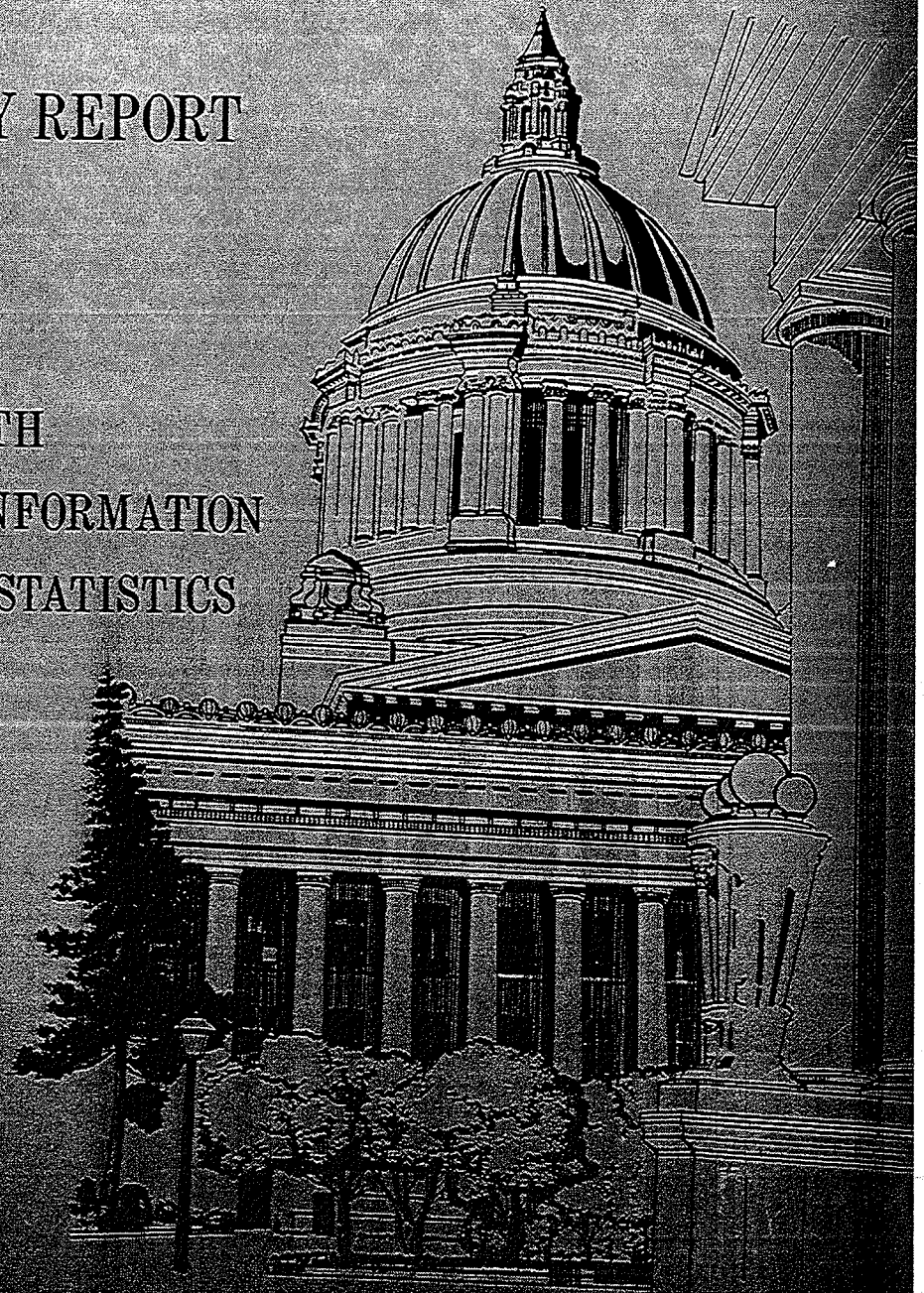

Dear Colleague:


This issue of the Center for Health Statistics [CHS] Annual Summary heralds a new and exciting era of information exchange between you, our constituency, and the ever-expanding data system. Much work and effort have gone into the streamlining of the data and repositioning of Sections to make the Report more useful. It is the intent of the Center to make the data collected as accessible and usable as technology and resources allow. The making of good policy decisions is dependent upon accurate data that is available in a timely manner. The entire data collection, storage, and retrieval system is being revised to achieve this objective.

A number of new systems will be placed in operation over the ensuing months that will further increase the efficiency of the Center's operation, making the work of you, our users, easier. This will free-up Center research and analysis staff to be more responsive to the needs of specialized requests and to provide Department of Health-wide support to projects such as the Assessment Protocol for Excellence in Public Health [APEX] Project and the recently acquired Behavioral Risk Factor Survey System [BRFSS].

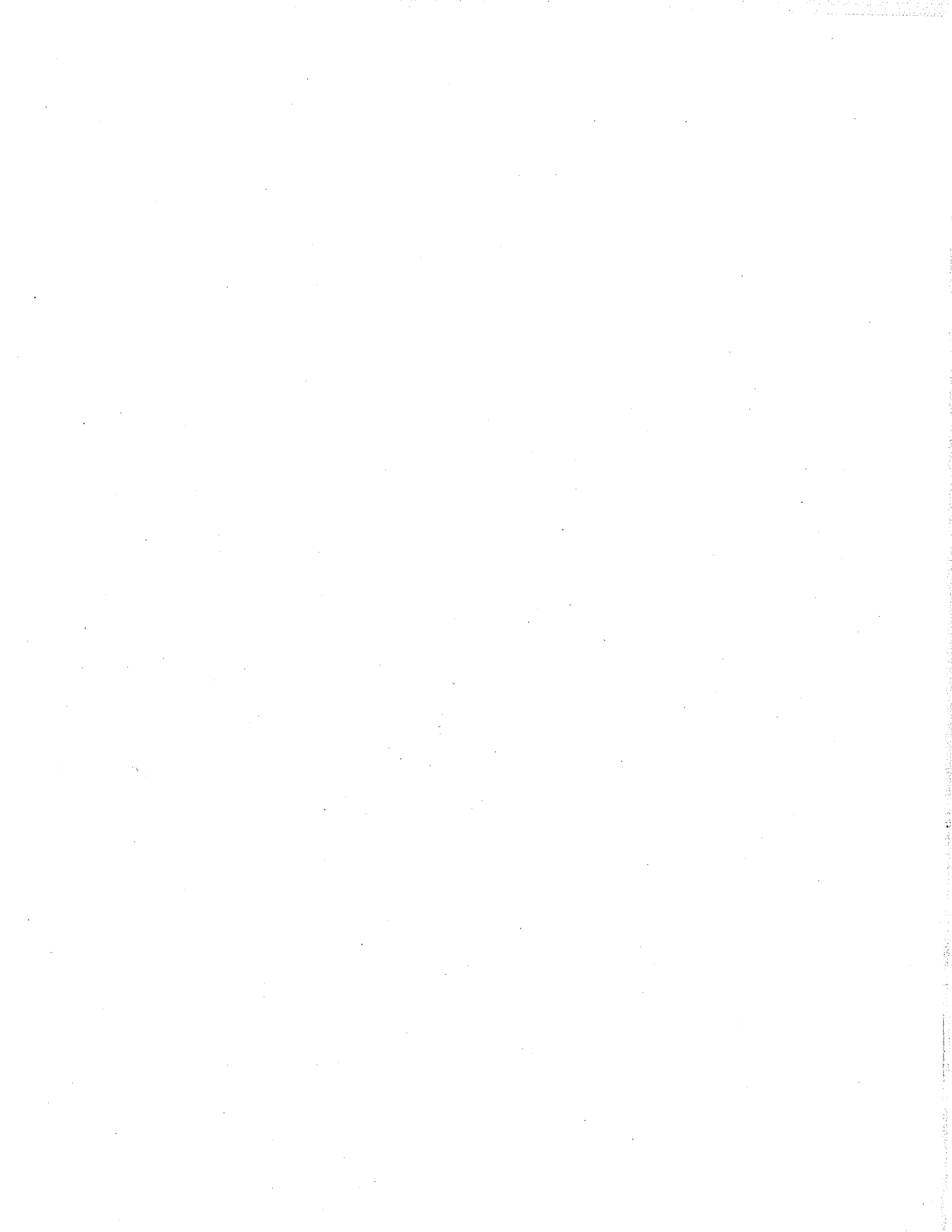

PREFACE

Washington State Vital Statistics 1990 is published by the Center for Health Statistics, Washington State Department of Health. This annual summary report is mandated by the Department's mission, to help Washingtonians live healthier lives by enabling them to make informed health choices and insuring their access to quality prevention and illness care. Timely and wide-ranging health information, such as that presented in this report, is crucial to accomplishing this mission. *Washington State Vital Statistics* is often the first resource used to identify problems related to prenatal care, maternal and infant health, family planning, and general mortality.

