Boil-water advisory issued to Lakeview Park Water Association in Grant Co.

OLYMPIA — The Lakeview Park Water Association in Grant County issued a boil-water notice to its customers today, June 11, after detecting potentially harmful *E. coli* bacteria in routine water quality monitoring tests.

The advisory affects only the 400 homes and businesses that get their drinking water from the Lakeview Park Water Association. It doesn't affect neighboring Soap Lake residents.

The Department of Health is working closely with the water system to help find the source of contamination.

E. coli can cause gastrointestinal illness. To kill the bacteria, health officials recommend that residents boil tap water they'll use for drinking, brushing teeth, preparing food, making ice, and washing dishes. Water should be heated to a brisk boil for one minute and allowed to cool before use. There have been no reports of illness that could be associated with the water.
