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Dear Department of Health/Office of Public Instruction:

Your conclusion that "Wi-Fi is unlikely to pose a health risk" is based upon a suppression of evidence, and a dilution of the evidence with biased and obsolete reports. This conclusion is also in DIRECT OPPOSITION to the most recent findings of international health organizations (WHO; 2013 French report, 2013 BCCDC and 2009 U.S. DHHS reports).

I have personal experience with the health effects of Wi-Fi radiation. It consistently makes me tremble over my whole body. When I move a significant distance away from the router, these symptoms eventually subside. Hundreds of thousands of people around the world are reporting adverse symptoms from this low level radiation. In my small community I personally know numerous people who suffer from exposure to Wi-Fi, cell towers, cell phones, microwave ovens, and compact fluorescent lightbulbs, all a source of pulsed, high frequency radiation, something that has not existed on this earth before we introduced it.

It is very foolish to ignore the research that finds health effects from even low level radiation, and the concerns of a large number of citizens. Please, please don't experiment with our children. Be cautious with our future. Look more closely at the research, and reconsider your conclusion.
