





WA-Violent Death Reporting System Implementation Timeline




Measure & Background – Results WA

2013-2017 Washington State Suicide Mortality (State Age-Adjusted Rate = 15.4 per 100,000)





WA Suicide Rate by Race/Ethnicity (2013-2017)





WA and US Suicide Rates by Race/Ethnicity (2013-2017)





WA Suicide Rate by Race/Ethnicity (2008-2012 vs 2013-2017)




WA Suicide Rate by Age and Sex (2013-2017)


WA Intentional Self-Injury Hospitalization Rate by Age and Sex (2016-2017)

Method


Definitions

- <u>Firearm</u>: Intentional self-harm by handguns, rifle, shotgun, larger and unspecified firearm discharge.
 ICD-10 codes: X72 to X74
- <u>Suffocation</u>: Intentional self-harm by suffocation, hanging, strangulation.


ICD-10 code: X70

 <u>Poisoning</u>: Intentional self-harm by prescription, non-prescription and illicit drugs, alcohol, organic solvents, gases/vapors, pesticides and other chemicals and noxious substances.
 ICD-10 codes: X60 to X69

WA and US Suicide by Methods (2013-2017)




WA Suicide by Method and Sex (2013-2017)





WA Suicide by Method and Age (2013-2017)




WA and US Suicide and Firearm Death Rates (2008-2017)

* Includes accidental and undetermined firearm-related deaths.





WA Suicide by Method in Youth Ages 10-24 (2013-2017)





WA Suicide Rate among Older Adults ages 65 + (2008-2017)




WA Suicide Rate among Older Men ages 65+ (2008-2017)



WA and US Suicide Rates among AI/AN (2008-2017)




WA Suicide among Al/AN by Age (2013-2017)

WA Suicide among Al/AN by Method (2013-2017)



Veterans*

- In 2017, there was an estimated 624,000 veterans in WA.
 - That year there were 255 suicides by WA veterans.
- From 2013 to 2017, 1,189 WA veterans* died by suicide.
 - This accounts for 17.6 % of all WA suicides.
 - \circ 35.8 % of veterans were ages 55 to 74.
 - 255 veterans died by suicide in 2017 (crude rate: 45.5 per 100,000 veterans)
 - Approximately 67% of all veteran suicide deaths were the result of firearm injuries.

* "Veterans" includes active service members, reserve members, and veterans.
 Rate is based on our best calculation of service members and veterans in WA
