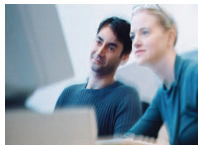


HIV Case Management

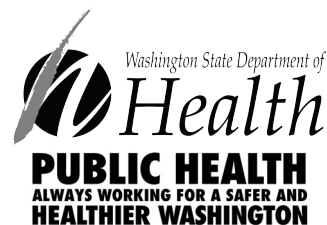

The Mission of HIV Client Services
To reduce the transmission and medical consequences of HIV by assuring that persons with HIV in Washington have access to health care and supportive services.



What does EIP pay for?

Prescription Medications

EIP pays for HIV-related medications listed on our formulary to maintain your health.



Medical Care

EIP pays for HIV-related office visits and lab tests listed on our Schedule of Covered Medical Services to monitor your health and design a treatment plan. You must go to an EIP-contracted provider.

Dental Care*

EIP pays for limited dental services listed on our Schedule of Covered Dental Services. You must not have other dental coverage and you must go to an EIP-contracted dental provider. The maximum coverage amount is \$2,500 per calendar year.

Health Insurance Premiums

EIP covers specific procedures related to HIV, but it is not insurance. We can help you get comprehensive health insurance and pay the premiums. We can also pay for:

- Medicare Part D plans
- COBRA
- Basic Health Plans
- Healthcare for Workers with Disabilities (HWD)
- Employer-sponsored insurance

Insurance Deductible

If you have insurance, EIP can help you meet up to \$1000 towards your annual deductible.

Coordination of Services

If you have Medicaid, including spenddown, EIP can assist in coordinating your healthcare coverage.

EIP Eligibility Requirements

You must:

- Be HIV +
- Live in Washington State
- Have family income at or below 300% Federal Poverty Level (FPL) (up to 370% FPL if eligible for EIP before 9/1/2002)
- Have family resources of \$10,000 or less (not counting your home, one automobile per licensed driver and some retirement funds)

How do you apply?

How do you apply for EIP?

- Complete an application
- Attach the required documentation
- Send it to us

If you need assistance, your case manager can help you.



Where can you get an application?

- Case management agency
- Local health department
- Local AIDS service organization
- EIP - call our office or go online (EIP contact information on reverse)

Will you have to pay anything*?

Depending on your family income and insurance status, you may have to pay a monthly cost share for EIP formulary prescriptions.

*Clients with insurance may have to pay coinsurance or co-pays for office visits or lab work.

Will you have to apply for other programs or benefits?

Depending on your family income, you may have to apply for:

- DSHS Medicaid coverage
- Medicare Part D
- Extra help/low income subsidy with Social Security Administration
