## **King Co. nursing assistant suspended on allegations of attempted sex with a minor**

**OLYMPIA** -- State health officials have immediately suspended the credential of King County nursing assistant James Kimani Kinyanjui (NA60596192) pending further legal proceedings.

Kinyanjui has been charged with attempted commercial sexual abuse of a minor in King County Superior Court. Kinyanjui cannot practice in Washington until the charges are resolved. He has 20 days to respond to the charges and ask for a hearing.
