Greetings Honorable Tribal Leaders, Partners, and Professionals:

In accordance with chapter <u>43.376 RCW</u>, the <u>Washington State Centennial Accord of 1989</u>, and <u>DOH Consultation and Collaboration Procedure</u>, we appreciate your collaboration on the <u>proposed amendment to RTF and psychiatric hospital licensing</u> (Chapter 246-377 and 246-322 WAC).

This amendment, which implements <u>Substitute House Bill (SHB) 2075</u> (Chapter 204, Laws of 2024), establishes a licensing fee for RTFs and psychiatric hospitals through tribal attestation. A <u>Dear Tribal Leader Letter</u> was sent on September 25, 2024, to invite collaboration. Tribal listening sessions were held in October and November, followed by workshops with tribal partners from December, 2024, through January, 2025.
