Sequim massage practitioner's license suspended for 20 years on sex charges

OLYMPIA — Sexual misconduct charges have led to a 20 year suspension of the Washington license of Sequim massage practitioner Andrew Moon (MASS.MA.60238191).

The 20-year suspension completes the legal process that began after a November 2012 complaint that Moon penetrated a female patient's genitals during a massage treatment. Moon's license was immediately suspended in May pending disciplinary action. Once the 20-year suspension period has passed, Moon must meet requirements designed to protect the public and ensure patient safety before he can seek license reinstatement.
