# **FPHS**

A NEW APPROACH TO PUBLIC HEALTH

#### FPHS as a Concept

- ◆ FPHS intent: RCW 43.70.512
  - Protecting the public's health is a fundamental responsibility of the state
  - FPHS are government services provided to everyone, everywhere
- Core public health services which the governmental public health system is responsible for providing in a consistent and uniform way in every community in Washington

## FPHS as a Funding Mechanism

◆ FPHS funding: <u>RCW 43.70.515</u>

State funding appropriated to OFM

DOH consults with Indian tribes

DOH, SBOH, and WSALPHO agree

OFM distributes funding

# FPHS for Drinking Water (Info, Partnerships, Oversight)

- **Policy development.** Use data and evidence-based practices to facilitate development of policy
- 2b: Community partnerships. Identify, develop, engage and maintain local strategic partnerships
- 2c: Statewide partnerships. Identify, develop, engage and maintain strategic partnerships with statewide associations, government agencies and statewide organizations
- 3d: **Drinking water.** Ensure the health and safety of drinking water
- 3m: Policy assistance. Educate on the meaning, purpose and benefit of public health laws and how to comply

## FPHS for Drinking Water (Land Use, Development)


- 6a: Local partnerships. Maintain relationships in economic development, parks, and land use
- 6b: Community planning. Understand and participate in land use, natural resources, and other planning processes
- 6c: **Technical assistance.** Provide technical assistance to planning agencies and community stakeholders
- 6d: Climate change. Anticipate, analyze, and communicate about potential impacts of climate change
- 6e: Health and equity. Provide input on potential health and equity impacts of projects, plans, programs or policies

A NEW FRONTIER FOR CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT

## Broadening Capacity Development

- Capacity development is all we do at ODW
- Funding sources typically limited us to Group A capacity development
- ◆ FPHS allows ODW to provide capacity development services to other organizations:
  - Local health jurisdictions
  - Towns, cities, and counties
  - Other planning and partner organizations



# **ODW Projects**

INITIAL DIRECTION

## Initial Projects

#### Model Water Programs (MWP)

→ Facilitating the Water Core Team to provide capacity development for local health jurisdictions to expand or optimize their drinking water programs

#### Community Water Planning (CWP)

Leading an effort to provide capacity development for towns, cities, and counties to ensure they can accommodate growth, address underserved areas, and coordinate water service

#### Model Water Programs

- MWP
- Capacity development for local health jurisdictions
- Improves LHJ peer networking and capacity
- ◆ ODW is facilitating and hosting products; evaluating outcomes
- Focus on public health program elements

#### Community Water Planning

- Capacity development for local governme and system groups
- Improves local interagency networking
- ODW is leading research, policy development, and technical assistance
- Focus is on development processes, underserved areas, and geographic areas

## FPHS is in Start-Up Mode

#### Community Water Planning

- Hiring professional planners for best practices
- Focus on water adequacy determinations, growth management act, coordination act, and plats/subdivision law


#### Model Water Programs
