1	Work with Vaccine for Children Providers (VFC) on reducing barriers to generating and maintaining timely entry of CHILD Profile data into system.	Offer clerical and other support as needed to keep database accurate and up-to-date	In 2008 successfully had all 10 Mason County VFC Providers on Child Profile. One main VFC provider has been working 2 years with DOH and CHILD Profile to get their uploads to report accurately...we had to get the data for 2008 and 2009 by hand counts....still not functioning...priority for 2010!

Due to our report, our Public Hospital Districts, BOH and Community Health Task Force have made immunization rates a community priority for 2010!
1	Increase parents knowledge and education about Pediatric Influenza.	Educate parents through outreach, health fairs, schools and media.	In 2008 focused on Pediatric Influenza at 7 community health fairs. In 2009 due to H1N1 opportunities to increase parents' knowledge on pediatric influenza was heightened. Conducted media campaign and night flu clinics with a children's community provider.
1	Increase non-English parents' knowledge about recommendations and requirements for vaccination.	Educate parents through partnering with other community partners such as Planned Parenthood, community agencies and school programs.	In 2008 worked with school liaison working with the migrant non-English speaking families to encourage vaccination. Again in 2009, as a result of H1N1, we had opportunity to focus some media attention and vaccine education on overall vaccine requirements for non-English Speaking clients.

Visit every community provider, hospital and lab for staff training on reporting notifiable conditions	Completed visits with every community provider, hospital and lab and reviewed Mason County CD notebook, did staff training in both 2008 and 2009.
2	Assure primary and back up nursing staff trained in investigating and reporting notifiable conditions.	Train all nursing staff on PHIMS and update policy and procedure manual. All staff to have updated training quarterly.	In 2008 staff worked on updating CD notebook. In 2009 Cross trained all Mason County Public Health Nurses on CD investigations, and PHIMS usage. Each nurse has a weekly day to work in CD now to maintain competency.
2	Assurance of timely reporting and contact investigation or follow-up for high risk Chlamydia reports and proper use of STD case reports.	Implement tracking system and training of clerical support and new staff. Visit all providers for staff training.	In 2008 trained a new staff coordinator in STD program due to attrition who then had to be laid off at the end of 2008 due to budget reductions. Worked with 7 providers regarding timely reporting and case reports. In 2009 Cross trained all nursing and clerical staff on Chlamydia reporting. All providers received EPT training with DOH and Mason County PH staff. Most reports are received via lab reports. Continuing to work with providers on proper use of STD case reports. Providers with high screening rates demonstrate good reporting and case report usage. All providers screened less due to H1N1 response.

Develop and implement TB Outreach program to at risk population. Update software to receive and send reports. Utilize provider and community educational opportunities to	In 2008 we developed a TB outreach program to our Spanish speaking population where 90 % of our TB cases were being found. We began doing rapid improvement cycles to determine

		increase education about HIV & STD screening.	the effectiveness of our education outreach. Due to staffing reductions at the beginning of 2009: we lost our Spanish speaking Health Education assistant, HIV coordinator and TB coordinators. We cross trained all nursing staff left in CD, TB, STD programs and implemented TB and STD PHIMS entry for reporting. We met with all providers regarding CD and included education about HIV, TB and STD screening.