Data used to prepare this report come from Certificates of Live Birth, Fetal Death, Death, Marriage, and Dissolution. The forms for these certificates are provided by the Department of Health. The following table describes how these forms are completed and filed.

The County Health Departments, Clerks, and Auditors forward all completed certificates monthly to the Department of Health, where they are coded and the data are entered into a computer. These computer files are used to perform the analyses and prepare the tables presented in this report.

Data in *Washington State Vital Statistics 1990* are used in two ways:

1. Charts and narratives point out general areas of concern and provide a quick reference summary.
2. Detailed tables address more specific or local problems. For example, a county can compare itself to similar or neighboring areas to assess the health status of its population (maternal smoking, infant mortality, cancer deaths). This comparison provides a first look at possible problems and is a starting point for more detailed analysis of causative factors. Other data users such as researchers, reporters, business people, or health program planners can find information which helps them to answer questions, write stories, or assess needs for new services.

Users of this book are cautioned to beware of basing decisions on small numbers. When the number of events is small, the rates can fluctuate widely from year to year because one event more or less causes a large change in the rate. In this case, users should combine several years of data to provide larger numbers. Comparing groups of years will then serve to identify significant trends.

With a little care in its use, *Washington State Vital Statistics* is a very important tool. No other publication has such a wide variety of health status indicators which provide a simple overview of the health of a population.

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INTRODUCTION

Washington State Vital Statistics 1990 contains a summary presentation, in tabular form, of the vital events (birth, death, marriage, divorce) which occurred during the calendar year 1990. In the interest of easy comparison, essentially the same format of tabular presentation used in previous annual summaries is continued in this report. This report also contains a brief analysis of birth and death statistics.

Removed This Year: Induced Terminations Of Pregnancy Section

Since 1985, *Washington State Vital Statistics* has included a section on Induced Terminations of Pregnancy. This year, including induced termination data would have delayed production of the annual summary and made the report less timely. Therefore, induced termination data will be presented in a separate report, expected to be available by early 1992. Induced termination data will be recombined with vital events data in future publications.

Changed This Year: '1990 Goals' Section

Since 1986, *Washington State Vital Statistics* has included a section 'Is Washington State Meeting 1990 Goals?' for birth, death, infant and fetal death. This section projected Washington State rates to 1990 using a crude extrapolation method. These projected rates were compared to 1990 goals to identify areas of concern where the goals would not be met. The availability of 1990 data provides a unique opportunity to compare actual 1990 figures against the goals and the initial projections made in 1986. Thus we can answer the questions:

1. Did we meet the goals? We can identify areas where special efforts may be needed.
2. How good were the projections? If they cause misleading conclusions, they should be discontinued.

Changes Affecting Trend Data

RACE CODING: As of 1990, when more than one race is given on a birth or death certificate, the first race listed is selected. Thus, an entry of 'White/African American' would now be coded as 'White' while an entry of 'African American/White' would be coded as 'African American'. In previous years, the first Non-White race was selected. Using this convention, both entries would be coded to 'African American'. This change was made in accordance with National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) specifications, to promote consistency with Census Bureau data. The change will most likely increase the number of 'White' events and include more persons of mixed race in the 'White' category.

ASIAN SUBGROUPS: In the 1989 birth and death certificate revision, a prompt for 'Asian/Pacific Islander' was added to the race item. This addition caused a loss of detail, as respondents wrote 'Asian' rather than specifying subgroups such as 'Chinese'. Consequently, the number of births and deaths coded 'Chinese', 'Japanese', and 'Filipino' decreased substantially between 1988 and 1989. For example, the number of Chinese births decreased from 238 to 99 while the number of births coded 'Other Asian' increased from 2,877 to 3,736. Thus, trend data for Asian subgroups will show a sharp decrease in rates for 1989 and subsequent years at least through 1991. Educational efforts are currently being made to improve reporting of data on Asian subgroups.

POPULATION: 1990 population-based rates will be somewhat inconsistent with previous rates because Census data were used as the base, rather than projections made by the Washington State Office of Financial Management. For the state as a whole, Census figures are about three percent higher than projected, which means that rates will be about three percent lower than those based on projections.

Additional Services

This annual summary report provides a good overview of the types of data available through the Washington State Center for Health Statistics. Additional tabulations can be obtained by calling the Research and Analysis Section (R&A) at (206) 586-6008. R&A also works with data users to formulate requests so they get the data they need, provides technical consultation about how to use or interpret data, performs special analyses to address a specific problem or need, and helps users access raw data files.

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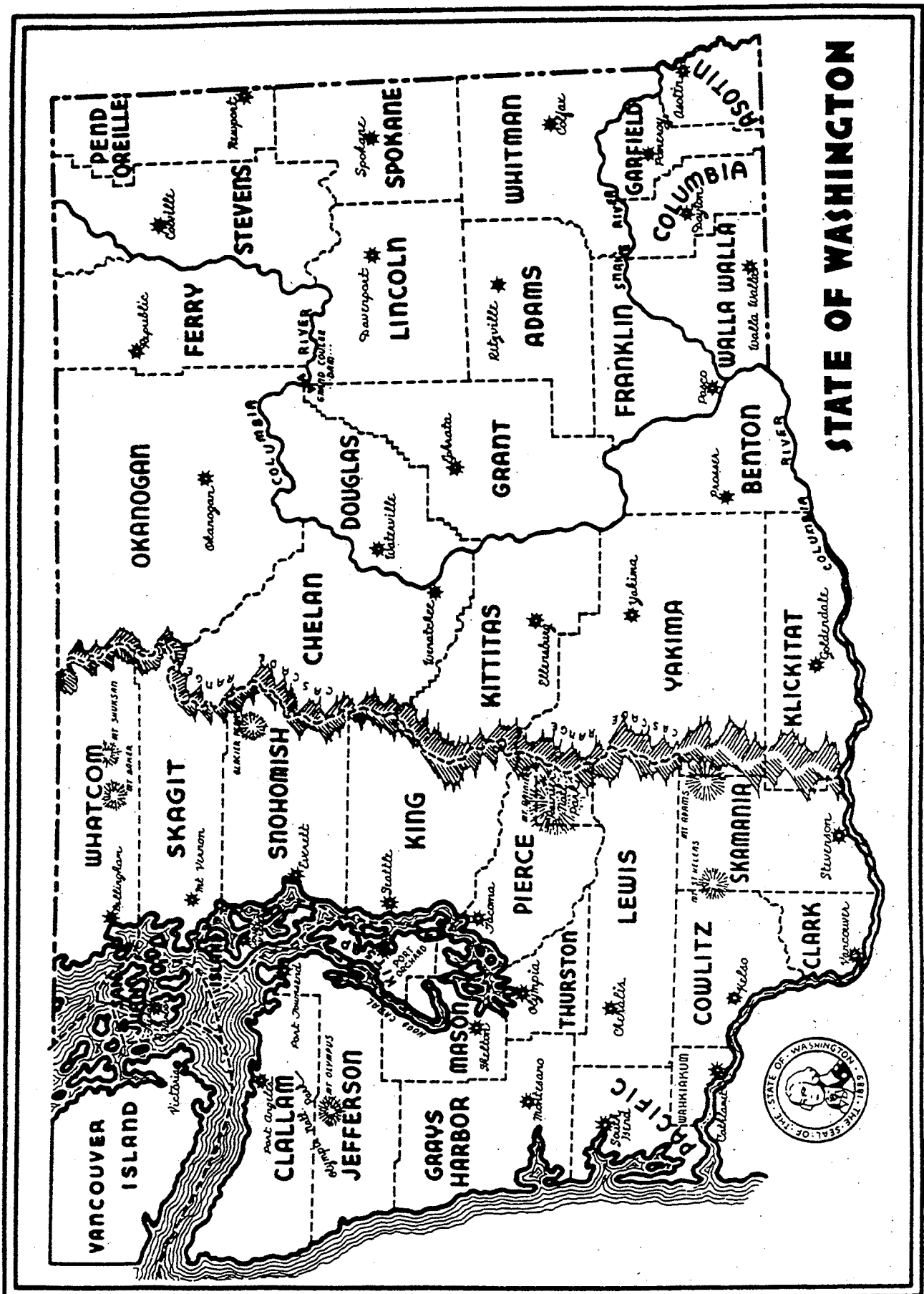


