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State disciplines health care providers

OLYMPIA -- The Washington State Department of Health has taken disciplinary actions or withdrawn charges against health care providers in our state.

The department's Health Systems Quality Assurance Division works with boards, commissions, and advisory committees to set licensing standards for more than 80 health care professions (e.g., medical doctors, nurses, counselors).

Information about health care providers is on the agency website. Click on "[Look up a health care provider license](#)" in the "How Do I?" section of the [Department of Health website](#) (doh.wa.gov). The site includes information about a health care provider's license status, the expiration and renewal date of their credential, disciplinary actions and copies of legal documents issued after July 1998. This information is also available by calling 360-236-4700. Consumers who think a health care provider acted unprofessionally are encouraged to call and report their complaint.

Benton County

In August 2015 the secretary of health conditionally granted a chemical dependency professional trainee credential to **Scott C. Lehmann** (CO60576282), placed him on probation and ordered him to undergo an evaluation for a substance abuse monitoring program. Lehmann pleaded guilty to or was convicted of five gross misdemeanors between 2009 and 2013.

Clallam County

In August 2015 the Unlicensed Practice Program notified **Guosheng Li** of its intent to issue a cease-and-desist order. Li allegedly offered to perform foot massage without a license.

Clark County

In August 2015 the secretary of health conditionally granted a chemical dependency professional trainee credential to **Christopher L. Standridge** (CO60560032) and placed him on probation. He was ordered to undergo an evaluation for a substance abuse monitoring program. Standridge was convicted of 12 gross misdemeanors and one misdemeanor between 2009 and 2013.

In August 2015 the Massage Program charged massage practitioner **Zhengang Qi**

(MA60225808) with unprofessional conduct. Qi allegedly offered to let an unlicensed person provide massage at a business he operates.

In July 2015 the secretary of health ordered **Ying Liu** to cease and desist from the practice of massage, and pay a \$1,000 fine. Liu, who doesn't have a massage practitioner license, provided massage treatment to a client.

In July 2015 the secretary of health ordered **Jingli Liang** to cease and desist from the practice of massage, and pay a \$1,000 fine. Liang doesn't have a massage practitioner license, but provided massage treatment to clients.

In August 2015 the Nursing Assistant Program charged certified nursing assistant **Myra M. Coffield** (NC10088272) with unprofessional conduct. In 2015 Coffield pleaded guilty in Oregon to three counts of identity theft, which were among nine charges she faced.

Island County

In August 2015 the Massage Program charged massage practitioner **Celena Marie Rojas** (MA00019663) with unprofessional conduct. In 2014 Rojas applied to activate her expired license. She was convicted of six gross misdemeanors between 2004 and 2013.

King County

In August 2015 the Unlicensed Practice Program notified **Lili Zhou** of its intent to issue a cease-and-desist order. Zhou allegedly operates a business where people without licenses provided massage.

In August 2015 the Unlicensed Practice Program notified **Jim Jorgensen** of its intent to issue a cease-and-desist order. Jorgensen allegedly offered his services as a veterinary technician despite having no license.

In August 2015 the Marriage and Family Therapist Program amended charges against marriage and family therapist **Terri A. McLennan** (LF00002144) adding details about a divorce case involving clients of McLennan's.

In August 2015 the Massage Program charged massage practitioner **Lucy Ryman** (MA60162371) with unprofessional conduct. Ryman allegedly submitted false information when she applied for a license.

In August 2015 the Unlicensed Practice Program notified **Shinkyu "Tony" Kim** of its intent to issue a cease-and-desist order. Kim allegedly doesn't have a massage practitioner license, and inappropriately touched two patients while providing massages. In 2015 Kim was charged with indecent liberties.

In August 2015 the secretary of health denied a home care aide credential to **Mai Thi Bach Nguyen** (HM60441337). In 2015 Nguyen was charged with three counts of threat to bomb or injure property in connection with bomb and shooting threats against a university and a hospital.

Kitsap County

In August 2015 the Licensed Mental Health Counselor Program charged licensed mental health counselor **William S. Mattila** (LH00004316) with unprofessional conduct. Charges say Mattila had a sexual relationship with a client, and also treated the client's spouse and daughter. He allegedly didn't keep required records for his treatment of the three clients.

Pierce County

In August 2015 the Massage Program modified an agreement with massage practitioner **Edward Kim** (MA00013024). The agreement grants Kim's application to reactivate his credential, places him on probation for at least five years, and imposes additional conditions on his credential during the probationary period. Kim's license was revoked in October 2008 after he pleaded guilty to sex offense in August 2008.

In July 2015 the secretary of health ordered **Chae McCartney** to cease and desist from the practice of massage, and pay a \$1,000 fine. McCartney admitted providing massage treatment without a license.

Skagit County

In August 2015 the Massage Program entered an agreement with massage practitioner **Ross A. Scott** (MA00010569) that fines him \$500. Scott didn't meet continuing education requirements.

Spokane County

In August 2015 the Chemical Dependency Professional Program charged chemical dependency professional **Brian Timothy Mizoguchi** (CP60145164) with unprofessional conduct. Mizoguchi allegedly didn't comply with a substance abuse monitoring contract by using methamphetamine.

Thurston County

In August 2015 the Unlicensed Practice Program notified **Amy Cheng Chiu** of its intent to issue a cease-and-desist order. Chiu allegedly admitted providing massage without a license.

In August 2015 the Massage and Medical Assistant programs charged massage practitioner, certified medical assistant and medical assistant-phlebotomist **Courtney Dawn Carter** (MA60152353, CM60380068, PC60380061) with unprofessional conduct. Carter allegedly began a romantic relationship with, and then married, a client.

In August 2015 the Pharmacy Commission charged pharmacy assistant **Craig A. Herman** (VB00072638) with unprofessional conduct. He allegedly didn't respond to a Department of Health investigator's inquiry involving narcotics at his workplace.

Walla Walla County

In August 2015 the Nursing Assistant Program charged certified nursing assistant **Kayla Irene Corn** (NC60026824) with unprofessional conduct. Charges say Corn's co-workers noticed her slurring speech and acting erratically while working at a nursing home. She was later found unconscious in the driver's seat of her car. Corn allegedly admitted taking controlled substances, and tested positive for controlled substances.

Yakima County

In August 2015 the Nursing Commission charged registered nurse **Al Bjorn Casquejo Dizon** (RN60287770) with unprofessional conduct. Dizon allegedly admitted using methamphetamine.

In August 2015 the Unlicensed Practice Program entered an agreement with **Hongtao Mu** that requires Mu to cease and desist from the practice of massage, and pay \$250 of a \$1,000 fine. The remainder of the fine is suspended provided Mu complies with the agreement. Mu doesn't have a massage practitioner license, but operated a business that advertised massage and where an unlicensed employee performed massage.

Out of State

Oregon: In August 2015 the Nursing Commission charged registered nurse **Meghan K. Bruns** (RN60046506) with unprofessional conduct. Her Oregon nursing license was placed on probation in 2014.

Note to Editors: Health care providers charged with unprofessional conduct have 20 days to respond to the Department of Health in writing. The case then enters the settlement process. If no disciplinary agreement can be reached, the case will go to a hearing.
