


Washington Prevention Framework

Prevention Framework Elements

VISION

This is the aspirational description of what the Partnership would like to achieve in Washington State

PRINCIPLES

These principles are underpinning of our beliefs and understandings, the truths that which shape both our reasons for doing the work, and the work itself

GOAL

When the Prevention Framework is used as intended, this is what will occur. This goal focuses on increasing the length of people's lives and ensuring that their lives are healthy and productive

MEASURES

These measures tell us how we are doing against the goal and objectives

OBJECTIVES

The specific measurable actions and results of the Prevention Framework

PRIORITY AREA

To realize this vision and achieve the goal the Partnership has identified an overarching priority with initial key focus areas

INITIAL FOCUS AREAS

These initial focus areas are key areas of concentration that efforts will be focused. Reflecting the principle of balance, there are short term and long term focus areas

STRATEGIES

These are the three key ways that we will get things done

ACTIONS

These indicate the specific actions, who will have primary accountability to carry out these actions and by when they will occur. The initial actions are those that are prioritized and in sequential order with a lens of the Public Health- Health Care Delivery System Partnership priorities and focus areas

PREVENTION ENHANCEMENT RECOMMENDATIONS

These are recommendations brought forward by the Public Health- Health Care Delivery System Partnership. These recommendations build on the Foundational Building Blocks set forth in the State Health Care Innovation Plan

STATE HEALTH CARE INNOVATION PLAN: THREE CORE STRATEGIES AND FOUNDATIONAL BUILDING BLOCKS

The Innovation Plan is built to achieve three ultimate aims: better health, better care, and lower costs. The **three broad strategies** drive progress toward these interrelated aims.

The **Foundational Building Blocks** address fundamental capabilities and supports that must be in place to realize the Innovation Plan, and for health and health care transformation to succeed on a system-wide basis. The goal of these building blocks is to enable Washington to harness and channel competition, and accelerate change at the delivery system and community level.
