# UPDATES - STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

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## COMMUNICABLE DISEASE AND OTHER HEALTH THREATS

- Increase immunization rates
- Standardize and prioritize communicable disease surveillance and response activities
- Develop, maintain and integrate a data collection system for communicable disease tracking, monitoring and response

# UPDATES - STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

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## HEALTHY COMMUNITIES AND ENVIRONMENTS

- Implement policy, environmental, and system changes that give all babies a planned, healthy start in life
- Implement policy, environmental, and system changes that prevent or reduce the impact of Adverse Childhood Experiences, such as abuse and neglect, on children and families
- Implement policy, environmental, and system changes that help adults make healthy choices for themselves and their families

# UPDATES - STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

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## PUBLIC HEALTH PARTNERING WITH HEALTH CARE

- Identify new population based metrics to measure access to care
- Identify ways the public health system and the primary care delivery system can collaboratively promote clinical preventive services and patient-centered health homes
- Identify and apply public health approaches to preventing substance abuse and mental health disorders
- Share timely information about health reform with our many local partners, including local health leaders

# UPDATES

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## PERFORMANCE AND ACCOUNTABILITY

- Evaluate the current performance management systems to determine whether we have the right ones in place to measure the results of our work
- Identify the performance management systems that are needed to measure the performance of Partnership initiatives
- Maintain and improve the performance management systems
- Advise the Partnership on priorities, goals and measures for the State Health Improvement Plan

# WORK SESSIONS

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## FOUNDATIONAL PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES

- The work described will assume the existing public health structure (35 local health agencies and DOH). Is that a reasonable approach?
- Are these the right elements of the work, right focus, level and scope, sequence?
- Should the following topics be addressed and if so, by whom, how and when?
  - ▣ System governance structure
  - ▣ Accountability
  - ▣ Chart of Accounts
  - ▣ Engaging the political process
- Are there other policy issues that need to be addressed?

# WORK SESSIONS

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## PUBLIC HEALTH STANDARDS

- Does Washington need to duplicate accreditation process similar to PHAB?
- How do we offset the review costs to local health agencies and how to increase capacity at the Department of Health to conduct the reviews?
- How to develop incentives for all local health agencies to participate in a PHAB or a *Foundational Performance Set* review?
- How to provide a system wide look considering proposed sets are very different and PHAB results are confidential?
- Since standards are legislatively mandated via PHIP, do we need to perform periodic system wide reviews in some other way?