OVERVIEW

This section presents information which can be used to put the data which follow into perspective.

The map of Washington State can be used to locate neighboring counties for comparison with a particular county's health status indicators (such as low birth weight or cancer mortality). It also serves to help identify counties on subsequent maps, which do not have the counties labelled.

The chart (Table 1) provides a historical perspective, showing how the state has changed since 1920 and gives a frame of reference for 1990 data, to see how 1990 compares to previous years. For example, we can see that the birth rate has increased in the last three years, as the 'Post-War Baby Boom' generation are having their own children. Looking at long-term trends can reveal particularly dramatic changes, such as the more than three-fold increase in the state's population and the sharp decline in infant and maternal deaths. For those who find a visual display easier to understand, graphs of these trends are presented in the appropriate section (e.g., 1915-1990 Birth Rates with the Natality Section).

WASHINGTON STATE, 1915-1990**

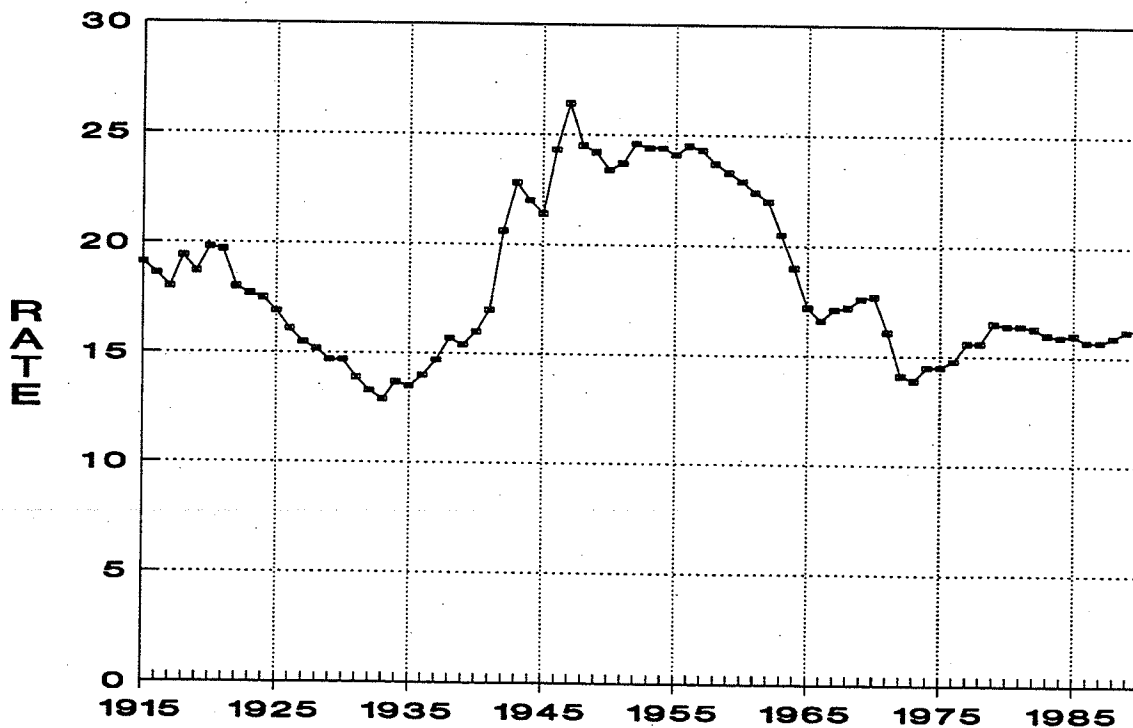

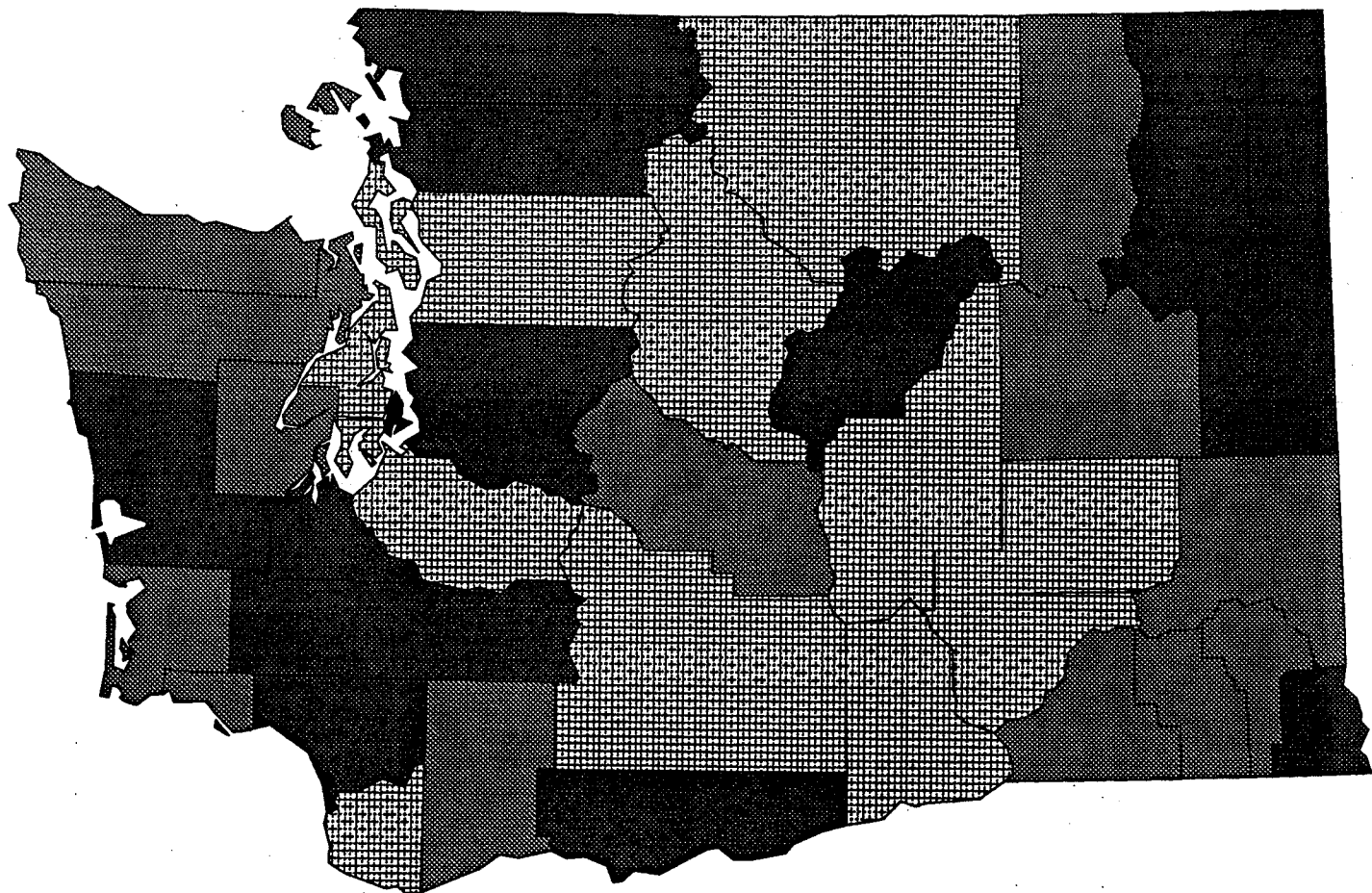

Live Births/1,000 population

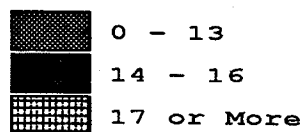

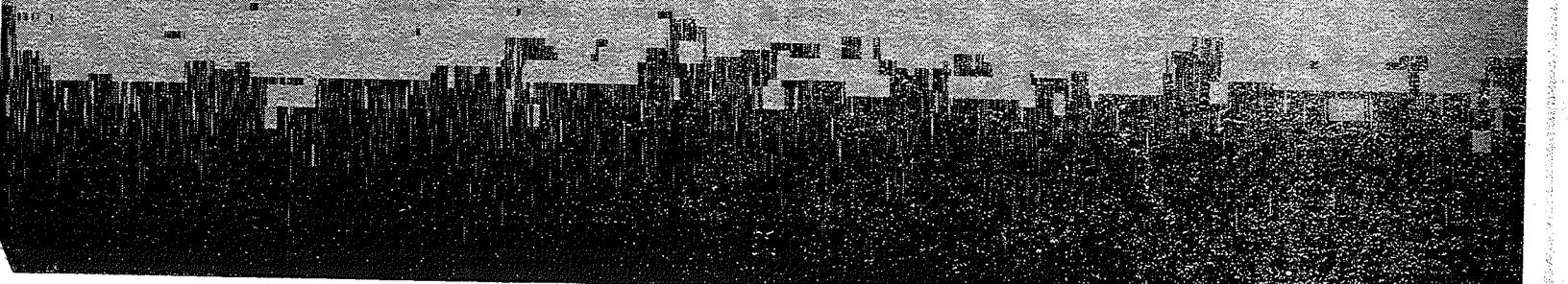

WASHINGTON STATE, 1915-1990**

