Stevens County massage therapist's license suspended for sexual contact

OLYMPIA -- The state Department of Health has suspended the license of Stevens County massage therapist, Gregory Dean Pritchett (MASS.MA.60208918).

In September of 2015, Pritchett was charged with unprofessional conduct and he has failed to respond to charges. The suspension of Pritchett's license completes the legal process.

In April 2015, during a massage treatment, Pritchett had inappropriate sexual contact with a female client. Pritchett cannot practice in Washington or seek reinstatement of his credential for at least 15 years.
