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Thurston Co. nursing assistant suspended on charges of sexual contact with a patient

OLYMPIA -- The Washington State Department of Health has suspended the nursing assistant credential of Stefani Martin (NAC.NC.60538495) pending further proceedings. Martin allegedly had sexual contact with a teenage patient.

Martin faces charges of third-degree rape of a child, third-degree child molestation, and furnishing liquor to a minor, a gross misdemeanor in Thurston County Superior Court.

Martin cannot practice in Washington until the charges are resolved. Martin may ask for a hearing to contest the charges.