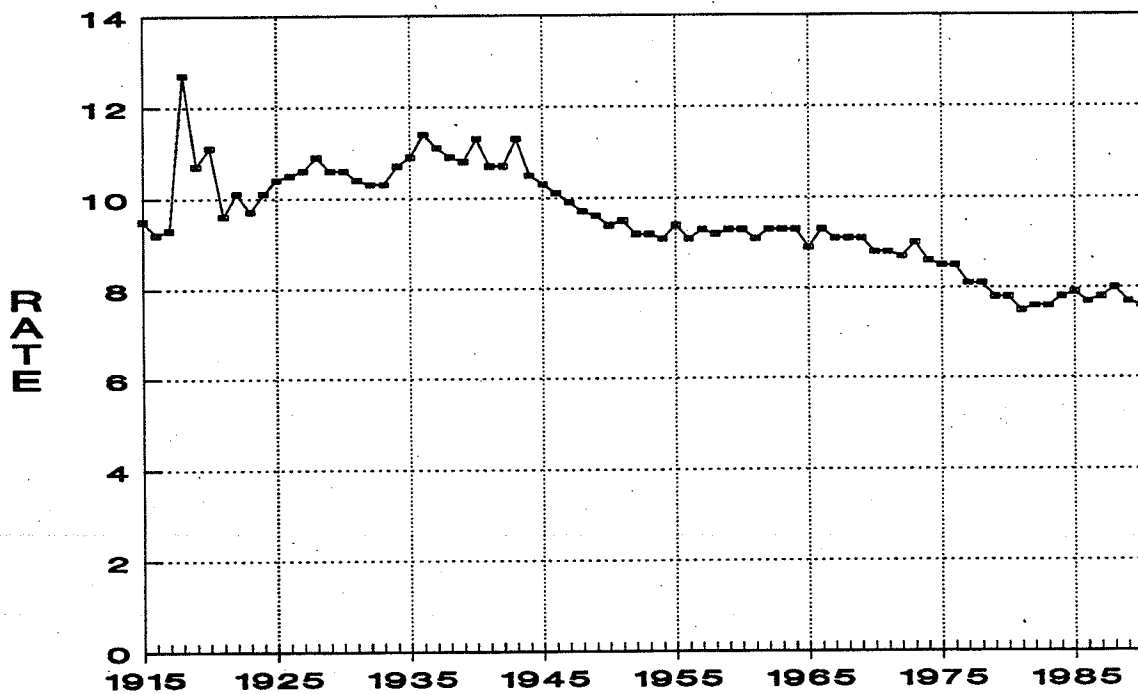

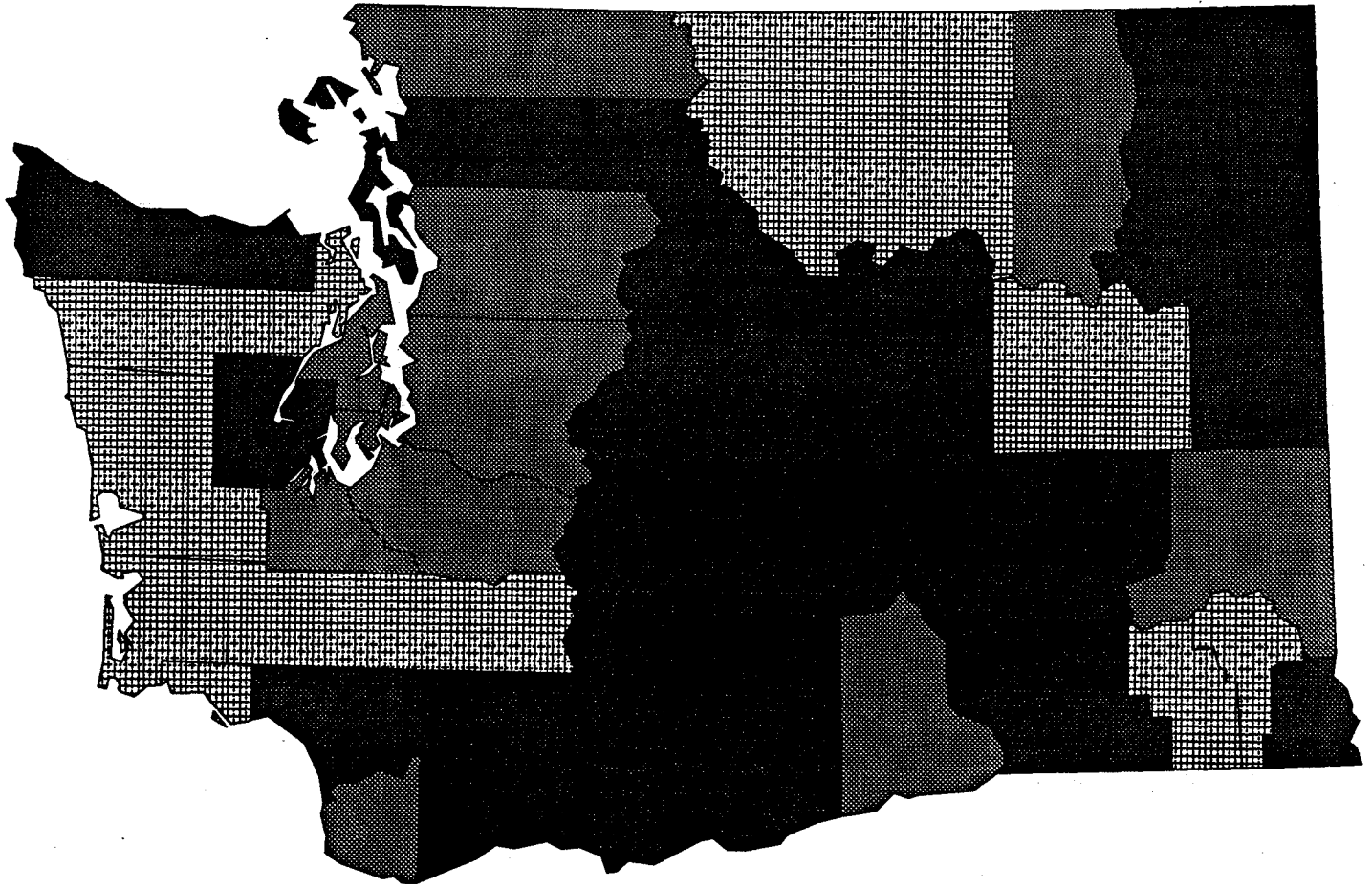

Areas of Concern

- Projections correctly estimated that goals for motor vehicle accidents (children under 15), falls, drowning, and male suicide, ages 15-24 would not be met.
- Projections correctly estimated that goals for cirrhosis of the liver in Native Americans would not be met, but rates were still considerably underestimated. Projections were made at a time when rates appeared to be decreasing, but in the last three years, rates have been considerably higher.

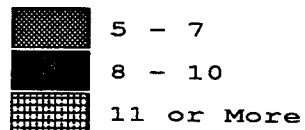

WASHINGTON STATE, 1915-1990

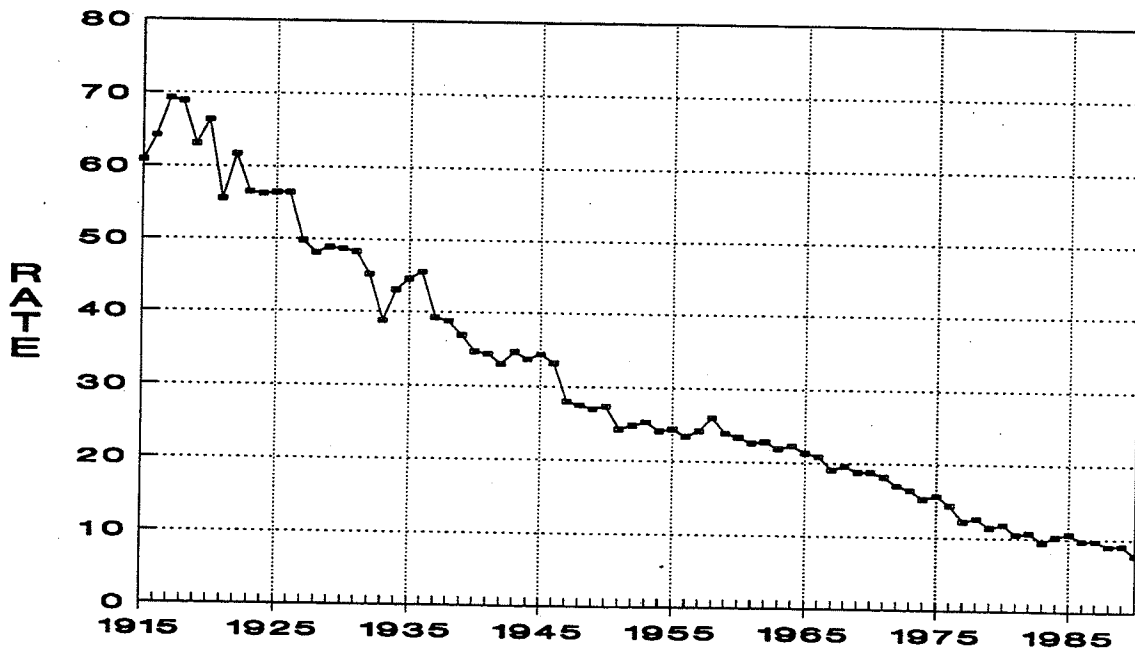
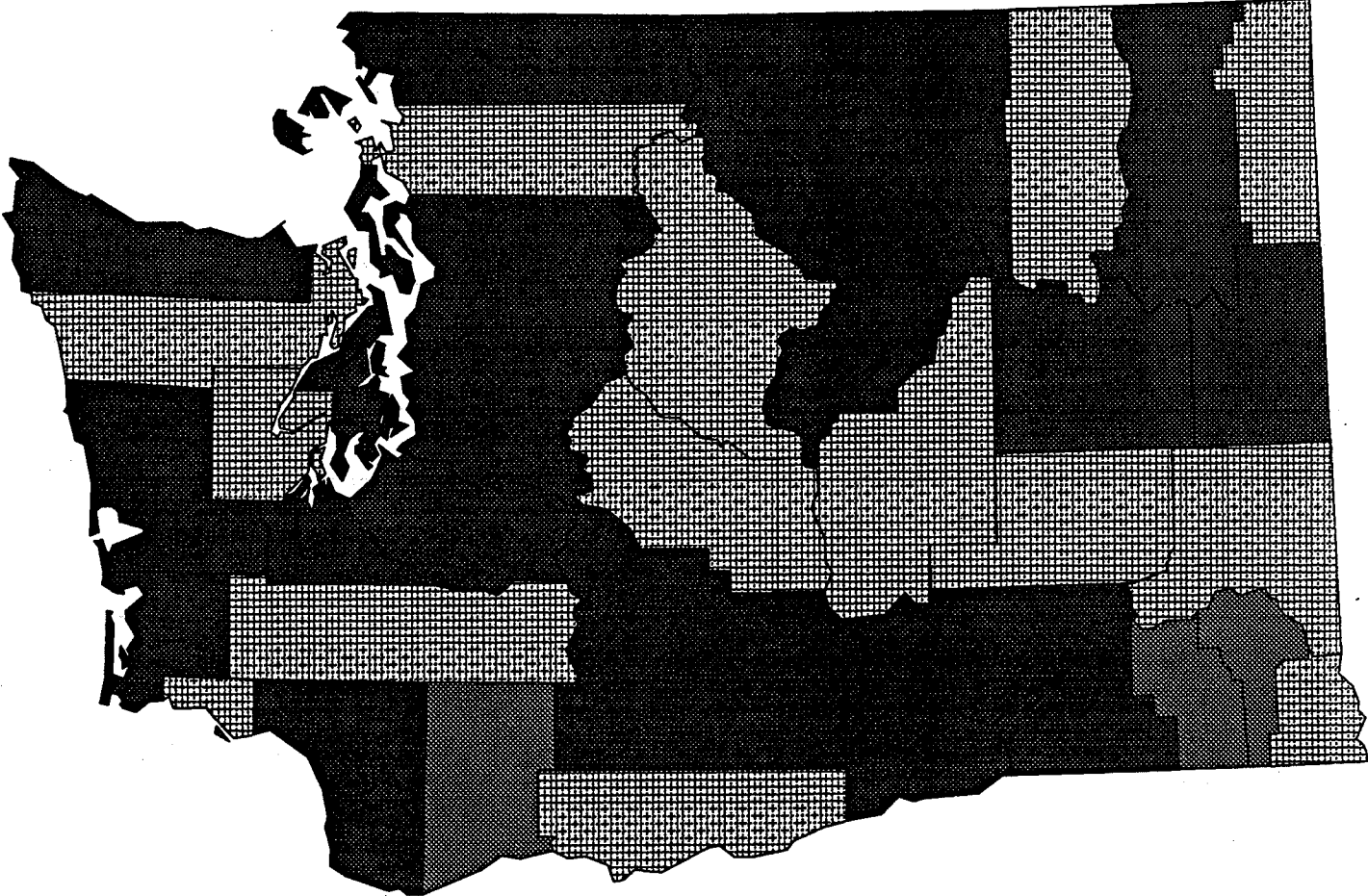


