1	Promote the use and timeliness of data entry in the Child Profile Immunization Registry by local providers	<p>Increase public health capacity by .5 FTE to implement 5930 immunization strategies</p> <p>Train public health nurses on child profile and current immunization recommendations</p> <p>On-site visits with all local vaccine providers to assess current utilization of child profile and identify strategies to improve use and timeliness of data entry</p>
1	Assess the completeness/accuracy of data in Child Profile Immunization Registry in order to assess the current data for usefulness/accuracy of the recall system, and to evaluate the completeness of data for determining childhood immunization rates of Pacific County residents	<p>Conduct child profile immunization data assessment project using WIC participant. Over 60% of all children born to Pacific County residents participate in WIC.</p> <p>Determining accuracy of child profile data for WIC population will identify need for further training/support of providers to effectively use the registry, and assess the potential to utilize child profile data to assess overall immunization rates of children 12-36 months of age.</p> <p>Collect immunization records for all WIC participants with children 0-2 years of age</p> <p>Compare records with data in child profile registry</p> <p>Contact immunization providers identified by WIC participants to collect immunization records</p>

1	Determine feasibility of centralizing immunization recall at the health department	<p>Health Officer will meet with local providers to discuss public health issues and childhood immunization</p> <p>Strategize with providers ways to implement regular, ongoing recall system</p> <p>Determine feasibility of health department providing immunization recall for county providers</p>
1	Increase uptake of new and underutilized vaccines	<p>Train staff on new immunization recommendations and schedules</p> <p>Conduct at least one on-site visit with every vaccine provider in the county to assess quality of current vaccine program and provide education, TA and support for appropriate and timely administration and reporting of all vaccines</p> <p>Sponsor one day county-wide provider update conference</p> <p>Offer adolescent immunization clinics at two health department sites. Assess feasibility of conducting school-based immunization clinics</p> <p>Develop local media campaign to encourage flu vaccination for children. Assess feasibility of conducting school-based flu clinics for students in conjunction with clinics already provided for school staff.</p> <p>Provide HPV vaccine to family planning clients.</p>

2	Improve the timeliness of initiating response and entering CD reports in PHIMS	<p>Increase public health capacity by .5 FTE to implement 5930 notifiable condition strategies.</p> <p>Assign CD leads at each county site. Communicate staff roles and assigned responsibility to other staff in the department</p>
2	Improve the timeliness of completion of investigation and reports in PHIMS	Provide PHIMS training/update for staff
2	Update in-house CD database	Health Officer to update internal data base used to track notifiable conditions, including STD, TB etc that are not reported in PHIMS
2	Update CD program protocols to reflect timeliness of response and data entry in PHIMS and staff responsibilities	<p>Health Officer to update notifiable condition protocol.</p> <p>Review updated protocol and review of timely and complete case investigation at staff meeting</p>
2	Improve/Assure timeliness and completeness of provider reporting of notifiable diseases	Conduct on-site visit annually with providers to provide updated materials, reporting requirements, and after hours contact information
2	Coordinate follow up of partners for individuals tested positive for STDs at Naselle Youth Camp juvenile facility	<p>Assess current youth camp procedure for collecting information regarding partners of inmates testing positive for STD</p> <p>Assist with notifying other county CD staff of partners needing treatment identified by youth detained at local youth camp</p>
2	Provide information and referral for all clients reported with HEP C	Information packets prepared to mail to clients reported as chronic Hep C. Active case investigation of those reported as acute Hep C
