(Affidavit for Residency)

Staff:

- 1. Use this form when proof of residency doesn't exist, for example the residency documentation was stolen or destroyed, doesn't exist, or requiring it would put the person at risk of harm.
- 2. Select "Residency Affidavit" for proof of residency. This form is the person's proof of residency.

- All of the information I give WIC is true and correct to the best of my knowledge.
