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Sexual misconduct leads to revocation of Auburn nursing assistant's license

OLYMPIA — The Secretary of Health revoked the license of Auburn nursing assistant Laszlo Molnar (NAC.NC.10081526) based on sexual misconduct.

In December 2014, Molnar's license was immediately suspended based on charges of Rape in the Second Degree by the King County Superior Court. Molnar sexually abused a resident of the adult family home that he owned and worked for. A family member of the resident alerted local law enforcement after learning of the sexual abuse. The order revoking Molnar's license completes the legal process that started with the December 2014 suspension.
