Boil-water advisories end in some eastern WA areas hit by big storms

OLYMPIA — Two of six boil-water advisories issued last week after severe storms in Spokane and Pend Oreille counties are ending after power was restored and lab tests show water is safe.

Boil-water advisories that have ended in Spokane and Pend Oreille counties include:

- The 333 residents of Chattaroy Valley Mobile Estates in Chattaroy no longer have to boil their tap water. Pressure was restored and the system was disinfected. Lab results show water is safe to drink.
- Sandy Shore and Sandy Meadows water system customers in Pend Oreille County no longer have to boil their tap water. Lab tests confirm the water is safe to drink.

Four small water systems in the two counties remain on boil-water advisories and are listed on the [Recent Alerts webpage](#); anyone who lost water pressure but doesn't see their water system listed should ask the system operator. Don't assume the water is safe after losing water pressure. Private well users can contact their local health agency for information.

Whitworth Water District 2 in Spokane County withdrew its request for customers north of the Little Spokane River to conserve water. Last week, the district lost pressure to its pump after the storms and customers were asked to limit water-use.
