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King County physician's license restricted on sexual misconduct charges

OLYMPIA — The license of physician Marc A. Di Julio (MD00020524) has been immediately restricted by the Medical Quality Assurance Commission due to allegations of sexual misconduct during the examination of a female patient.

Di Julio allegedly touched the patient's breast inappropriately during a formal medical exam. The commission will only let Di Julio treat female patients in the presence of a chaperone until the charges are resolved. He has 20 days to respond to the charges and request a hearing.
