

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INTRODUCTION

This report presents vital statistics data in narrative, graphic and tabular form for use in public health, demographic and related fields. The report includes data on livebirths, deaths, fetal deaths (stillbirths), marriages and divorces, for the calendar year 1967 and the estimated population for the State of Washington as of April 1, 1967. Most data are reported for the state as a whole, each county and each city of 10,000 population or more.

Vital statistics data included in this report are identified either as residence data or occurrence data. Residence data refer to vital events involving residents of the area regardless of where the vital events actually occurred. Occurrence data refer to vital events actually occurring in the area regardless of the place of residence of the person or persons involved. In general, data presented on a residence basis are more useful.

Certain additional data including data for cities of 2,500 to 10,000 population in 1960 are available in unpublished form in the files of the Public Health Statistics Section.

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
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
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
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
BIRTH AND DEATH RATES 1915 - 1967






BIRTHS AND DEATHS 1915 - 1967






MATERNAL DEATH RATES* 1915 - 1967




* Each point is the average of a five year period, centered on the plotted year.

INFANT AND FETAL DEATH RATES 1915 - 1967






The number of livebirths occurring in Washington in 1967 was 54,724 with 54,875 births to Washington residents. The resident birth rate for 1967 is 17.1, the second lowest since the 1941 rate of 17.0.

Table 2 lists the number of births from 1915 through 1967 with rates per 1,000 population. These data are presented graphically on pages IX and XI. From these figures it can be observed that, generally speaking, there have been four distinct periods: The first - with a generally declining birth rate to a low rate in 1933 of 12.9 per 1,000 population. The second - with a rapidly rising rate culminating in the fluctuating period after World War II with a high rate in 1947 of 26.4. The third period - with a relatively stable but high rate of approximately 24 per 1,000 which changed in 1957 or 1958 into the fourth period - with steadily declining rates evidenced through 1966.

The county showing the highest resident birth rate for 1967 was Island with 24.8 per 1,000 population. The county showing the lowest resident birth rate was San Juan with 8.9 per 1,000 population. Residence and occurrence births for 1967 with rates per 1,000 population are given in Table 4 on page 10 of this summary.


Of the total residence livebirths, 93.5 percent were classified as White, with 3.0 percent as Negro, 1.8 percent as Indian and the balance as Oriental or Other. County data by race are given in Table 5, page 12.

Of the livebirths by occurrence, 99.5 percent were born in hospitals or maternity homes. Occurrence data by type of institution of birth, are given in Table 7, page 16. The sex ratio of residence livebirths was 105 males per every 100 females.



In regard to the order of birth, more livebirths were the first child of the family than the second or third. Of the residence livebirths, 38.2% were the first child in the family, 26.8% the second child and 15.6% the third child born to the family. The order of livebirth to mother is illustrated in the Figure on the left and is presented in tabulated form in the birth summary table on page 8.

A total of 537 sets of twins were born in 1967. Of these, 521 sets of twins were born in which both were liveborn and 16 sets with one child listed as a fetal death. In addition to these, 7 sets of triplets were born. In 5 sets all three were liveborn. The county and city breakdown of multiple births is given in Table 9, page 20.



The distribution of age of mothers is illustrated in the figure to the left and is given in Table 6 on page 14. The median age of mothers in 1967 was 24.0 years.

There were 4,094 resident illegitimate livebirths during 1967. This is a ratio of 74.6 per 1,000 resident livebirths. The number of illegitimate livebirths occurring in 1967 was 4,162, for a ratio of 76.1 per 1,000 occurrence livebirths. Each of these rates have increased approximately 4 illegitimate livebirths per 1,000 births from the comparable 1966 ratios. The median age of mothers of illegitimate children born in 1967 is 20.2 years. Table 9, page 20, contains data on illegitimate livebirths by county and city of residence and occurrence.



The figure at the left gives the weight distribution, in grams of residence livebirths. There were 3,666 immature residence livebirths in 1967. (Immaturity is defined as 2,500 grams or less at birth). This is 6.7 percent of the total residence livebirths. The median weight of males was 3,384 grams, compared to 3,269 grams for female livebirths. Table 12, page 24, gives the data on immaturity by county and city.

Pages 8 through 28 contain other data on livebirths for Washington during the year 1967.

MORTALITY

General

There were 29,302 deaths of Washington residents in 1967 for a rate of 9.1 per 1,000 estimated population. Deaths occurred in Washington at a rate of 9.2 per 1,000 estimated population with a total number of deaths occurring of 29,603. Wahkiakum County had the highest residence death rate with a rate of 14.1 per 1,000 population. The lowest death rate was shown by Benton County with a rate of 5.7 per 1,000 population.