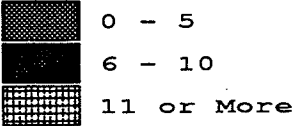

WASHINGTON STATE, 1915-1990

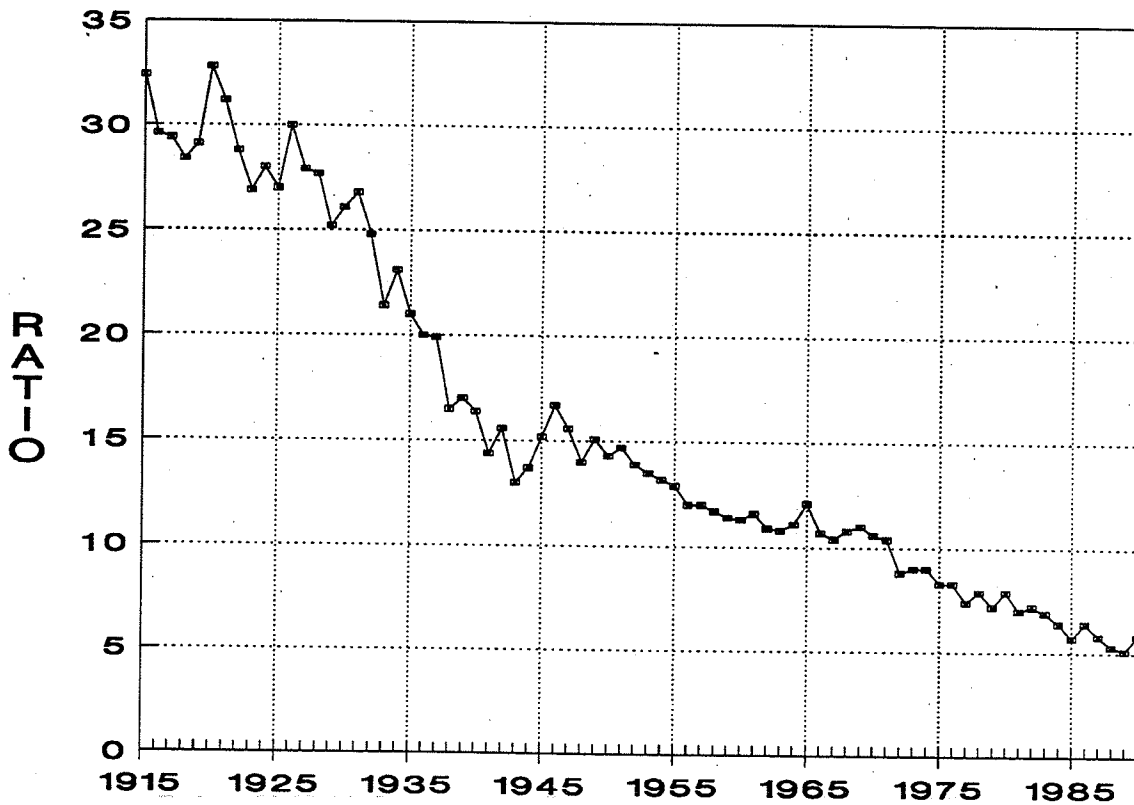
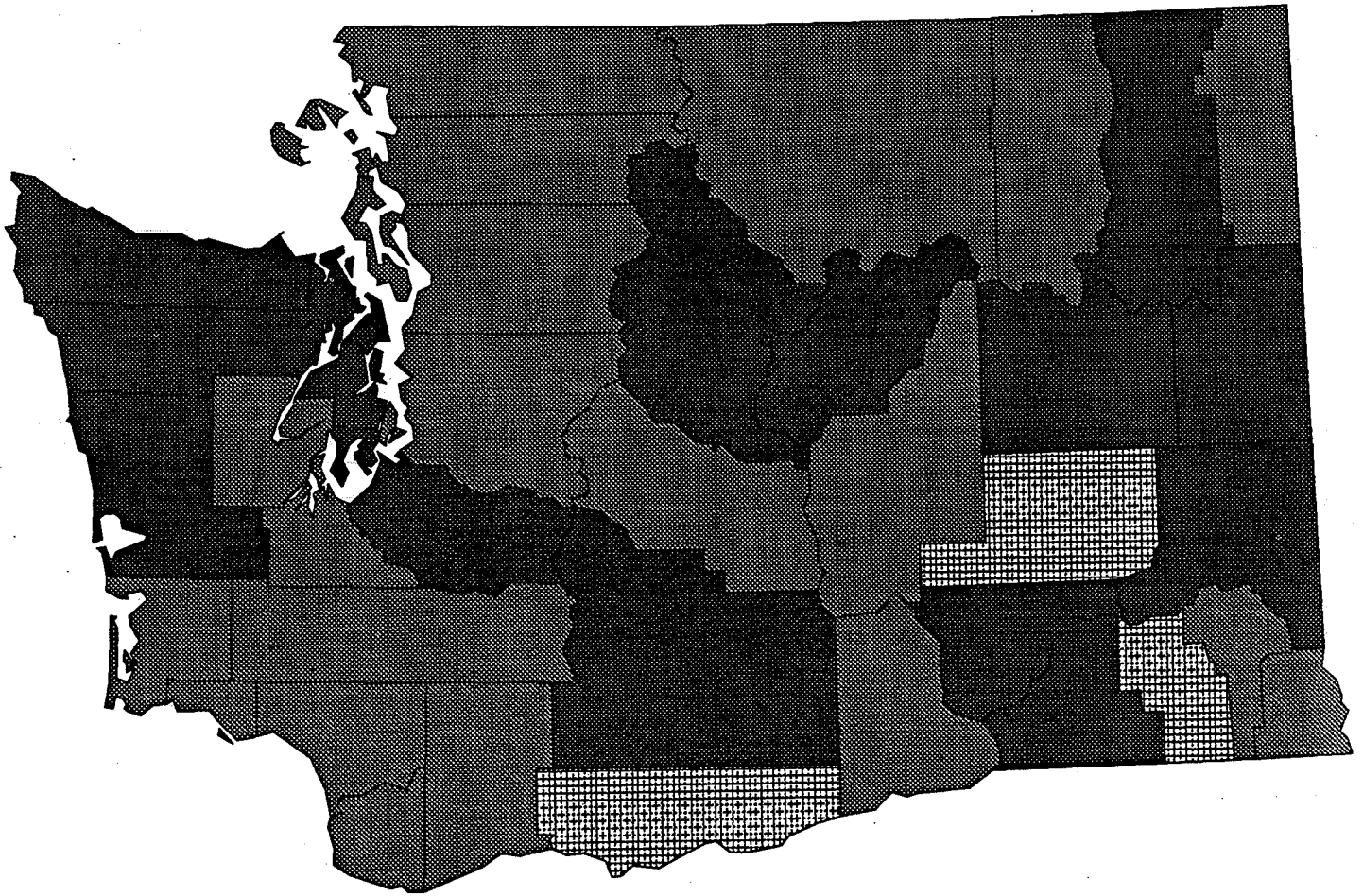

