2. You can move back through the survey to change the answer to questions you have already completed by using the "<BACK" button at the bottom of the page. **DO NOT use the back arrow on your web browser as this may disconnect you from the survey.**
3. At the bottom of each page is a Progress Bar which will give you an approximate estimate of how much of the entire survey you have completed.
4. At any time you can leave this survey before completing it by clicking on the "SAVE" button at the bottom of the page. A return authorization will be emailed to you with a link to continue exactly where you left off.