The sex ratio for residence deaths in 1967 was 137.1 male deaths for every 100 female deaths. Of the male deaths, 56.3 percent were married at the time of death and only 17.6 were widowers. Female deaths included 33.4 percent married women and 51.4 percent widowed. Median age of males dying was 69 and the median age at death of females was 75. The white race accounted for 96.7 percent of the total number of deaths.

General mortality data are given in death summary Tables 15, 16, 17, 18, and 19, pages 31 through 41 and Tables 20 through 30 contain more detailed data.

Selected Causes


Table 16, page 33 gives selected causes of death arranged according to the cause of death code as determined by the International Statistical Classification of Causes of Death. The death summary table also lists the ten leading causes of death according to rank.

Diseases of the heart accounted for 38.6 percent of the total number of deaths of the State residents in 1967 with a rate of 353.4 per 100,000 population. Diseases of the heart has been the leading cause of death in Washington since 1913 with the exception of pneumonia in 1918.

Tuberculosis was a leading cause of death before 1913, but since 1952 tuberculosis no longer ranked as one of the ten leading causes. Malignant neoplasms and vascular lesions affecting the central nervous system have been the second and third leading causes of death since the early 1920's.

Deaths from Emphysema have greatly increased over the last ten years until Emphysema now ranks as the tenth leading cause of death.

The fourth leading cause "All Accidents" was the leading cause of death at ages 1 through 34, accounting for 50.9 percent of all deaths to that age group. Diseases of early infancy were the leading cause of death at age under 1 year, accounting for 59.4 percent of all infant deaths.

Table 19, page 39 lists the leading causes of death in each five year age group for each sex with a percentage that each comprises of the total in each age group.

Causes of death of special interest, though not necessarily leading causes, are given by county and city with rates per 100,000 population in Table 25, pages 52 to 57.

Deaths from infective and parasitic diseases, including tuberculosis, are given in Table 29, page 66.

Accidental deaths by leading causes, and by place of accident are given in Table 26, page 58.

Homicides and Suicides by county and city of residence and occurrence are given in Table 28, page 64.

There were 12 maternal deaths in Washington in 1967. Data on maternal deaths are given in Table 30, pages 68 and 69.

FETAL DEATHS

For purposes of Washington State vital statistics registration, a fetal death is defined as a delivery after at least twenty weeks of gestation in which the fetus shows no evidence of life. There are indications that a number of fetal deaths within the scope of this definition are not registered.

A total of 573 residence fetal deaths were recorded in 1967 for a ratio of 10.4 fetal deaths for each 1,000 residence livebirths. During 1967, 580 fetal deaths occurred in the State of Washington, a ratio of 10.6 per 1,000 occurrence livebirths. These ratios continue the long term downward trend. (See graph on page XV.)

Among the causes of fetal death, placental and cord conditions accounted for 39.1 percent of all residence fetal deaths. Table 32 on page 73 gives further data on residence fetal death by causes.

There were 113.5 male fetal deaths for each 100 female fetal deaths. Fetal deaths by county and city of residence and by county and city of occurrence with ratios per 1,000 livebirths are given in Tables 33 and 34 on pages 74 and 76.

INFANT DEATHS

Infant deaths (deaths of infants under one year of age) amounted to 1,050 or 3.6% of the total number of residence deaths in 1967. As can be seen on the graph on page XV, the infant mortality rate has experienced a downward trend since 1915. The 1967 residence infant death rate of 19.1 per 1,000 livebirths continues this trend.

Of residence infant deaths in 1967, there was a ratio of 140.8 male deaths for every 100 female deaths. This represents a male infant death rate for 1967 of 21.8 deaths per 1,000 male livebirths and a female infant death rate of 16.3 per 1,000 female livebirths.

In 1967, 624 or 59.4% of the infant deaths were classified in the grouping "Certain Diseases of Early Infancy". Of this group, immaturity mentioned with some other condition and immaturity unqualified accounted for 454 deaths. These 454 deaths accounted for 43.2 percent of all infant deaths. Congenital malformations accounted for 15.4 percent of the infant deaths followed by influenza and pneumonia which caused 6.5 percent of the infant deaths (not including pneumonia of the newborn which is included in the category "Certain Diseases of Early Infancy"). Accidents caused 2.5 percent of the infant deaths.

Indians again showed the highest infant death rate, 52.7 per 1,000 livebirths. This compares with a rate of 19.1 per 1,000 livebirths for all races combined. The graph below shows infant death rates by race. Table 36, page 80, gives infant deaths by race, by county and city of residence.




Table 37, page 82, gives a detailed breakdown of infant deaths by cause, sex, and age of infant. Table 35, page 78, lists the leading causes for the counties and major cities.

Neonatal Deaths

Neonatal deaths (infants who died before reaching the age of 28 days) accounted for 70.4% of the total resident infant deaths for 1967. Neonatal death data by county and city of occurrence are given in Tables 33 and 34, pages 74 and 76.
