## **Sexual misconduct with a minor leads to five-year suspension for Whatcom County EMT**

**OLYMPIA** — A Whatcom County emergency medical technician’s license has been suspended for five years due to sexual misconduct.

Michael J. Sulak (ES 00129063) had sex with 15-year-old girl on at least four occasions. He admitted having sex with a minor and during an interview with law enforcement admitted knowing she was only 15 years old. The Department of Health immediately suspended Sulak’s license in April and he’s been unable to practice since that time. The five year suspension completes the agency’s action against his credential to practice as an EMT.
