Pasadena Park customers near Spokane Valley no longer have to boil water

OLYMPIA — A boil-water advisory for customers of Pasadena Park Irrigation District 17 issued last week was lifted today after lab results confirmed the water is safe to drink.

The water system issued the advisory on March 21 after lab tests on routine samples showed potentially harmful *E. coli* bacteria in the water.

Customers should flush faucets, fountains, ice machines, soda dispensers, or other equipment that was shut-off or unused over the past several days, until the water temperature changes.

Pasadena Park Irrigation District 17 serves more than 2,300 homes and businesses. The service area extends about two miles east and west of Argonne Road and from the north bank of the Spokane River to about one mile south of Stoneman Road.

“We thank our customers for being so understanding during this boil-water advisory and we apologize for the inconvenience,” said Bruce Davidson, water system manager at Pasadena Park Irrigation District 17. “Our number one priority is to make sure the water is safe to drink.”
