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**Performance Measure #1** – Increase the uptake of new and under-used child and adolescent vaccines; specifically focusing improvement efforts and reporting on Varicella, Rota Virus, HPV and pediatric influenza.

PM#	Objectives / Strategies	Action
1	Maintain number of staff to accomplish Blue Ribbon Local Health Funds (aka 5930) Objectives	Maintain 1 Health Educator (1 FTE) and RN (.2 FTE) dedicated to 5930.
1	Increase uptake of HPV vaccine	Approach social and faith based women's groups to determine culturally appropriate education to increase acceptance of HPV vaccine.
1	Increase number pediatric influenza vaccinations	Purchase 1000 doses of flu mist vaccine to be administered to children at WWCHD's annual Flu Shot Roundup, except with reinstatement of universal vaccine.
1	Increase number of providers using Child Profile	Facilitate development of CHILD Health Profile interface by demonstration of benefits and offers of assistance.
1	Reduce missed opportunities for vaccination	Encourage ER policy change to reduce missed opportunities for vaccination.

**Performance Measure #2** – Improve the timely, complete identification and standard, effective investigation of notifiable conditions per WAC 246-101.

**Reporting Measure**

**A:** Percent of notifiable condition cases reported to the LHJ within the required timeframe (per WAC)

**B:** Percent of notifiable condition cases reported to the LHJ where investigation was initiated within the timeframe specified in the Guidelines

**C:** Percent of notifiable condition cases reported to the LHJ with a completed investigation as indicated by completion of “essential fields”

PM#	Objectives / Strategies	Action
2	Refine the process used by WWCHD to report notifiable conditions	1. Compare lab results with receipt of disease reports to more quickly contact providers and obtain required information by telephone. 2. Utilize continuous quality improvement techniques to meet the WAC 246-101 requirements
2	Increase identification and treatment of partners to reduce spread of infection	Encourage providers who initially diagnose disease to identify and treat partners immediately.
2	Compile and track number of partners treated relative to case numbers	Conduct Chlamydia investigations.
2	Ensure that providers are kept current on notifiable conditions and reporting requirements	Take posters and 1-page instruction sheets to individual providers.
2	Increase use of PHIMS by health department CD staff	Report all STDs to the state through PHIMS.
2	Increase CD staff knowledge of emerging diseases	Allow for continuing education re: emerging diseases for communicable disease staff. This could include Epi Roadshow attendance.

**Performance Measure #3** – Develop and implement effective community and health care system interventions to address obesity and its consequent burden of chronic disease. Interventions may target worksites, schools, communities, or primary medical care.

**Reporting Measure**

**A:** Number and description of LHJ activities and interventions to address obesity or chronic disease and association risk factors in the community.

3	Increase the percentage of WW County employees reporting a health behavior improvement.	Provide monthly wellness newsletter to county employees.
3	Increase physical activity by WWCHD staff.	Introduce WWCHD staff to one exercise incentive each quarter.
3	Develop a baseline of BMI measurements for a minimum of one grade of elementary students in 3 county schools.	Weigh and measure students at 3 elementary schools at the beginning and end of school year.
3	Increase knowledge of healthy food choices by low-income populations.	1. Attend SNAP-Ed training 2. Adopt one strategy to address healthy food choices by low-income populations.
3	Raise school dietician awareness of WWCHD's interest and resources for improved nutrition of school meals.	Initiate dialogue with at least one registered dietician responsible for school meal planning.
3	Engage a coalition of diverse community members to address obesity in Walla Walla County	Implement MAPP strategy for addressing chronic disease.
