1	Visit our (1) Clinic Provider Site at least 1X this calendar year to provide education and training utilization of VFC supplied vaccines and improve their participation in Child Profile.	Plan an annual immunization update for Clinic staff and promote implementation of Child Profile.	Annual VFC/AFIX site visit to our Clinic Provider was completed in August 2009. We were unable to schedule our formal vaccine Admin. Mgt. training event due to increase work loads of both the Clinic and LHJ staffs due to H1N1 activities. We had numerous opportunities to share information & updates concerning vaccines with our Clinic staff. They are now entering their own VFC vaccine records into the CP Registry System.
1	We plan to begin use of the recall reminder system of Child Profile to increase child/adolescent vaccine timeliness and administration in our LHJ.	We will request training for our LHJ staff in the use of the reminder recall system with the Child Profile Help Desk staff and/or DOH Immunization Program partners.	We had some informal training on CP reminder system from the Help Desk & began the process of cleaning up our system as a large number of individuals identified as our clients have either moved from the area or see pediatricians out of county for their immune needs.

Nutrition and childhood obesity training was provided by RD for area licensed childcare providers. Six lecture series on nutrition and wellness related topics were offered to the community in 2009. "Columbia Cares Coalition", a group comprised of community members, City, County & State Government representatives, and our Hospital Health System, as well as, LHJ staff, that focus on activity oriented issues and projects to increase overall wellness and physical activity in the County, met 5 times in 2009. Our LHJ has participated in numerous conference calls sponsored by DOH on Performance Measure #3.</p>
