## **Skamania Co pharmacist unable to safely practice – license suspended**

**OLYMPIA** — State health officials have immediately suspended the license of Skamania County pharmacist Steve Lee Pascuzzi (PHRM.PH.60051766) pending further legal action.

The Pharmacy Quality Assurance Commission charges that Pascuzzi is unable to practice with reasonable skill and safety due to a physical or mental condition.

Pascuzzi cannot practice pharmacy in Washington until these charges are resolved. He has 20 days in which to request a hearing to contest these charges.
