## 5. Anthropometrics

Competency	Certifier is able to:	Training Requirements
Assess growth or prenatal weight gain based on weights and measurements and share with participant.	<ul> <li>Measure in the clinic or obtain measurements from a health care provider:         <ul> <li>Recumbent length - children under 24 months of age.</li> <li>Weight - infants and children under 24 months of age (infant scale).</li> <li>Standing height - children 24 months of age and older and adults.</li> <li>Weight - children 24 months of age and older and adults using (adult scale).</li> </ul> </li> <li>Record measurements and weights in participant's file.         <ul> <li>If measurements unavailable, make an attempt to obtain them within 60 days and document attempt in Family Alert.</li> <li>If measurements received, assess risk, offer nutrition education and referrals as needed. Document follow up in participant's file.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Assess growth charts and prenatal weight gain grids in Cascades.</li> <li>Offer to share child's growth chart with caregiver.</li> <li>Offer to share prenatal weight gain grid with pregnant participant.</li> <li>Determine when to refer participants to dietitian for high risk care plan.</li> </ul>	<ol> <li>Complete the following in the Learning Center (LC)</li> <li>DOH STATE WIC Anthropometrics Curriculum</li> <li>Complete the post-test with 80% or higher score</li> <li>Review all information below:</li> <li>WIC Manual - Volume 1</li> <li>Chapter 9-Anthropometrics</li> <li>Chapter 14-Nutrition Risk Criteria</li> <li>See tables on pages 6-15 in policy chapter to identify anthropometric risks per participant category.</li> <li>Review these risks in the chapter.</li> </ol>
