Benton County pharmacy assistant's license revoked due to sexual misconduct

OLYMPIA — State health officials permanently revoked the license of a Benton County pharmacy assistant for having sex with a woman he hypnotized.

Kevin Geyer (PHAA.VB.60140219) is an amateur hypnotist. In June 2014, he hypnotized a woman in his home before having sex with her. Geyer was criminally charged in Benton County Superior Court in September 2014 with one count of indecent liberties, a class B felony.
