

Staff Tool: Unknown Measurements



Cascades requires weight and/or height or length on specific screens and participants may not have the information available. In order to complete the certification, staff must enter data.

Use participant centered skills to ask probing questions or take additional steps to help participants identify or estimate measurement data. When the participant can't estimate the data, use the guidance below.

What to do	
Consider the following probing questions:	
What is your usual weight?	
 Can you estimate what you weighed prior to getting pregnant? How much did you weigh when you found out you were pregnant? Is there a weight listed on your form of ID? Have participant obtain from their patient portal, such as MyChart. Consider asking the participant to look at: Driver's license DMV-issued card Foreign-issued card U.S. Military ID card, Common Access Card (CAC) Use the weight from last entry in Cascades Anthro/Lab screen in 	
the History container (if applicable).

 When a participant doesn't know and can't estimate, use the following: Weight 150 pounds Write a note in the Individual Care Plan "<i>Ppt. doesn't know Wt. entered SRA.</i>" Note: SRA is a new abbreviation for State Recommended Amount. 	

1. Pregnant participant doesn't know their pre-pregnancy weight.





Adult height	 Consider asking the participant to look at: Driver's license DMV-issued card Foreign-issued card U.S. Military ID card, Common Access Card (CAC) Participant obtains from their patient portal, such as MyChart. Ask participant if there's a height listed on their form of ID? Ask participant if they can estimate height. When the participant doesn't know and can't estimate, use: The average height for female in U.S, which is 64 inches. Write a note in the Individual Care Plan "Ppt. doesn't know Ht.
	• Write a note in the individual Care Plan "Ppt. doesn't know Ht. entered SRA"

2. Caregiver doesn't know the infant's birth weight (BW) and birth length (BL) required for Postpartum/Breastfeeding (PP/BF) certification.

Infant's birth weight and length Note : The infant's birth weight and length aren't required for the infant's Initial Certification. However, this information is needed for the WIC participant PP/BF	Ask caregiver to share from one of the following:
	Discharge paperwork from hospital
	Birth CertificateCrib card from hospital
	• Participant's patient portal, such as MyChart.
	If caregiver can't find and doesn't know the infant's birth weight and length, use the following:
	Full term:
	Birth weight: 8 pounds, 0 ounces
subsequent certification.	Birth length: 20 4/8 inches

	Birth weight: 5 pounds
	Birth length: 17 inches

	 Enter weight/length at the 50%ile for best estimate of gestational age at birth.
	Write a note in the Individual Care Plan "Caregiver doesn't know BW/BL, entered SRA."

Note: When staff complete a subsequent certification on a participant who has experienced a miscarriage, fetal or neonatal death, the Health Information screen of the Non-BF PP participant will automatically add a tab titled "Infant" to the Breastfeeding Information section.

Staff need to be very careful <u>not</u> to point this out to participants. Staff need to be discreet when they interact with the participant. Nothing needs to be filled out on this tab, even though it has a star. The tab remains on the record for two years.

Adult weight	Consider the following probing questions:
Note: Use weight neutral approach when asking participants about weight. Create a safe, non- judgmental space and respect participant's needs and sensitivity.	 Would you be willing to estimate? What is your usual weight? How much weight did you gain this pregnancy? Can you estimate what you weighed at your last prenatal appointment before delivery? Use the weight from last entry in Cascades Anthro/Lab for this pregnancy. Participants obtains from their patient portal, such as MyChart. Participant doesn't know and can't estimate weight at delivery, use the following:

3. PP/BF Participant doesn't know their weight at delivery.
