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High Impact HIV Prevention

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CORE ELEMENTS

- Better match resources to the geographic burden of HIV
- Focus on populations at greatest risk
- Use proven HIV prevention interventions/strategies and policies
 - HIV testing
 - Comprehensive prevention with positives (L2C, behavioral interventions, PMTCT, referral to other medical and social services)
 - Condom distribution
 - Evidence-based interventions for high-risk populations (ILI, GLI, CLI, SSPs)
 - Social marketing, media and mobilization
 - PrEP and nPEP
 - Policy change initiatives
- Maximize limited HIV prevention resources

COMPONENTS OF HIGH-IMPACT PREVENTION

- **Effectiveness and cost**
 - Which intervention combinations are most cost-effective at reducing new infections?
- **Feasibility of full-scale implementation**
 - Which interventions can be brought to large scale at a reasonable cost?
- **Coverage in the target population**
 - How many people can be reached when the intervention is fully implemented?
- **Interaction and targeting**
 - How do different interventions interact?
 - How can interventions be effectively combined?
- **Prioritization**
 - Which combined approaches have the greatest potential impact on HIV infections?

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
