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The City of Tacoma is developing plans to restore portions of a historic trail as part of a citywide non-motorized transportation network. The 6.5 mile trail will link South Tacoma with the downtown Tacoma Dome District. Phase I of the Water Ditch Trail project includes a three mile segment between S. 54th St and S. 72nd St. Subsequent phases will extend the trail to S. 41st St. and S 80th St. The Water Ditch Trail is one "spine" of a larger citywide non-motorized system that includes the newly opened Scott Pierson Trail.

This Active Community Environments workshop represents a partnership between the City of Tacoma, Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department, and Washington State Department of Health. Its purpose is to inform the public about plans and development of the Water Ditch Trail project. Participants of the workshop are encouraged to provide input on trail design, safety, connectivity, and stewardship. *The public input gathered here will help guide future design, funding, and construction of the Water Ditch Trail.* Attendees are encouraged to participate in the entire two-hour workshop.
