## Getting Tested for COVID-19



It is important to get tested if you have symptoms or if you were in close contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19.

How to Get Tested





Your health care provider or a provider that takes your insurance.



A drive thru or walk up testing site.



A community clinic, health center, or pharmacy.

If you have symptoms or were in close contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19, your test should be free.

- If you are insured, your insurance company is required to cover the cost of the test. Call first to ask if there may be other charges.
- If you are uninsured, many drive-thru sites, community clinics, and health centers provide tests free of charge without insurance. Other providers may work with you to get your test covered.

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## **Your Testing Appointment**

1 Check in for your appointment.

Drive-through sites and community clinics will ask you for:




- Basic information, such as your name and contact information so they can reach you with results.
- Your identification and insurance card.
   You are not required to show these, but they will ask for them.

They **will not** ask your immigration status. Your information will only be shared with the Department of Health or your local health department.

**9** Get tested.

The provider will collect a sample from you. Usually, they will swab the inside of your nose or have you swab your own nose.







3 Stay home.

Make sure you stay home and away from others until you know the result of your test.
