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Sexual misconduct charges lead to immediate suspension of King County nursing/medical assistant

OLYMPIA — The nursing assistant certified and medical assistant credentials of Karamba Ceesay (MAPC.PC60353803, NAC.NC60005975, MAR.MR60428137) have been immediately suspended on allegations of sexual misconduct.

According to charges by state health officials, Ceesay improperly performed a bladder scan ultrasound on a patient and rubbed his hand over her vagina. Charges also say he made inappropriate comments to that patient. Ceesay has been criminally charged in King County Superior Court with indecent liberties.

Ceesay has 20 days to request a hearing, and cannot practice until the charges are resolved.
