Greetings Honorable Tribal Leaders, Partners, and Professionals:

Re: Collaborative - Environmental Health Disparities Map Listening Sessions

In accordance with chapter <u>43.376 RCW</u>, the <u>Washington State Centennial Accord of 1989</u>, and <u>DOH</u> <u>Consultation and Collaboration Procedure</u>, we invite your collaboration on updates to the Environmental Health Disparities (EHD) Map as shared from <u>Consultation on May 4, 2023</u>.

The EHD map is referenced in both the Healthy Environments for All (HEAL) Act and Climate Commitment Act (CCA), and is used by state agencies – alongside other tools - to support the identification of, investment in, and guidance of actions that impact Tribes and "overburdened" communities most impacted by environmental injustice. Since our 2023 consultation and collaboration, the EHD map team has drafted additional measures and revised existing ones based on Tribal and community feedback and available data. It is essential that Tribal priorities are accurately reflected in the map, its associated communications, and in ongoing efforts to improve user experience.
