RCW 70.58.230 states in part: "It shall be unlawful for any person to inter, deposit in a vault, grave, or tomb, cremate or otherwise dispose of, or disinter or remove from one registration district to another, or hold for more than three business days, the human remains of any person whose death occurred in this state or any human remains which shall be found in the state, without obtaining, from the local registrar of the district in which the death occurred, or, in which the human remains were found, a permit for the burial, disinterment or removal of the human remains...."

\*When the body is to be shipped by common carrier, a Burial Transit Permit must be secured from the local registrar\*
