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Early Intervention Program (EIP)

Providing services for people living with HIV in Washington State.



- Prescription Medications
- Medical/Mental Health/Lab Care Costs
- Health Insurance Premiums
- Insurance Wraparound Costs
- Dental Care Costs

Our Mission:
The mission of HIV Client Services is to suppress viral load by ensuring access to quality services for people living with HIV in Washington State.

Our Vision
To end HIV by preventing new contractions in Washington State.

What can EIP pay for?

Prescription Medications

EIP has an open formulary for insured clients and pays co-pays after the primary insurance.



EIP has a limited HIV related formulary for uninsured clients.

Medical & Mental Health Care Costs

EIP pays for medical, mental health, and lab services listed on our schedule of covered services. Services must be provided by an EIP contracted provider.

Dental Care Costs

EIP pays for dental care listed on our schedule of covered dental services. Services must be provided by an EIP contracted provider.

Medical & Dental Insurance Wraparound

EIP can assist with co-pays, co-insurance, and deductible if the service is on our schedule of covered services and the provider is contracted with EIP.



Health Insurance Premiums

EIP covers specific procedures and medications related to HIV, but it is not insurance. EIP can help you get comprehensive health insurance and pay the premiums.



Plans we pay for include:

- Qualified Health Plans—Exchange
- Individual Health Plans—Non Exchange
- Employer-Sponsored Insurance
- Medicare Part D Plans
- Medicare Advantage Part C Plans
- Healthcare for Workers with Disabilities (HWD)



EIP Eligibility Requirements

You must:

- Be living with HIV
 - Live in Washington State
 - Have household** income at or below 425% Federal Poverty Level (FPL)
- **Household Includes: Legally Married Spouse or Registered Domestic and/or dependent children age 18 and younger.

How do I apply for EIP?

- Complete an application online www.doh.wa.gov/HIVcare
- Attach all required documentation

If you need assistance, your HIV Medical Case Manager can help you.

Where can I find computer access to fill out an EIP application?

- Case management agency
- Local health department
- Local AIDS service organization

Will I have to apply for other programs or benefits?

EIP must be payer of last resort. If you are or become eligible for insurance or benefits you must apply. Examples:

- Employer Sponsored Health Insurance
- Expanded Medicaid—WA Apple Health
- Medicare
