


2011 Partnership Structure

2010 PUBLIC HEALTH ACTIVITIES & SERVICES INVENTORY

- 3rd annual inventory
- 2010 inventory similar to 2009 with a few additions for data already collected
- 2010 Public Health Activities and Services Inventory survey will open for data collection late June 2011
- Results will be available online in September 2011

EXAMPLES OF DATA FROM 2009 SURVEY

- Protected children from preventable disease: Managed state-provided vaccine system involving 2,914,150 doses
- Delivered targeted nutrition education and healthy foods to 325,638 WIC clients statewide
- Administered 164,911 doses of H1N1 flu vaccine
- Licensed 334,067 health care professionals statewide
- Regulated 93 hospitals statewide
- Protected people from foodborne illness: 64,134 inspections of 48,138 establishments statewide

NEW COLLECTION TOOL & INTERACTIVE DATA MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

- Developed by DOH under workgroup's guidance
- Tested in March
- iLinc training on new data collection tool 6/15
- Interactive system will allow for data query (like CHAT)
- All 3 yrs of data - 2008, 2009 and 2010

2010-2011 PUBLIC HEALTH STANDARDS REVIEW

- In 2010 DOH was reviewed
- In 2011 34 LHJs were reviewed
 - 10 chose PHAB set
 - 4 chose Washington set
 - 20 chose the Basic set
- By mid-June 2011 all sites will receive their individual reports
- Washington Public Health Standards Review Report 2011 and the Exemplary Practices will be available online at the end of July 2011

EVALUATION OF 2010-2011 PUBLIC HEALTH STANDARDS REVIEW

- NWCPHP survey to evaluate LHJ standards review process
 - 107 responses from 170 (63%)
 - Survey covers:
 - Preparation Time
 - Reasons for choosing review type
 - Barriers
 - Process and tools
- NWCPHP survey to evaluate reviewers (4 DOH, 2 Consultants)
- Results reported to the Public Health Standards Workgroup in June 2011

COMMUNITY/STATE HEALTH IMPROVEMENT PLAN

- MLC project funded by Robert Wood Johnson Foundation
- Learning collaborative participants:
 - Grays Harbor
 - Kitsap
 - Walla Walla
 - DOH
- Teams met regularly for 9 months to share progress and receive technical training
- June 2 all teams shared their progress at a statewide online learning session

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
2011 PUBLIC HEALTH INDICATORS UPDATE

- 3RD update cycle (Baseline in 2007, updates in 2009 and 2011)
- 2010 survey showed the indicator data used extensively
 - To identify or confirm a health issues
 - For planning purposes
 - For community education
- Workgroup reviewed existing indicators and added:
 - Air quality
 - Falls among the elderly
 - Percent in poverty
 - Youth suicide/depression (will be developed if time allows)
- Solid waste indicator was dropped due to lack of data

Public Health Indicators

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NEW INTERACTIVE WEBSITE

- Developed by DOH under workgroup's guidance
- Plan to begin rolling out the third cycle of data in September (data will be published as it is available)
- Presentation will be consistent with current website's look and feel
- User experience will be enhanced by being able to query the data for a specific indicator by local health agency over time


