Our Mission

The mission of HIV Client Services is to suppress viral load by ensuring access to quality services for people living with HIV in Washington State.

Our Vision

To end HIV by preventing new infections in Washington State.

What does EIP pay for?

Prescription Medications

EIP pays for HIV-related medications listed on our formulary to maintain your health.



Medical Care

EIP pays for HIV-related office visits and lab tests on our Covered Medical Services list to monitor your health and design a treatment plan. You must go to an EIP contracted provider.

Dental Care

EIP pays for limited dental services on our Covered Dental Services list. You must go to an EIP contracted dental provider. The maximum coverage amount is \$3,000 per calendar year.



Insurance Deductible

EIP can assist with meeting your insurance deductible for services that are on our Covered Medical Services list through an EIP contracted provider.



Health Insurance Premiums

EIP covers specific procedures related to HIV, but it is not insurance. We can help you get comprehensive health insurance and pay the premiums.

Evergreen Health Insurance Program (EHIP) is our contracted Insurance Benefit Manager. Plans we pay for include:

- Medicare Part D and Medicare Advantage (MAPD) plans
- Healthcare for Workers with Disabilities (HWD)
- Employer-sponsored insurance
- Qualified Health Plans in the Exchange
- Individual Plans

EIP Eligibility Requirements

You must:

- Be HIV +
 - Live in Washington State
 - Have family** income at or below 400% Federal Poverty Level (FPL)
- **Family Includes: Legally Married Spouse or Registered Domestic Partner and/or dependent children age 18 and younger.

How do I apply?

How do you apply for EIP?

- Complete an application
 - Attach all required documentation
 - Send it to us by fax or mail
- If you need assistance, your HIV Medical Case Manager can help you.

- Case management agency
- Local health department
- Local AIDS service organization

Will you have to pay anything?

Depending on your family income and insurance status, you may have to pay a monthly cost share for EIP formulary prescriptions.

Will you have to apply for other programs or benefits?

Depending on your family income, you may have to apply for:

- Health Insurance
- Expanded Medicaid
- Medicare Part D