Fetal Deaths/1,000 births

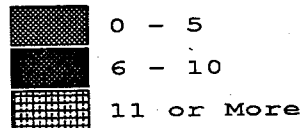

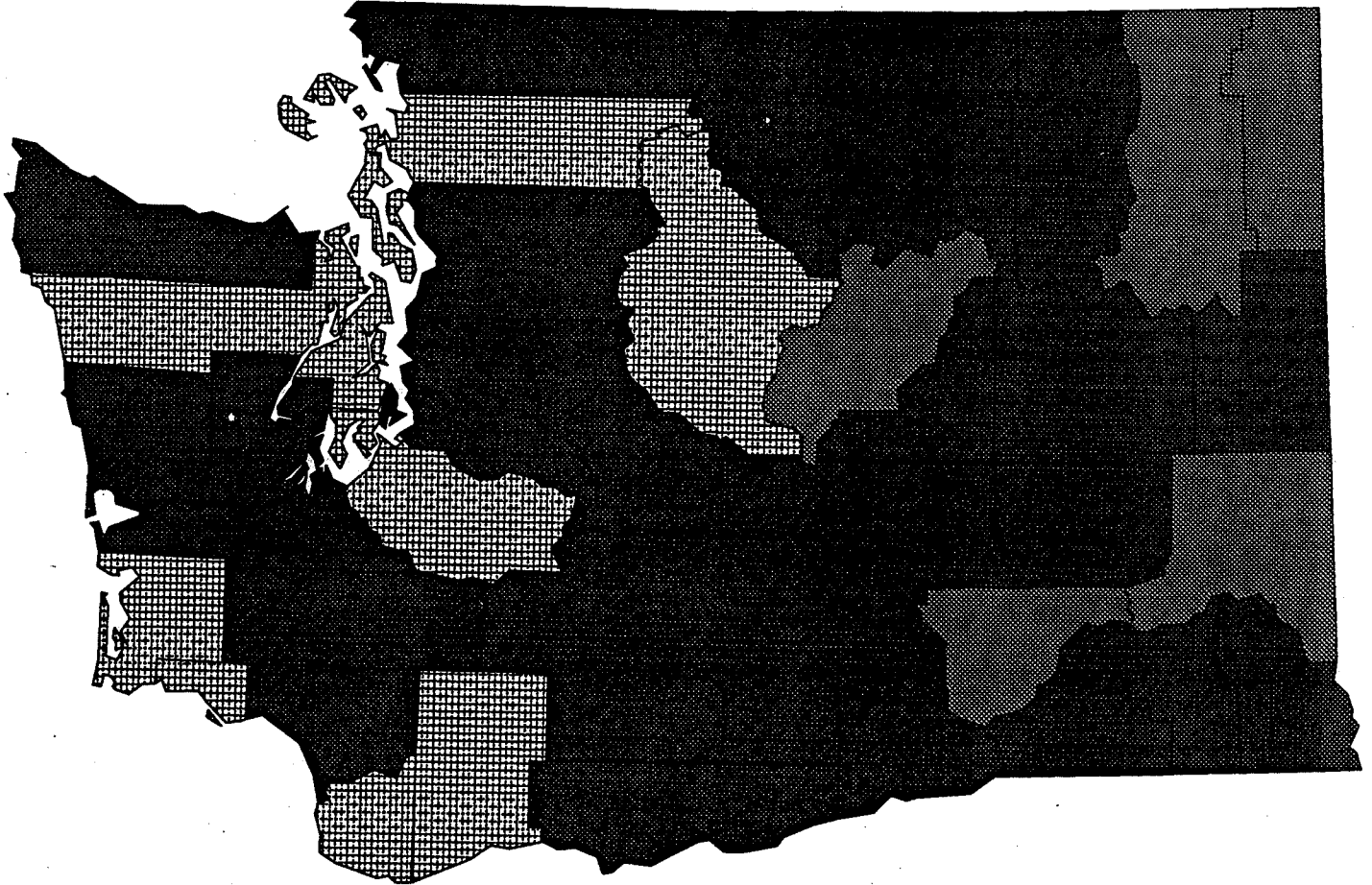

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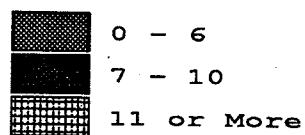

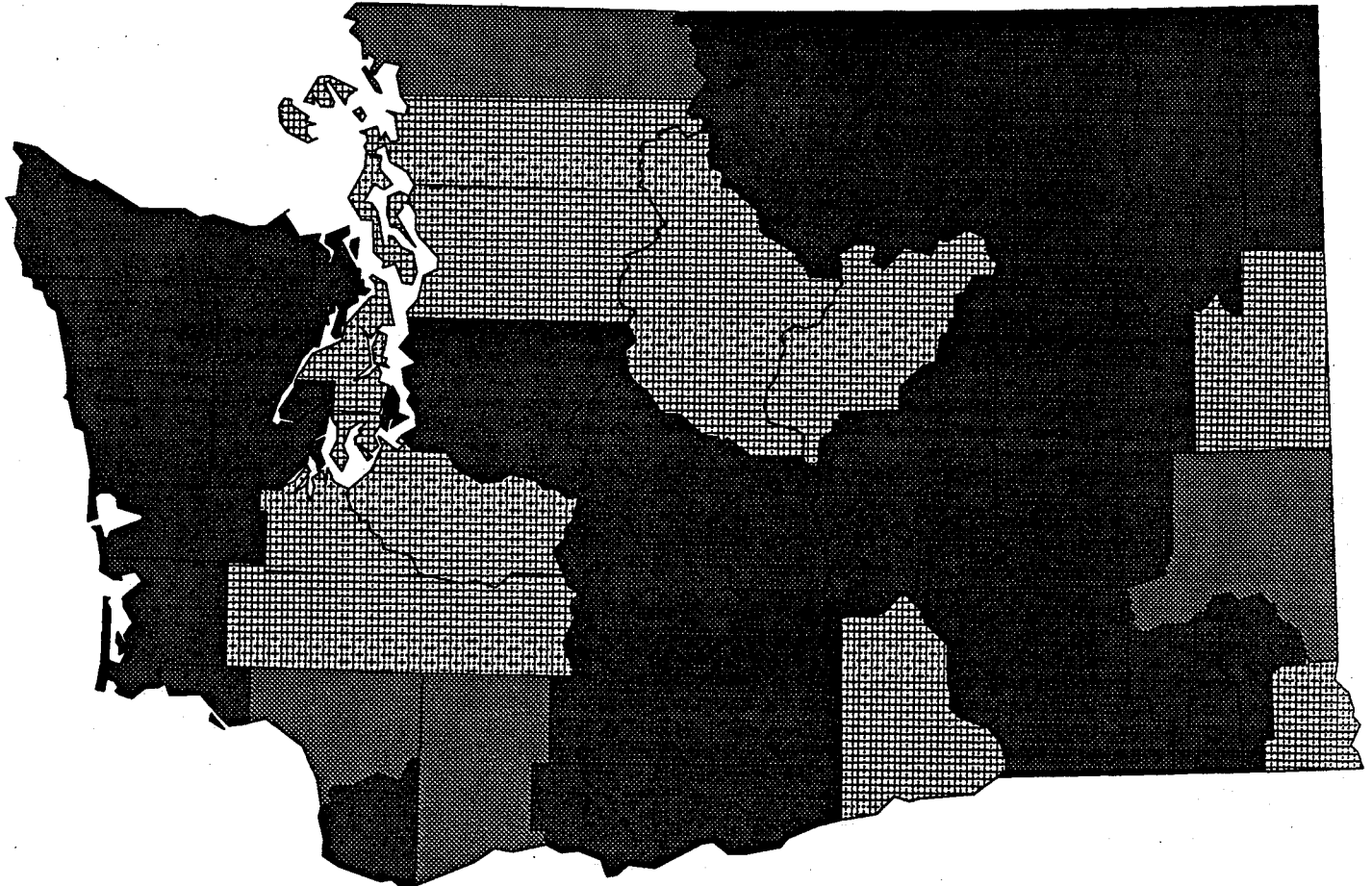
Washington State, 1990

Divorces/1,000 population

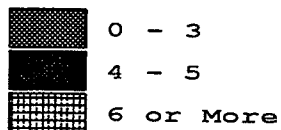

Appendix A

Technical Notes

Reliability of the Data

In analyzing any data, the possibility of errors in the data must not be overlooked. There are several types of possible errors, including underreporting or under-registration, errors made by the informant, and errors in compilation and processing. The most potentially dangerous error, however, is probably that of improper interpretation.

