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State disciplines health care providers

OLYMPIA -- The Washington State Department of Health has taken disciplinary actions or withdrawn charges against health care providers in our state.

The department's Health Systems Quality Assurance Division works with boards, commissions, and advisory committees to set licensing standards for more than 80 health care professions (e.g., medical doctors, nurses, counselors).

Information about health care providers is on the agency website. Click on "[Look up a health care provider license](#)" in the "How Do I?" section of the [Department of Health website](#) (doh.wa.gov). The site includes information about a health care provider's license status, the expiration and renewal date of their credential, disciplinary actions and copies of legal documents issued after July 1998. This information is also available by calling 360-236-4700. Consumers who think a health care provider acted unprofessionally are encouraged to call and report their complaint.

Clallam County

In April 2015 the Nursing Commission entered an agreement with registered nurse **Mindy L. Hinsdale** (RN00167145) that requires her to participate in a substance abuse monitoring program. Hinsdale worked while impaired by controlled substances and alcohol, and she didn't comply with a previous substance abuse monitoring contract.

Clark County

In October 2014 the secretary of health denied a massage practitioner credential to **Haiyan Qin** (MA60477537). On her application, Qin provided false answers about whether she'd ever been found to have violated health care laws and rules, and if she'd ever had action taken against a health care license.

In April 2015 the Licensed Social Worker Program charged licensed social worker **Patricia L. Des Rochers** (LW00005954) with unprofessional conduct. Charges say Des Rochers interviewed four children whose mother asked a court to modify a visitation agreement with the children's father. She allegedly wrote an assessment without interviewing the father, the father's partner or any other sources, and without observing the children and the father together. Charges say she also provided therapy for two of the children. Des Rochers allegedly practiced below the

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standard of care by engaging in a dual relationship and providing a recommendation to the court without having done sufficient interviews.

King County

In April 2015 the Nursing Assistant and Health Care Assistant programs amended a statement of charges against registered nursing assistant, certified nursing assistant, and health care assistant **Anthony Reginald Sims** (NA60057037, NC60327550, HC60124886, HC60192362, HC60148288) to reflect changes in the status of his credentials and to remove details of the alleged sexual contact with the patient.

In March 2015 the secretary of health denied a registered nursing assistant credential to **Ryan William McDermott** (NC60411324). While in training at a group home, McDermott made derogatory remarks about a vulnerable adult's genitals.

In April 2015 the secretary of health ended probation for chemical dependency professional trainee **Janelle Alene Wallace** (CO60269974).

In April 2015 the secretary of health ended probation for chemical dependency professional trainee **Brett Alan Johnson** (CO60435909).

In April 2015 the Nursing Commission reinstated the registered nurse credential of **Collette Marie Michaud** (RN60355332). Her license was suspended in 2013 after her Minnesota license was suspended.

In April 2015 the Nursing Commission entered an agreement with registered nurse **Angela Ann Huffman** (RN60289558) that requires her to continue participating in a substance abuse monitoring program. In 2014 Huffman was convicted of federal charges of tampering with consumer products and acquiring controlled substances by misrepresentation. Huffman forged prescriptions for controlled substances and replaced narcotic medication with saline that created a risk of patient harm.

In April 2015 the Nursing Commission placed registered nurse **Kristi D. Richardson** (RN00089469) on probation for four years. Richardson must undergo an evaluation for a substance abuse monitoring program and complete continuing education in critical thinking, managing stress, ethics, and legal issues. After being seen removing controlled substances from the assisted living facility where she worked, Richardson made inaccurate statements about the facility's policy for disposing of controlled substances.

In April 2015 the secretary of health granted a certified medical assistant credential to **Jennifer Velasquez Roman** (CM60524600) and placed her on probation for at least one year. In 2012 Roman was convicted of second-degree burglary.

Kitsap County

In April 2015 the Unlicensed Practice Program notified **Xijia Li** of its intent to issue a cease-and-desist order. Charges say Li practiced massage without having a credential.

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Pierce County

In April 2015 the secretary of health ended probation for chemical dependency professional trainee and chemical dependency professional **Michael Dean Bateman** (CO60213573, CP60344761).

In April 2015 the secretary of health ended conditions on the credential of chemical dependency professional trainee and chemical dependency professional **Jeffrey David Wilson** (CO60246245, CP60391036).

In April 2015 the Optometry Board charged optometrist **John McDowall** (OD00001911) with unprofessional conduct. McDowall allegedly didn't comply with a 2013 stipulation involving written notification to former patients about how to get their medical records.

In April 2015 the Nursing Commission entered an agreement with registered nurse **Tara L. Munford** (RN60140309) that places her license on probation for at least one year. Munford must complete supervised clinical practice in documentation, pay a \$500 fine, and write a paper about medication documentation and administration. Munford didn't comply with a 2013 stipulation put in place after she made documentation and/or medication errors.

In April 2015 the Nursing Commission reinstated the registered nurse credential of **Karen Ann Price** (RN60181825). Her license was suspended in 2014 after she didn't fully comply with an order requiring her to undergo an evaluation for a substance abuse monitoring program.

In April 2015 the Medical Commission charged physician **Cynthia M. Mosbrucker** (MD60016675) with unprofessional conduct. She allegedly practiced below the standard of care in treating her longtime domestic partner who had many serious health issues. Charges say Mosbrucker inappropriately prescribed controlled substances and her care allegedly caused patient harm and/or risk of patient harm.

Skagit County

In April 2015 the Nursing Commission ended probation for licensed practical nurse **Chris R. Davidson**, also known as Christine Ensley (LP00048042).

Snohomish County

In March 2015 the Emergency Medical Services and Trauma Systems Program entered an agreement with paramedic **Thomas Clifford Jackson II** (ES00132406) that reinstates and restricts his license. Jackson must abide by conditions imposed on his paramedic license in 2014.

Spokane County

In April 2015 the Nursing Assistant Program charged certified nursing assistant **Clinton Patrick** (NC60264107) with unprofessional conduct. Charges say an electronic benefits transfer (EBT) card belonging to a resident at the assisted living facility where Patrick worked was taken

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without permission and used to withdraw \$40 from the resident's account. A video recording allegedly shows Patrick using the card to make the transaction.

Stevens County

In April 2015 the Nursing Commission placed registered nurse **Chris M. Base** (RN00172925) on probation for at least three years. Base must pay a \$1,000 fine, write an essay about her errors and patient protection, and complete continuing education in medication administration, documentation, and nursing ethics. Base improperly distributed diabetes medication and supplies.

Thurston County

In April 2015 the Nursing Commission ended probation for registered nurse and advanced registered nurse practitioner **Jeanette Geralyn Revay** (RN00074524, AP30005089).

Out of State

Idaho: In April 2015 the Nursing Commission entered an agreement with registered nurse **Linda Ann Swenson** (RN00114206) that requires her to participate in a substance abuse monitoring program. Swenson misused controlled substances and didn't comply with a previous substance abuse monitoring contract.

North Dakota: In April 2015 the Nursing Commission reinstated the registered nurse credential of **Shawn Edward Jacob** (RN00122949), whose license was suspended in 2009 after his North Dakota license was suspended.

Oregon: In April 2015 the Unlicensed Practice Program notified **Hyoun Mi Crowley** of its intent to issue a cease-and-desist order. Charges say Crowley, who doesn't have a massage practitioner credential, admitted practicing massage without a license.

Note to Editors: Health care providers charged with unprofessional conduct have 20 days to respond to the Department of Health in writing. The case then enters the settlement process. If no disciplinary agreement can be reached, the case will go to a hearing.
