Food Prescriptions p. 1 - 6	<ul> <li>Policy:</li> <li>Added the following qualifying medical diagnosis to # 2:         <ul> <li>Underweight or At Risk of Underweight (Child category only).</li> <li>Pre-pregnancy BMI &lt; 18.5 for current pregnancy.</li> <li>Low Weight Gain in current pregnancy (for pregnant participants)</li> </ul> </li> <li>Added Note to # 6:</li> </ul>	These changes align policy with the current Medical Documentation Forms.
	<b>Note:</b> Infants can receive two different formulas in the setting of transitioning from a therapeutic formula to a standard WIC formula if approved by the medical provider. The total amount of formula combined can't exceed the maximum monthly allowance for formula. If prescribed by the medical provider, both formulas must be documented on the same WIC Medical Documentation Form.	
Provide Therapeutic WIC Formulas and Foods to Infants p. 7 - 9	<ul> <li>Policy:</li> <li>Added second bullet item to # 5.</li> <li>Beginning at 9 months of age, caregivers have the option to exchange a portion of their baby food fruits and vegetables for a fresh fruit and vegetable Cash Value Benefit.</li> </ul>