Statistics are neither more true nor false than the interpretation given to them. It should be emphasized that most of the rates computed in this report are crude rates. For comparing geographic areas, crude rates are limited. They do not reflect differences in age, sex, race, and other population characteristics. In addition, it is important to recognize the possible distortion in these rates where the number of events or the population is small. Minor variations in the number of events may result in major changes in the rates. Special caution should also be exercised in analyzing trend data, because of changes throughout the years in medical diagnosis, coding definitions, and registration coverage.

Methods and Sources of Data for "Did Washington State Meet Its 1990 Goals?"

Trends are determined by comparing 1990 to the previous five years, thus they represent recent trends only. Long-term trends in rates are shown on the accompanying graphs.

Projected 1990 Washington State rates were determined by assuming that past trends continued to 1990. Because this is a rough approximation, projected data are given in whole numbers only, to reflect their uncertainty. Washington State data are based on 1990 Washington State resident events, except where two or three years are combined to provide more stability in rates. These cases are noted in the tables.

US figures are based on data reported in the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) *Monthly Vital Statistics Reports* (USDDHS, Public Health Service, Hyattsville, Maryland). Data are the most recent available; data years used are noted on the tables.

1990 goals are given in the NCHS publication *Health: United States 1986*. (DHHS Publication No. PHS 87-1232. Public Health Service, Washington, DC US Government Printing Office, December 1986).

Collection Year

Data for the *Annual Summary of Vital Statistics, Washington State 1990* report are compiled from items on birth, death, marriage, and divorce certificates received before April 15, 1990. (See Appendix F for samples.)

Washington State is a member of the interstate exchange agreement and receives birth and death certificates of residents who have died in other states. Out-of-state marriage and divorce certificates are not exchanged.

Population

Population data in this report are an estimate of the population provided by the Washington State Office of Financial Management, April 1, 1990. They are from Bureau of the Census Summary Tape File 1A reports. They do not include the provisional adjustments made by OFM to correct for age-misreporting which resulted due to a problem with the census age question.

Race

The determination of race on birth and death certificates follows decision rules established by the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS).

If more than one race is listed and one is Hawaiian, Hawaiian is selected. In cases of other races, the first non-white race listed is selected.

To determine race of newborns on birth certificates, each parent's race is first established according to the previous rules. Rules to determine race of the child, then, fall along a similar pattern:

- If either parent is Hawaiian, then the child's race is considered Hawaiian.
- In cases where one parent is white and the other non-white, the non-white race is selected as the race of the child.
- If both parents are non-white, the father's race is selected except where the mother's race is Hawaiian.

Hispanic origin was added as an ethnic category and collected as a separate item (in addition to race) for the 1988 annual vital statistics summary. Prior to 1988, Hispanic data were provided by a racial category of "Mexican/Chicano" or "Mexican American". Data based on Hispanic origin from those years are not comparable with data collected after 1987 and should not be used for trend analysis or year-to-year comparisons.

Low Birth Weight

Traditionally, low birth weight has been defined as 2,500 grams or less. However, the *International Classification of Diseases, Ninth Revision (ICD-9)* redefines low birth weight as less than 2,500 grams. Thus, 2,500 grams should now be included with the normal birth weight category. The impact of this change is minimal in the United States, where most weights are given in pounds and ounces. No weight of pounds and ounces converts exactly to 2,500 grams (5lb, 8oz is 2,495g and 5lb 9oz is 2,523g). It is, therefore, unlikely that many weights of 2,500 grams are recorded. In fact, none were found in a study of 1984 Washington State births. In the interests of consistency with past data, Washington State has chosen to continue including 2,500 grams with the low birth weight category.

Maternal Smoking

The birth certificate item concerning maternal smoking was changed with the 1989 certificate. In 1989, new mothers were asked the number of cigarettes smoked in addition to answering the question: "Tobacco use during pregnancy?". Tables concerning maternal smoking in this summary continue to array maternal smoking as "Yes", "No", and "Unknown" irrespective of quantity.

Cause of Death Classification

The causes of death presented herein are classified in accordance with the *International Classification of Diseases, Ninth Revision* published by the World Health Organization. The State of Washington began using this revision January 1, 1979.

Ranking of Leading Causes of Death

In the interest of comparability, this summary uses, in general, the cause of death groups established by the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS).

Life Expectancy

Life expectancy is based on 1990 crude mortality rates.

Occurrence Data on Death Certificates

The validity of occurrence death data has some limitations. As the death certificate does not specify inside or outside of corporate limits for place of death, rural deaths may be incorrectly assigned to cities because the location of death was in close proximity to a city. Informants, moreover, often are unaware of city boundaries.

Rounding

Rates are rounded to the nearest tenth. When the rate or percent is less than one-tenth, the entry is 0. Where whole numbers are used, a blank indicates none or zero.

Appendix B

Definitions

Birth Weight - Weight of fetus or infant at time of delivery (normally recorded in pounds and ounces).

Fetal Death - Death prior to the complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of human conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy. The death is indicated by the fact that after such expulsion or extraction the fetus does not breathe or show any other evidence of life such as beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord, or definite movement of voluntary muscles. Reporting of fetal deaths to the state is required only when the gestational period is twenty weeks or more.

Infant Death - Death of a child under one year of age.

Live Birth - The complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of human conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy, which, after such expulsion or extraction, breathes, or shows any other evidence of life such as beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord, or definite movement of voluntary muscles, whether or not the umbilical cord has been cut or the placenta is attached.

Live Birth Order - Total number of live births to a given mother, including current birth.

Maternal Death - Death attributed to complications of pregnancy, childbirth, or the puerperium; includes abortion related death.

Neonatal Death - Death of an infant within the first 27 days of life.

Nulliparous - Having never given birth to a liveborn infant.

Occurrence Data - Data allocated by place where event occurred, regardless of the person's place of residence.

Parity - Previous live births; does not include current birth.

Perinatal Death - Fetal deaths plus deaths to infants within the first six days of life.

Premature Birth - A live birth weighing 2,500 grams (5-1/2 pounds) or less. If birth weight is not stated, length of gestation (under 37 weeks) is used.

Residence Data - Data allocated by place of residence of the decedent (deaths), or by place of residence of the child's mother (births, fetal deaths).

Rates And Ratios

Rates and ratios are calculated by dividing the event of concern by the population at risk or a related population and multiplying by a constant (i.e. 1,000, 10,000, or 100,000). See below.

Age-specific Rate - Number in event of concern for a specific age group per some fixed constant of population in that age group. For instance, the age-specific death rate is the number of deaths in a specific age group per 100,000 population in that age group. See different rates, i.e. fertility, pregnancy, abortion, for most typically used fixed constant in each rate.

Cause-specific Death Rate - Number of deaths from a specific cause per 100,000 population.

(crude) Birth Rate - Number of live births per 1,000 population.

(crude) Death Rate - Number of deaths per 1,000 population.

Fetal Death Ratio - Number of fetal deaths per 1,000 live births.

Infant Death Rate - Number of infant deaths per 1,000 live births.

Maternal Death Rate - Number of maternal deaths per 10,000 live births.

Neonatal Death Rate - Number of neonatal deaths per 1,000 live births.

Perinatal Death Rate - Number of perinatal deaths per 1,000 live births plus fetal deaths.
