per 1,000 livebirths. The graph below shows infant death rates by race. Table 36, page 80, gives infant deaths by race, by county and city of residence.

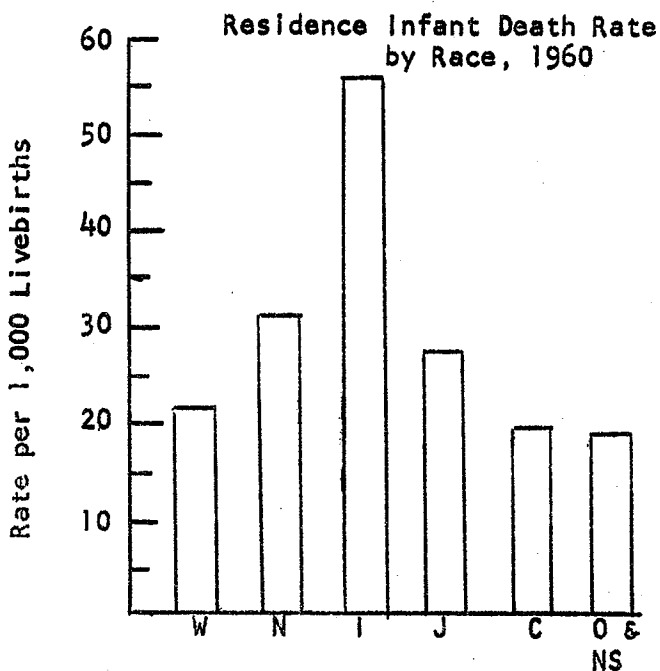


Table 37, page 82, gives a detailed breakdown of infant deaths by cause, sex, and age of infant. Table 35, page 78, lists the leading causes for the counties and major cities.

Neonatal Deaths

Neonatal deaths (infants who died before reaching the age of 28 days) accounted for 73.1% of the total resident infant deaths for 1960. Neonatal death data by county and city of residence and by county and city of occurrence are given in Tables 33 and 34, pages 74 and 76.
