EX PARTE ORDER OF
SUMMARY SUSPENSION

This matter came before the Medical Quality Assurance Commission (Commission) on December 30, 2015, on an Ex Parte Motion for Summary Action (Ex Parte Motion) brought by the Office of the Attorney General. The Commission issued a Statement of Charges alleging Respondent violated RCW 18.130.180(5). After reviewing the Statement of Charges, Ex Parte Motion, and supporting evidence, the Commission GRANTS the Ex Parte Motion. Respondent's license to practice as a physician and surgeon is SUSPENDED pending further action.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

1.1 On January 4, 2006, the state of Washington issued Respondent a license to practice as a physician and surgeon. Respondent's license expired on July 31, 2014.

1.2 The Commission issued a Statement of Charges alleging Respondent violated RCW 18.130.180(5). The Statement of Charges was accompanied by all other documents required by WAC 246-11-250.

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1.3 As set forth in the allegations in the Statement of Charges, as well as in the Ex Parte Motion, the California Board of Medicine entered a Decision on Petition for Interim Suspension Order in Case No. 09-2012-228395 on August 18, 2015 (California Order). The California Order suspended Respondent's license pending a full hearing on the merits regarding whether Respondent has a health condition that renders him unable to practice medicine safely.

1.4 Evidence considered by the California Board included a report and declaration prepared by a physician who examined Respondent and concluded that Respondent suffers from an illness affecting his ability to safely practice medicine and poses an imminent threat to patient safety. The California Board concluded that permitting Respondent to continue to engage in the unrestricted practice of medicine presented an immediate danger, and that suspension of Respondent's license was the only measure that would protect the public health, safety, and welfare.

1.5 The above allegations, supported by the Declaration of Lawrence J. Berg, Staff Attorney, in Support of Motion for Summary Action, together with the attached exhibits, justify the determination of immediate danger in this case and a decision to immediately suspend the credential until a hearing on the matter is held.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

2.1 The Commission has jurisdiction over Respondent's credential to practice as a physician. RCW 18.130.040.

2.2 The Commission has authority to take emergency adjudicative action to address an immediate danger to the public health, safety, or welfare. RCW 34.05.422(4); RCW 34.05.479; RCW 18.130.050(8); and WAC 246-11-300.

2.3 The Findings of Fact establish the existence of an immediate danger to the public health, safety, or welfare if Respondent has an unrestricted credential. The Findings of Fact establish that the requested summary action is necessary and adequately addresses the danger to the public health, safety, or welfare.

III. ORDER

3.1 Based on the Findings of Fact and the Conclusions of Law, it is ORDERED that Respondent's license to practice as a physician and surgeon is SUMMARILY SUSPENDED pending further disciplinary proceedings by the Commission. Respondent shall immediately deliver all licenses (including wall, display, and/or wallet, if any) to the Commission.

3.2 It is HEREBY ORDERED that a protective order in this case is GRANTED. RCW 34.05.446(1) and WAC 246-11-400(2) and (5). This Protective Order prohibits the release of health care information outside of these proceedings. Unless required by law, anyone involved in these proceedings must keep confidential and not disclose health care information obtained through these proceedings. Health care information includes information in any form "that identifies or can readily be associated with the

identity of a patient and directly relates to the patient's health care."

RCW 70.02.010(16). The parties may share the information with their attorney, if any.
